#### **Leading Off**

- The Sooners just completed a 10-game road swing with a 6-4 record. It was the longest stretch away from home since 1999, which was a 10-game stretch that included a three-game Bedlam series in OKC and Tulsa.
- Sheldon Neuse ranks in the top-50 nationally in six offensive categories. He did not rank in the top-50 in a single category at the end of 2015, but ranked seventh in the nation in triples after his freshman year in 2014.
- Oklahoma has claimed two of the last three series with Texas with both series wins coming on the road. Six of the last nine games in the all-time series have been decided by one or two runs.
- Sooner pinch-hitters are hitting .321 (9-for-28). Blake Brewster (3-for-8) leads the way from the left side, while Chris Andritsos (2-for-3) and Austin O'Brien (2-for-5) lead the right-handed options.
- Oklahoma boasted a program-best 3.27 GPA in the fall 2015 semester: the highest for a men's sport at OU.

The Oklahoma baseball team returns home following a five-city, 10-game, 15-day road swing to take on Texas in its second Big 12 conference series of the season. The series gets underway Friday night at 7:00 pm from L. Dale Mitchell Park in front of a national TV audience on FS1.

#### About the Sooners...

First Pitch...

The Sooners snapped a four-game slide with a 5-2 win at Little Rock on Tuesday night to improve to 12-13-1 overall. Oklahoma, which is 0-3 in the Big 12, finished with a 6-4 record in its 10-consecutive games away from home. Junior shortstop **Sheldon Neuse** leads the Sooners with a .389 batting average, .509 onbase percentage and .678 slugging percentage: all of which rank in the top four in the Big 12. Junior first baseman **Austin O'Brien** is second on the team at .302 since emerging as an everyday-play over the last three weeks. Junior **Jack Flansburg**, who has made multiple starts at all four infield positions, is hitting .286 with a team-high 20 runs scored. Flansburg has driven in 14 runs, which ranks second behind Neuse's 20. Junior right-hander **Jake Elliott** (0-0) and a pair of freshmen righties make up OU's weekend rotation. **Chris Andritsos** (3-2) and **Ryan Madden** (1-0) will start the first two games followed by Elliott in Sunday's finale.

#### On the Air...

Friday night's game will air nationally on FS1 with **Dave Barnett** (play-by-play) and former MLB pitcher **Pat Combs** (color commentary on the call). Sooner baseball and MLB alum **George Frazier** (pbp) and MLB All-Star **Mickey Tettleton** (color) will call the game on Sportstalk 1400 AM on Friday and the remaining two games on television. Sooner Sports TV will broadcast game two on FSOK-Plus and game three on FSOK, while both will air on FCS-Central.

#### **HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES**

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 19 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 599-454-3 (.571), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98)

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children: Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

#### Scouting the Longhorns...

Texas fell in the midweek to Lamar after taking two out of three from No. 6 TCU last weekend. The Longhorns are 11-14 overall and 2-1 in the Big 12 under 20th-year head coach **Augie Garrido**. Texas, which has played just five games away from home, has four players hitting over .300, including third baseman **Tres Barrera** in fourth at .303 with a team-high 18 RBI to go with 16 runs scored. Right fielder **Patrick Mathis** is hitting .306 with four home runs and a .548 slugging percentage. Right-hander **Morgan Cooper** (1-0) gets the ball on Friday night for the Longhorns. He owns a 3.18 ERA with 22 strikeouts in 22.2 innings. Lefty **Ty Culbreth** (4-2) and righty **Kyle Johnston** (1-1) round out the Texas rotation.

#### **Last Time They Met...**

Oklahoma claimed its second-straight road series at No. 25 Texas by taking two of three in Austin in 2015. The Sooners won the opener, 3-2, in 12 innings. OU started a two-out rally in the 12th with a **Craig Aikin** double and scored on a base hit from **Austin O'Brien**. **Ralph Garza** struck out three in 1.1 innings of relief to earn the win. **Jake Elliott** scattered five hits for two runs in a no-decision. The Longhorns took game two, 4-1, behind six innings of one-run ball from **Kody Clemens**. In the finale, **Robert Tasin** struck out four in six innings to get the win. **Kolbey Carpenter** drove in a pair of runs in a 2-for-4 effort.

