First Pitch...

The University of Oklahoma baseball team's five-game swing in | **F** California to begin a 10-game stretch on the road rolls in to Bakersfield for a four-game series with CSU Bakersfield. Game one is set for an 8:00 pm CT first pitch. Senior right-hander **Keaton Hernandez** will be on the bump for his first start of the season.

About the Sooners...

Oklahoma picked up its first road win of the season and first win in a one-run game at Fresno State on Tuesday night. The Sooners defeated the previously undefeated at home Bulldogs, 3-2, to improve to 7-9-1. Oklahoma's top hitter, junior shortstop **Sheldon Neuse**, missed the game due to a pulled muscle in his lower back suffered in Sunday's game against Long Beach State. Neuse is hitting .340 with a team-high four home runs and 14 RBI. Junior Jack **Flansburg**, who has started at all four infield positions, appeared at shortstop on Tuesday. He is second on the team at .339 with a team-leading 14 runs scored. Senior Alex Wise, who has started at first base and in the outfield, has seen his average climb to .258. During the month of March, he is 10-for-33 for a .303 batting average. Wise drove in the go-ahead run on Tuesday at Fresno, his sixth of the year. Hernandez, who gets the ball in game one, has made only one other start in his career; a three-inning, no-decision against Dallas Baptist (4/14/15). In six relief appearances, Hernandez is 0-1 with a 2.25 earned run average and 12 strikeouts in 17 innings. Junior right-handers Alec Hansen, Jake Elliott and freshman right-hander **Chris Andritsos** round out the rotation.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 19 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 593-450-3 (.571), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98)

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children: Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Roadrunners...

CSU Bakersfield is 5-10 overall after a strong start to the year, which included series wins over CSU Northridge and St. John's. The Roadrunners are directed by first-year head coach **Bob Macaluso**, a 1987 graduate of Springfield (Mass.) College. Right-hander Steven Gee goes to the mound in game one for Bakersfield. He owns a 5.40 ERA and 1-2 record through four starts and 21.2 innings of work. Center fielder **Dustin Frailey** enters the weekend a .458 hitter, slugging .688 with 14 runs scored. First baseman **Max Carter** is second on the team at .370 with 11 runs driven in.

Last Time They Met...

Oklahoma swept the first ever meeting between the two programs at home in 2014. The Sooners picked up a 4-2 win in the opener before taking both ends of a doubleheader by scores of 17-4 and 4-3. In game two, the score was tied 4-4 after six until OU erupted for 10 runs in the seventh. **Hunter Haley** and **Sheldon Neuse** hit back-to-back triples to give the Sooners their first lead of the day. Leading 8-4, **Austin O'Brien** came off the bench and drilled a three-run home run. Neuse finished the game going 3-for-5 with two home runs and eight RBI; the most by a Sooner since 1987. In the finale, Oklahoma erased a narrow deficit with a pair of runs in the eighth to register the sweep. Haley doubled and **Joshua Ake** singled ahead of **Anthony Hermelyn's** go-ahead base hit.

A Bunt and a Blast Key Walk-Off...

Looking to avoid their fourth one-run loss of the season, the Sooners rallied in the ninth against Long Beach State (3/13) to win 6-3 on a walk-off, three-run homer by senior left fielder **Hunter Haley**. Trailing 3-2 entering the bottom of the ninth, Oklahoma got back-to-back singles from senior right fielder **Alex Wise** and freshman center fielder **Steele Walker** to set the table with runners at the corners. In a pinch-hit appearance, junior **Ben Hollas** put down a bunt to score Wise from third on a suicide-squeeze that tied the game. Haley then blasted a 2-2 pitch to right-center for his first home run of the season. It was Oklahoma's first win of the year when trailing after the sixth inning or later.

Iron Man Streak Ended...

At Fresno State (3/15), head coach **Pete Hughes** wrote out his lineup card without **Sheldon Neuse** on it for the first time since the two arrived at OU together for the 2014 season. Neuse had a stretch of 135 consecutive games started snapped. It is the longest streak on record at Oklahoma (2003-present). The previous record was held by **Jack Mayfield** at 120 (5/7/12-6/8/13). Neuse's former teammate, **Craig Aikin** was left out of the lineup just once in his career and had separate 91-game streak to start and end his career.

Oh man, oh man, oh man, not again...

Sheldon Neuse smashed his second home run of the season vs. Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium and followed with a home run against Wichita State (3/8). All four of his home runs have come over the last eight games. Neuse has homered in back-to-back games three times in his career. He did so twice in 2015 against BYU (2/28) and Little Rock (3/3) and later against Purdue (3/7-8). His 17 career home runs are the most among active Sooners and the tied for the most at OU since the introduction of the BBCOR bats in 2011; with **Matt Oberste** (2012-13).

Hog Tied...

Due to travel restrictions, Oklahoma's game with Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium ended after nine innings in a 5-5 tie. It marked the 12th tie in OU history and first since a 5-5, 11-inning game at Nebraska (3/22/08). The Sooners overcame a 5-1 deficit after the third inning.

