Leading Off

- The Sooners recently completed a 10-game road swing with a 6-4 record. It was the longest stretch away from home since 1999, which was a 10-game stretch that included a three-game Bedlam series in OKC and Tulsa.
- · Sheldon Neuse ranks in the top-50 nationally in four offensive categories. He did not rank in the top-50 in a single category at the end of 2015, but ranked seventh in the nation in triples after his freshman year in 2014.
- Oklahoma recorded its first home series win over Texas sine 1998 this weekend. The Sooners, who have taken three of the last four series with the Longhorns, won their first home game in the rivalry since 2008 on Friday night.
- · Sooner pinch-hitters are hitting .323 (10-for-31). Blake Brewster (3-for-8) leads the way from the left side, while Chris Andritsos (2-for-3) and Austin O'Brien (2-for-5) lead the right-handed options.
- Oklahoma boasted a program-best 3.27 GPA in the fall 2015 semester; the highest for a men's sport at OU.

Oklahoma baseball reached the midway point of a seven-game homestand with a Tuesday night match-up against Dallas Baptist. The Sooners and the Patriots hit the field for a non-conference contest at L. Dale Mitchell Park at 6:00 pm. About the Sooners... Oklahoma claimed its first Big 12 series of the season by tak-

ing two of three from Texas over the weekend. The Sooners enter Tuesday night at 14-14-1 overall and 2-4 in the Big 12. Junior shortstop **Sheldon Neuse** leads the OU offense with a .392 batting average, .500 on-base percentage and .686 slugging percentage; all of which rank in the top-three in the conference. Neuse has driven in 21 runs and hammered five home runs. Junior Jack Flansburg, who has started multiple games at all four infield positions, is second on the team with a .287 average and 19 RBI, while scoring a team-high 21 runs. Freshman third baseman Cade Harris has risen to third on the team at .286 as he has hit leadoff or second in his last eight starts. Along with Flansburg, senior right fielder Alex Wise has started all 29 games this season. He is hitting .266 with 17 runs and eight doubles. On the mound, the Sooners turn to freshman right-hander **Jake Irvin**, who last started opening weekend against Northeastern (2/21). Irvin (0-0)

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 19 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 601-455-3 (.571), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children: Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Patriots...

Dallas Baptist is coming off a three-game sweep of Lipscomb last weekend, improving its overall record to 18-9 under head coach **Dan Heefner**. The Patriots, who are coming off back-to-back NCAA Regional appearances, have outscored opponents 202-134 on the season along with an impressive .298 team batting average. Two-way player **Darrick Hall** is tied for fifth in the nation with 11 home runs to go with 33 RBI. Second baseman **Luke Stratman** (.391), right fielder **David Martinelli** (.365) and center fielder **Jameson Hannah** (.350) are all hitting better than .350. DBU will start right-hander **MD Johnson** (2-1) on Tuesday night. In 18 innings, which includes two starts and seven relief outings, he holds a 5.50 ERA with 14 strikeouts and 15 walks.

Last Time They Met...

The Sooners lost 7-5 to the Patriots in Norman last season on April 14, 2015. DBU catcher **Daniel Salters** tallied four hits and scored three runs in the victory. Catcher **Chris Shaw** and center fielder **Craig Aikin** each notched three hits for Oklahoma to go along with starting pitcher Keaton Hernandez's three scoreless innings on the hill. The Sooners got on the board first, scoring twice in the third frame before DBU rattled off seven unanswered runs. Oklahoma made things interesting, scoring two runs in the eighth and another in the ninth before falling short.

All-Time vs. DBU...

The Sooners lead the all-time series with the Patriots, 21-10. However, Dallas Baptist has won eight in a row dating back to 2011, including a 10-inning, 3-2 win at TCU in the 2011 NCAA Fort Worth Regional. Six of the eight-consecutive losses have come by two runs or less. Oklahoma won the first 14 games of the series, which start with a 12-3 decision in 1978. Since 2004, DBU is ahead in the series, 10-7.

Sooners Turn Down Horns...