#### All-Time vs. Texas...

Currently, the Longhorns lead the Sooners in the series, 126-49-2. The Sooners answered a sweep at home in 2014 by winning their second series in a row down in Austin. Oklahoma's series victory in 2013 was the first over Texas in 15 years. Previously, the Sooners had swept the Longhorns in a 3-0 series at home in 1998. The two sides have met in the College World Series six times: 1972, 1973, 1974, 1975 and 1992. Oklahoma twice defeated Texas in the NCAA Central Regional in Austin to advance to the CWS and win the 1994 National Championship.

#### The 2016 Sooners vs. the Longhorns...

Oklahoma's junior class follows the first class, which includes senior left fielder **Hunter Haley** and became the first in program history to not only win a series in Austin, but take two series in their career over Texas. Current juniors **Sheldon Neuse** and **Austin O'Brien** are both hitting better than .300 in their two seasons against the Longhorns. Neuse owns a .300/.429/.522 slash line, while O'Brien is at .400/.438/.400.

#### The Long and Winding Road...

Oklahoma went 6-4 in its recent 10-game stretch away from L. Dale Mitchell Park. It marked the longest road swing since 1999, which was also 10 games and included a three-game Bedlam series in OKC and Tulsa. OU's longest stretch away from home in 2015 was nine games, including a four-game series against BYU in Las Vegas that was originally scheduled to be played in Norman. In the Sooners National Championship season of 1994, they were also on the road for 10 in a row with a 7-3 record. Oklahoma regularly had 10-game road trips under head coach **Enos Semore**, including 14 times in 16 seasons and a program-high 21 in a row on the road to open the 1976 season ahead of the Sooners' fifth-consecutive College World Series appearance.

#### Big 12 Openers...

The Sooners are 9-11 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after a 5-0 loss at Texas Tech (3/24/15). Oklahoma lost the series to the Red Raiders to mark the first series loss in the first Big 12 weekend since 2012 against Texas. OU won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Iowa State (3/7/97), 7-4.

#### Up Next...

The Sooners' seven-game homestand continues with a midweek match-up with Dallas Baptist. Oklahoma welcomes the Patriots for a 6:00 pm first pitch on Tuesday. April 5.

#### #YardWork...

Oklahoma posted its best home run total since 2011 with 39 in 2015. The Sooners are tied for first in the Big 12 with TCU at 16 through five weekend of action. **Sheldon Neuse** is OU's active career leader with 17 followed by **Hunter Haley** at 13.

#### Sooners Bat Around California...

Oklahoma extended its win streak to six games with five wins coming in a five-day span in California. The Sooners started with a narrow 3-2 win at Fresno State (3/15) followed by a four-game sweep over CSU Bakersfield. OU lifted its season batting average by 19 points over the week with a collective .306 as a team. The Sooners posted double-digit hits in three games and scored double-figure runs in two, while matching a season-high 13 in the finale against the Roadrunners (3/19). **Sheldon Neuse** (.450) and **Austin O'Brien** (.438) led the Oklahoma offense in hitting.

#### Keepin' it 100...

Entering the week, **Sheldon Neuse** ranked in the top-100 of six offensive statistical categories as well as 92nd in the country with three saves. He peaks in the national rankings at 34th with three triples, which is tied for the Big 12 lead.

#### Iron Man Streak Ended...

At Fresno State (3/15), head coach **Pete Hughes** wrote out his lineup card without **Sheldon Neuse** on it for the first time since the two arrived at OU together for the 2014 season. Neuse had a stretch of 135 consecutive games started snapped. It is the longest streak on record at Oklahoma (2003-present). The previous record was held by **Jack Mayfield** at 120 (5/7/12-6/8/13). Neuse's former teammate, **Craig Aikin** was left out of the lineup just once in his career and had separate 91-game streak to start and end his career.

#### A Bunt and a Blast Key Walk-Off...

Looking to avoid their fourth one-run loss of the season, the Sooners rallied in the ninth against Long Beach State (3/13) to win 6-3 on a walk-off, three-run homer by senior left fielder **Hunter Haley**. Trailing 3-2 entering the bottom of the ninth, Oklahoma got back-to-back singles from senior right fielder **Alex Wise** and freshman center fielder **Steele Walker** to set the table with runners at the corners. In a pinch-hit appearance, junior **Ben Hollas** put down a bunt to score Wise from third on a suicide-squeeze that tied the game. Haley then blasted a 2-2 pitch to right-center for his first home run of the season. It was Oklahoma's first win of the year when trailing after the sixth inning or later.