Bullpen Bagels...

The OU bullpen owns a 1.88 ERA with four saves and two wins on the season, while holding opponents to a .228 batting average. Sooner relievers have totaled 58 shutout innings in 66 complete innings pitched. Oklahoma relievers had a stretch of 13 consecutive scoreless innings snapped on against Long Beach State (3/12).

The Big Inning...

The Sooners have scored more than two runs in an inning only six times this season. Oklahoma scored a season-high six runs in the third inning in a win against Northeastern (2/21). Before **Sheldon Neuse** hit a three-run homer against Long Beach State (3/12), the Sooners last plated more than two men in an inning against Abilene Christian (2/24). In its comeback win over LBSU (3/13), Oklahoma brought in four runs in the ninth. OU pitchers have limited the opposition to scoring more than twice in an inning six times. The Sooners have allowed three runs in the first or second inning four times this season.

Going Back to Cali...

Oklahoma makes its second trip to the west coast this week for a five-game road swing. The Sooners play Fresno State in the midweek on Tuesday before heading to CSU Bakersfield for a four-game set beginning on Thursday.

One-Hit Shutout...

In his second career start, freshman RHP **Chris Andritsos** threw seven innings of shutout, one-hit ball. He retired the first eight Central Arkansas (3/1) batters of the game before allowing the only hit of the day in the third. The Sooners totaled six hits in the win, including solo home runs from **Sheldon Neuse** and **Cody Thomas**. Freshman RHP **Connor Berry** finished the game with two-scoreless innings of relief to earn the first save of his career, while tallying three strikeouts. The win marked the first shutout for OU since beating Alcorn State (4/22/15), 8-0. The Sooners have shutout UCA in backto-back seasons by a score of 10-0. Andritsos has totaled 12 innings and 11 strikeouts in two starts with only two hits against and one run.

Fresh Faces...

Coach Hughes started a season-high six freshmen in the lineup against Wichita State (3/8), including RHP **Kyle Tyler** making his first career start. The Sooners have started three or more freshmen in each of the last seven games and eight times this season.

Playing Horseshoes...

Six of Oklahoma's nine losses have come by two runs or less. The Sooners are 0-4 in one-run games and 1-2 in two-run games. In 2015, OU won 10 one-run games and went 14-12 when games were decided by two runs or less.

Against the West...

Under head coach Pete Hughes, the Sooners are 6-4 against schools from California. When playing against teams from the Pacific or Hawaii Time Zones, OU is 12-9. When playing in the Pacific of Hawaii Time Zones, Oklahoma is 9-4-1. In the last two seasons, the Sooners have played seven of the 11 Pac-12 schools and posted a 3-4 record.

Road Test...

Gearing the schedule toward the RPI, Oklahoma plays 30 games away from L. Dale Mitchell Park, which includes the Bedlam Series hosted by Oklahoma State and a game at Dodger Stadium against Mississippi State. It is the most for the Sooners since 1999 when they played 32 games away from home. The last three times that Oklahoma went on the road 28 times or more in a season, the Sooners hosted a regional in Norman in 2006, 2009 and 2010.

Turf and Turf...

Through nine games, Oklahoma had played every game on a synthetic turf field. The Sooners are 6-4 at home on L. Dale Mitchell Park's new AstroTurf® surface. The first road trip of the season saw OU play on Sam Houston State's newly resurfaced Don Sander Stadium. The Sooners played their first game on natural grass this season last at USC and are 1-2-1 on natural surfaces.

Major League Diamonds...

Since the Big 12 Championship was last hosted in Arlington at Globe Life Park (Ameriquest Field at the time) in 2004, Oklahoma has played at a Major League Baseball park five times. The Sooners are 3-1-1 in such games following a tie vs. Mississippi State (3/6). OU most recently defeated UT-Arlington (3/11/14), 3-2 in 10 innings, in Arlington. In 2008, Oklahoma went 2-1 at the Houston College Classic at Minute Maid Park. The Sooners lost the opener to Rice (2/29/08), 7-2, before picking ups wins over Houston (3/1/08) and Tennessee (3/2/08) by scores of 8-5 in 10 innings and 2-0.

#YardWork...

Oklahoma posted its best home run total since 2011 with 39 in 2015. Since the inception of the BBCOR bat to college baseball in 2011, the Sooners season-high is 41 in 2011. **Sheldon Neuse** is OU's active career leader with 17 followed by **Hunter Haley** at 13.

19 Ways Moves Beyond OU...

Head coach **Pete Hughes** started the 19 Ways community service initiative while at Virginia Tech as a tribute to his late mother, Alice. Since bringing the program to OU, 19 Ways has expanded to eight programs across the country aiming to impact their community in 19 different ways throughout the academic year. This offseason, Northeastern became the eighth program to start its own 19 Ways. Opening day marks the second time Oklahoma has faced another program with a 19 Ways initiative; the first being Notre Dame on opening weekend 2015.