Oklahoma won back-to-back series over Texas for the first time in program history and has now won three of the last four. The Sooners recorded their first home win over Texas (4/1) since April 5, 2008. Freshman RHP **Chris Andritsos** struck out five in 7.2 innings of one run ball. OU went deep three times, including a three-run shot from junior **Jack Flansburg** in a 6-1 victory. Oklahoma bounced back from a Saturday defeat to walk off the Longhorns on Sunday, 4-3. Flansburg tied the game in the sixth with a two-run single. In the ninth, the Sooners loaded the bases with one out. Junior **Ben Hollas** delivered the game-winning hit; a line drive single to right. The win marked the first home series win for Oklahoma over Texas since 1998; when OU swept UT. Senior outfielder **Hunter Haley** is the only player in program history to have played in three series wins over the Longhorns.

Making Noise at the Plate and on the Mound...

In Sunday's walk-off win over Texas (4/3), junior **Sheldon Neuse** made an impact at the plate and on the mound. As the starting short-stop, he gave Oklahoma its first lead of the day in the bottom of the first inning with a towering home run off the scoreboard in left-center. Neuse later moved to the mound with two runners on and only one out in the top of the eighth. He stranded both before pitching a 1-2-3 top of the ninth. After retiring all five batters faced, including a pair of strikeouts, Neuse was credited with the win. He became the first player at OU to homer and earn the win on the mound since **Jacob Evans** did so with a walk-off home run against Kansas (4/2/15).

Up Next...

The Sooners wrap up their seven-game homestand with a Big 12 series against Baylor. Game one is set for a 6:00 pm first pitch on Friday night.

The Long and Winding Road...

Oklahoma went 6-4 in its recent 10-game stretch away from L. Dale Mitchell Park. It marked the longest road swing since 1999, which was also 10 games and included a three-game Bedlam series in OKC and Tulsa. OU's longest stretch away from home in 2015 was nine games, including a four-game series against BYU in Las Vegas that was originally scheduled to be played in Norman. In the Sooners National Championship season of 1994, they were also on the road for 10 in a row with a 7-3 record. Oklahoma regularly had 10-game road trips under head coach **Enos Semore**, including 14 times in 16 seasons and a program-high 21 in a row on the road to open the 1976 season ahead of the Sooners' fifth-consecutive College World Series appearance.

Big 12 Openers...

The Sooners are 9-11 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after a 5-0 loss at Texas Tech (3/24/15). Oklahoma lost the series to the Red Raiders to mark the first series loss in the first Big 12 weekend since 2012 against Texas. OU won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. lowa State (3/7/97), 7-4.

#YardWork...

Oklahoma posted its best home run total since 2011 with 39 in 2015. The Sooners hit a season-high three in a 6-1 win over Texas (4/1). It was the most since OU went yard four times against Purdue (3/8/15). **Sheldon Neuse** is OU's active career leader with 18 followed by **Hunter Haley** at 13.

Keepin' it 100...

Entering the week, **Sheldon Neuse** ranks in the top-100 of seven offensive statistical categories as well as 79th in the country with four saves. He peaks in the national rankings at 32nd with a .689 slugging percentage. **Chris Andritsos** ranks highest among all Sooners with a 0.76 WHIP that is 10th in the nation and first in the Big 12. He is second on the team with four top-100 rankings. As a team, Oklahoma ranks 19th in the country with a .978 fielding percentage, which is the best in the conference.

Sooners Bat Around California...

Oklahoma extended its win streak to six games with five wins coming in a five-day span in California. The Sooners started with a narrow 3-2 win at Fresno State (3/15) followed by a four-game sweep over CSU Bakersfield. OU lifted its season batting average by 19 points over the week with a collective .306 as a team. The Sooners posted double-digit hits in three games and scored double-figure runs in two, while matching a season-high 13 in the finale against the Roadrunners (3/19). **Sheldon Neuse** (.450) and **Austin O'Brien** (.438) led the Oklahoma offense in hitting.

Shave for the Brave...

On April 7, the Sooners will shave their heads to fight childhood cancer at their third annual "Shave for the Brave". The team is accepting donations that will benefit the Vs. Cancer Foundation and OU Children's Hospital. In the past two season, OU baseball has raised more than \$58,000 and in 2015 ranked first among 63 participating teams. The game following Shave for the Brave will be the team's annual "Go Mitch Go" game against Baylor. **Mitchell Whitaker** was a friend of the program that passed in 2007 from Leukemia. The Sooners award one player each year in his honor.