#### Triple Nation...

Oklahoma ranks second in the Big 12 and 7-th in the NCAA with seven triples. **Sheldon Neuse** is the team leader at three. He is tied for the Big 12 lead and 34th in the country. He recorded the 13th of his career at CSU Bakersfield (3/19/16-Gm2). Neuse has the fifth most career triples among active players in the NCAA and is now tied for ninth all-time at OU with **Jim Richardson** (1985-86) and **Derek Wathan** (1996-98).

#### Hog Tied...

Due to travel restrictions, Oklahoma's game with Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium ended after nine innings in a 5-5 tie. It marked the 12th tie in OU history and first since a 5-5, 11-inning game at Nebraska (3/22/08). The Sooners overcame a 5-1 deficit after the third inning.

#### The Big Inning...

The Sooners have scored more than two runs in an inning 14 times this season after doing so in back-to-back innings at Texas Tech (3/26). Oklahoma scored a season-high six runs in the third inning in a win against Northeastern (2/21) and later matched that total at CSU Bakersfield (3/19) in the seventh inning of game two. In its comeback win over Long Beach State (3/13), Oklahoma brought in four runs in the ninth. OU pitchers have limited the opposition to scoring more than twice in an inning 13 times. The Sooners have allowed three runs in the first or second inning five times this season.

#### Fresh Faces...

Coach Hughes started a season-high six freshmen in the lineup against Wichita State (3/8), including RHP **Kyle Tyler** making his first career start. The Sooners have started three or more freshmen in 14 of the last 16 games and 16 times overall this season.

#### Oh man, oh man, oh man, not again...

**Sheldon Neuse** smashed his second home run of the season vs. Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium and followed with a home run against Wichita State (3/8). All four of his home runs came in a seven-game stretch. Neuse has homered in back-to-back games three times in his career. He did so twice in 2015 against BYU (2/28) and Little Rock (3/3) and later against Purdue (3/7-8). His 17 career home runs are the most among active Sooners and are tied for the most at OU since the introduction of the BBCOR bats in 2011; with **Matt Oberste** (2012-13).

#### One-Hit Shutout...

In his second career start, freshman RHP **Chris Andritsos** threw seven innings of shutout, one-hit ball. He retired the first eight Central Arkansas (3/1) batters of the game before allowing the only hit of the day in the third. The Sooners totaled six hits in the win, including solo home runs from **Sheldon Neuse** and **Cody Thomas**. Freshman RHP **Connor Berry** finished the game with two-scoreless innings of relief to earn the first save of his career, while tallying three strikeouts. The win marked the first shutout for OU since beating Alcorn State (4/22/15), 8-0. The Sooners have shutout UCA in back-to-back seasons by a score of 10-0. Andritsos has totaled 12 innings and 11 strikeouts in two starts with only two hits against and one run.

#### Against the West...

Under head coach Pete Hughes, the Sooners are 10.4 against schools from California. When playing against teams from the Pacific or Hawaii Time Zones, OU is 16-9. When playing in the Pacific of Hawaii Time Zones, Oklahoma is 13-4-1. In the last two seasons, the Sooners have played seven of the 11 Pac-12 schools and posted a 3-4 record.

#### Turf and Turf...

Through nine games, Oklahoma had played every game on a synthet-

ic turf field. The Sooners are 6.4 at home on L. Dale Mitchell Park's new AstroTurf® surface. The first road trip of the season saw OU play on Sam Houston State's newly resurfaced Don Sander Stadium. The Sooners played their first game on natural grass this season last at USC and are 5-3-1 on natural surfaces and 7-10 on turf.

#### Road Test...

Gearing the schedule toward the RPI, Oklahoma plays 30 games away from L. Dale Mitchell Park, which includes the Bedlam Series hosted by Oklahoma State and a game at Dodger Stadium against Mississippi State. It is the most for the Sooners since 1999 when they played 32 games away from home. The last three times that Oklahoma went on the road 28 times or more in a season, the Sooners hosted a regional in Norman in 2006, 2009 and 2010.