New Field; Same Tradition...

Completion of the new synthetic turf field at L. Dale Mitchell Park on January 15 made OU the sixth team in the Big 12 with a turf playing surface. The surface is made of AstroTurf® 3D Xtreme and covers 150,000 square feet. The turf holds 351,000 lbs. of sand, 180,400 lbs. of rubber, covers 4,100 linear feet of drainage and can handle 4-6 inches of rain per hour. Among 61 power conference teams, 26 play on a turf field. Since 2011, 21 NCAA Regionals have been hosted on a turf playing field, while 12 teams with a home field of synthetic turf have appeared in the College World Series over that time.

Oklahoma is Home...

The Sooner roster features 11 players from within the state's borders and 11 from Texas. This season marks the most Oklahoma born players at OU since 12 in 2012 and the first time with as many or more players from Oklahoma than Texas since 2006. In 2006, 13 Sooner players called Oklahoma home, while just five were from Texas.

Opening the Gates...

Oklahoma broke its own opening weekend attendance record set in 2015 with 4,466 passing through the gates at L. Dale Mitchell Park to see the Sooners face Northeastern in 2016. The 2015 opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4,181. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

Power and Speed...

Senior **Hunter Haley** has 13 home runs and 28 stolen bases in his career. Over the last decade, he is one of just three players at OU to record 10 homers and 25 steals in a career. Max White (2010-13) and Jamie Johnson (2008-09) are the other two. White hit 23 homers and swiped 29 bags, while Johnson posted 18 and 38.

Preseason Poll...

Oklahoma landed in the fourth spot of the Big 12 Coaches' Preseason Poll; its highest rank since 2013 when it was number one and went on to win the Big 12 Tournament. TCU came in at number one followed by Oklahoma State and Texas. Each of the top-three teams received three first-place votes. The Sooners were ranked fifth for the second consecutive season in 2015 and finished third at 13-11.

Raising the Academic Standard...

Eleven OU baseball student-athletes were honored by the Big 12 for All-Academic Team recognition in 2015. It is the most for the Sooners in a single season since the league's inaugural season of 1997 when 12 earned the distinction. In the fall 2015 semester, the Sooners boasted a program-record 3.27 cumulative grade-point average.

Over that stretch, Jon Gray struck out a team-best 251, while Jake Elliott (116) ranks sixth in that stretch and the highest total of active Sooners.

Kings of the K...

The Sooner pitching staff led the Big 12 in the regular season with 481 strikeouts and averaged 8.58 per nine innings; both of which ranked second by the end of the postseason.

- Alec Hansen struck out 10 vs. Texas Tech (3/22) and led all Big 12 pitchers with 94 through the regular season and finished third.
- Jake Elliott finished seventh in the league at 80. OU pitchers combined to strike out 10-plus 26 times in 2015.
- OU surpassed 500 strikeouts for the fourth time in six seasons and fifth time in program history with 524; which ranks fourth all-time.

The conference season kicks off for a quartet of teams this weekend with Baylor hosting Texas Tech and West Virginia travelling to TCU.

CONFERENCE NOTES

- The Frogs and Mountaineers currently occupy the top two spots in the standings. TCU has a four-game conference series win streak, while the Mountaineers won three league series in 2015. The Frogs swept WVU in Morgantown last year. The series pits the league's top two batting teams against each other as both teams are also ranked in the top 3 in pitching.
- Four Big I2 series are on tap for the following weekend Oklahoma at Texas Tech, Oklahoma State at K-State, TCU at Texas and West Virginia at Kansas.
- In addition to the two conference series this week, 10 midweek contests are scheduled for the fifth week of play with 16 non-conference games slated for the weekend.
- With the Mountaineers facing the Frogs, each of the nine Big I2 teams will have faced at least two ranked opponents on the season as the league has combined for 39 non-conference games against ranked opponents at the time of the meeting.
- The league is a combined 76-58-I after going 21-12 last week. Of the league's 58 losses, 24 have been by three runs or less. Of the IO5 conference contests played in 2015, 62 were determined by three runs or less (59
- TCU sits in the top IO of four polls, including as high as No. 7 nationally, while Oklahoma State remains as high as No. 22. Texas Tech is receiving votes.
- The Big I2 has played 33 games against teams from the state of California with eight more on tap this weekend. Additionally, the league has played 29 contests against Pac-I2 opponents.
- K-State head coach Brad Hill recorded win No. 400 over the weekend. Hill joins Ritch Price (Kansas), Jim Schlossnagle (TCU) and Augie Garrido (Texas) as Big I2 coaches with 400 or more wins with their program. He is also now one of five coaches to win 400-plus contests while coaching a Big I2 program.
- Texas (sixth) and TCU (ninth) rank in the top IO natioanally in attendance as the Big I2 is one of two conferences with multiple teams in the top IO.