Fresh Faces...

Coach Hughes started a season-high six freshmen in the lineup against Wichita State (3/8), including RHP **Kyle Tyler** making his first career start. The Sooners have started three or more freshmen in 17 of the last 19 games and 19 times overall this season.

Iron Man Streak Ended...

At Fresno State (3/15), head coach **Pete Hughes** wrote out his lineup card without **Sheldon Neuse** on it for the first time since the two arrived at OU together for the 2014 season. Neuse had a stretch of 135 consecutive games started snapped. It is the longest streak on record at Oklahoma (2003-present). The previous record was held by **Jack Mayfield** at 120 (5/7/12-6/8/13). Neuse's former teammate, **Craig Aikin** was left out of the lineup just once in his career and had separate 91-game streak to start and end his career.

A Bunt and a Blast Kev Walk-Off...

Looking to avoid their fourth one-run loss of the season, the Sooners rallied in the ninth against Long Beach State (3/13) to win 6-3 on a walk-off, three-run homer by senior left fielder **Hunter Haley**. Trailing 3-2 entering the bottom of the ninth, Oklahoma got back-to-back singles from senior right fielder **Alex Wise** and freshman center fielder **Steele Walker** to set the table with runners at the corners. In a pinch-hit appearance, junior **Ben Hollas** put down a bunt to score Wise from third on a suicide-squeeze that tied the game. Haley then blasted a 2-2 pitch to right-center for his first home run of the season. It was Oklahoma's first win of the year when trailing after the sixth inning or later.

Triple Nation...

Oklahoma ranks second in the Big 12 and 97th in the NCAA with seven triples. **Sheldon Neuse** is the team leader at three. He is second in Big 12 lead and 46th in the country. He recorded the 13th of his career at CSU Bakersfield (3/19/16-Gm2). Neuse has the fifth most career triples among active players in the NCAA and is now tied for ninth all-time at OU with **Jim Richardson** (1985-86) and **Derek Wathan** (1996-98).

Hog Tied...

Due to travel restrictions, Oklahoma's game with Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium ended after nine innings in a 5-5 tie. It marked the 12th tie in OU history and first since a 5-5, 11-inning game at Nebraska (3/22/08). The Sooners overcame a 5-1 deficit after the third inning.

The Big Inning...

The Sooners have scored more than two runs in an inning 16 times this season after posting two three-run innings in a win over Texas (4/1). Oklahoma scored a season-high six runs in the third inning in a win against Northeastern (2/21) and later matched that total at CSU Bakersfield (3/19) in the seventh inning of game two. In its comeback win over Long Beach State (3/13), Oklahoma brought in four runs in the ninth. OU pitchers have limited the opposition to scoring more than twice in an inning 14 times. The Sooners have allowed three runs or more in the first or second inning six times this season.

Oh man, oh man, oh man, not again...

Sheldon Neuse smashed his second home run of the season vs. Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium and followed with a home run against Wichita State (3/8). All four of his home runs came in a seven-game stretch. Neuse has homered in back-to-back games three times in his career. He did so twice in 2015 against BYU (2/28) and Little Rock (3/3) and later against Purdue (3/7-8). His 18 career home runs are the most among active Sooners and are the most at OU since the introduction of the BBCOR bats in 2011; passing **Matt Oberste's** (2012-13) 17.

One-Hit Shutout...

In his second career start, freshman RHP **Chris Andritsos** threw seven innings of shutout, one-hit ball. He retired the first eight Central Arkansas (3/1) batters of the game before allowing the only hit of the day in the third. The Sooners totaled six hits in the win, including solo home runs from **Sheldon Neuse** and **Cody Thomas**. Freshman RHP **Connor Berry** finished the game with two-scoreless innings of relief to earn the first save of his career, while tallying three strikeouts. The win marked the first shutout for OU since beating Alcorn State (4/22/15), 8-0. The Sooners have shutout UCA in back-to-back seasons by a score of 10-0. Andritsos has totaled 12 innings and 11 strikeouts in two starts with only two hits against and one run.

Against the West...