#### Major League Diamonds...

Since the Big 12 Championship was last hosted in Arlington at Globe Life Park (Ameriquest Field at the time) in 2004, Oklahoma has played at a Major League Baseball park five times. The Sooners are 3-1-1 in such games following a tie vs. Mississippi State (3/6). OU most recently defeated UT-Arlington (3/11/14), 3-2 in 10 innings, in Arlington. In 2008, Oklahoma went 2-1 at the Houston College Classic at Minute Maid Park. The Sooners lost the opener to Rice (2/29/08), 7-2, before picking ups wins over Houston (3/1/08) and Tennessee (3/2/08) by scores of 8-5 in 10 innings and 2-0.

#### Power and Speed...

Senior **Hunter Haley** has 13 home runs and 30 stolen bases in his career. Over the last decade, he is one of just three players at OU to record 10 homers and 25 steals in a career. **Max White** (2010-13) and **Jamie Johnson** (2008-09) are the other two. White hit 23 homers and swiped 29 bags, while Johnson posted 18 and 38.

#### 19 Ways Moves Beyond OU...

Head coach **Pete Hughes** started the 19 Ways community service initiative while at Virginia Tech as a tribute to his late mother, Alice. Since bringing the program to OU, 19 Ways has expanded to eight programs across the country. This offseason, Northeastern became the eighth program to start its own 19 Ways. Opening day marks the second time Oklahoma has faced another program with a 19 Ways initiative: the first being Notre Dame on opening weekend 2015.

#### New Field: Same Tradition...

Completion of the new synthetic turf field at L. Dale Mitchell Park on January 15 made OU the sixth team in the Big 12 with a turf playing surface. The surface is made of AstroTurf® 3D Xtreme and covers 150,000 square feet. The turf holds 351,000 lbs. of sand, 180,400 lbs. of rubber, covers 4,100 linear feet of drainage and can handle 4-6 inches of rain per hour. Among 61 power conference teams, 26 play on a turf field. Since 2011, 21 NCAA Regionals have been hosted on a turf playing field, while 12 teams with a home field of synthetic turf have appeared in the College World Series over that time.

#### Big League Pitchers...

In 2015, Sooner baseball alums combined to start 68 games on the mound in Major League Baseball. That total ranks the second highest among NCAA teams: second only to Long Beach State (70). **Garrett Richards** (32), **Chase Anderson** (27) and **Jon Gray** (9) each took to the hill in 2015 with Gray making his MLB debut on August 4.

## CONFERENCE NOTES llowing the first full week of conference play. Oklahoma State

- Following the first full week of conference play, Oklahoma State sits atop the league standings with a 3-0 mark, while Texas Tech is in second after two series wins, including a sweep of Oklahoma last weekend.
- The 5-I conference mark is the best to start a season for the Red Raiders since the 1999 campaign. Tech has posted shutouts in back-to-back conference series openers for the first time since 2001.
- OSU's series sweep at K-State marked the first time the Cowboys have opened conference play with a sweep.
- Close contests have been the trend this season for league teams as 35 of the 76 non-conference losses have been by a margin of three runs or less.
- Six of last week's nine conference games were determined by two runs or less including five by just one run with the OSU-K-State series all one-run wins for the Cowboys, who lead the league with I3 one-run games.
- In the I5 conference games thus far, nine have been decided by three runs or fewer with seven by one run.
- The Big I2 is the only conference with two hitters ranked in the top IO nationally in batting average entering the week 6. Tanner Gardner, Texas Tech (.468) and 8. Elliott Barzilli, TCU (.465).
- The Cowboys enter the week with the fifth best ERA in the nation (2.20). Four OSU pitchers rank in the top IO in the Big I2 in ERA as no other team has more than two.
- TCU stays ranked in the top IO nationally checking in as high as No. 8 with Oklahoma State as high as No. 16. Tech is receiving votes in a pair of polls. Each league team has faced at least one ranked opponent this season with Texas (I5), Texas Tech (8) and Oklahoma State (7) playing the most nonconference contests against ranked teams.
- West Virginia head coach Randy Mazey reached IOO wins with the program in the Mountaineers' victory at Kansas on Saturday.
- All-session tickets for the 2016 Phillips 66 Big I2 Baseball Championship at Oklahoma City's Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark are on sale now \$69 (terrace seats), \$99 (field) and \$169 (club) and can be purchased by visiting BigI2Sports.com/BuyTickets. The postseason championship has produced a different winner each of the past five seasons.