Under head coach Pete Hughes, the Sooners are 10-4 against schools from California. When playing against teams from the Pacific or Hawaii Time Zones, OU is 16-9. When playing in the Pacific of Hawaii Time Zones, Oklahoma is 13-4-1. In the last two seasons, the Sooners have played seven of the 11 Pac-12 schools and posted a 3-4 record.

Turf and Turf...

Through nine games, Oklahoma had played every game on a synthetic turf field. The Sooners are 8-5 at home on L. Dale Mitchell Park's new AstroTurf® surface. The first road trip of the season saw OU play on Sam Houston State's newly resurfaced Don Sander Stadium. The Sooners played their first game on natural grass this season last at USC and are 5-3-1 on natural surfaces and 9-11 on turf.

Road Test...

Gearing the schedule toward the RPI, Oklahoma plays 30 games away from L. Dale Mitchell Park, which includes the Bedlam Series hosted by Oklahoma State and a game at Dodger Stadium against Mississippi State. It is the most for the Sooners since 1999 when they played 32 games away from home. The last three times that Oklahoma went on the road 28 times or more in a season, the Sooners hosted a regional in Norman in 2006, 2009 and 2010.

Major League Diamonds...

Since the Big 12 Championship was last hosted in Arlington at Globe Life Park (Ameriquest Field at the time) in 2004, Oklahoma has played at a Major League Baseball park five times. The Sooners are 3-1-1 in such games following a tie vs. Mississippi State (3/6). OU most recently defeated UT-Arlington (3/11/14), 3-2 in 10 innings, in Arlington. In 2008, Oklahoma went 2-1 at the Houston College Classic at Minute Maid Park. The Sooners lost the opener to Rice (2/29/08), 7-2, before picking ups wins over Houston (3/1/08) and Tennessee (3/2/08) by scores of 8-5 in 10 innings and 2-0.

Power and Speed...

Senior **Hunter Haley** has 13 home runs and 30 stolen bases in his career. Over the last decade, he is one of just four players at OU to record 10 homers and 25 steals in a career. **Max White** (2010-13) and **Jamie Johnson** (2008-09) are the other two. White hit 23 homers and swiped 29 bags, while Johnson posted 18 and 38. Junior **Sheldon Neuse** joined that group (18 HR, 25 SB) at Little Rock (3/29).

MLB Opening Day 2016...

Two former Sooners made opening day big league rosters out of camp. Right-handers Garrett Richards (Angels) and Chase An**derson** (Brewers) will each start in their respective club's rotation. Fellow right-hander Jon Gray (Rockies) was moved to the disabledlist to start the season after a bicep injury late in spring training. Richards was tabbed as the opening day starting pitcher for the Angels. He is the first OU player to start on opening day since **Jason Bartlett** (Padres, shortstop) in 2012. Richards becomes the first OU pitcher to start opening day since **Russ Ortiz** (Braves) in 2004 and the sixth different OU pitcher to start 11 opening days.

19 Ways Moves Beyond OU...

Head coach **Pete Hughes** started the 19 Ways community service initiative while at Virginia Tech as a tribute to his late mother. Alice. Since bringing the program to OU, 19 Ways has expanded to eight programs across the country. This offseason, Northeastern became the eighth program to start its own 19 Ways. Opening day marks the second time Oklahoma has faced another program with a 19 Ways initiative; the first being Notre Dame on opening weekend 2015.

New Field; Same Tradition...

Completion of the new synthetic turf field at L. Dale Mitchell Park on January 15 made OU the sixth team in the Big 12 with a turf playing surface. The surface is made of AstroTurf® 3D Xtreme and covers 150,000 square feet. The turf holds 351,000 lbs. of sand, 180,400 lbs. of rubber, covers 4,100 linear feet of drainage and can handle 4-6 inches of rain per hour. Among 61 power conference teams, 26 play on a turf field. Since 2011, 21 NCAA Regionals have been hosted on a turf playing field, while 12 teams with a home field of synthetic turf have appeared in the College World Series over that time.

Big League Pitchers...

In 2015, Sooner baseball alums combined to start 68 games on the mound in Major League Baseball. That total ranks the second highest among NCAA teams; second only to Long Beach State (70). Garrett Richards (32), Chase Anderson (27) and Jon Gray (9) each took to the hill in 2015 with Gray making his MLB debut on August 4.
