First Pitch...

The Oklahoma baseball team visits TCU this weekend for a three-game, Big 12 series. Game one from Lupton Stadium is scheduled for a 7:00 pm start; nationally televised on FS1.

About the Sooners...

Oklahoma has won seven of its last nine games dating back to a 5-2 win over Little Rock (3/29) that ended a 10-game road swing. The Sooners are 18-15-1 overall and 4-5 in the Big 12 after taking two of three from Baylor (4/8-10) last weekend. The Sooners are led offensively by junior shortstop **Sheldon Neuse**, whose slash-line ranks in the top three of each category in the Big 12. Neuse is batting .385 with a .493 on-base percentage and .689 slugging percentage. He has nine doubles, six home runs, five triples and 24 runs batted in. Senior left fielder **Hunter Haley** and junior infielder **Jack Flansburg**, who each have four home runs, are tied with Neuse for the team lead in RBI at 24. Haley is on a tear hitting .473 (9-for-19) with 13 RBI over the last five games and was named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week on Monday. Flansburg is hitting .286 with a team-leading 24 runs scored. Junior first baseman **Austin O'Brien** is second on the team with a .303 batting average and .487 slugging percentage. Freshman right-hander **Ryan Madden** (1-2) moves into the Friday night role for Oklahoma this week. Fellow freshman RHP **Chris Andritsos** (4-2) follows for the Sooners on Saturday.

On the Air...

The entire series can be heard across the Sooner Sports Radio Network and locally on Sportstalk 1400 AM. The voice of the Sooners **Toby Rowland** will call the action alongside OU baseball alum **Ross Hubbard**. All three games will be televised, including two on national TV. Friday will air on FS1, Saturday on FSSW+ and Sunday on ESPNU.

- Sheldon Neuse and Hunter Haley elected weekend series captains by teammates. Full details on page 3.
- Neuse has six HRs, including in back-to-back games twice. He has homered in back-to-back games four times in his career.
- The Sooners have won four walk-offs this season, including three over the last five games.
- Haley became the third Sooner to be honored as a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week in the last three seasons after a three-home run, eight-RBI week.
- Freshman pitchers have accounted for 12 of Oklahoma's 18 wins. Overall, OU newcomers have totaled 14 this season. Neuse and Shawn Hunter are the only returning pitchers with a win.
- Neuse moved in to 10th in the Big 12 era (1997-present) for RBI at OU with the 113th of his career last Tuesday. He is the Sooners' leader in triples at 15 over that span and is 11th with 36 doubles.
- Oklahoma boasted a program-best 3.27 GPA in the fall 2015 semester; the highest for a men's sport at OU.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 19 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 605-456-3 (.571), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children: Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Horned Frogs...

No. 7 TCU is 24-8 overall and 6-3 in the Big 12 following a series win over Kansas and a midweek loss to Dallas Baptist on Tuesday. Right-hander **Luken Baker** (2-1) gets the ball for the Horned Frogs on Friday night. He owns a 1.79 ERA and has struck out 34 in 40.1 innings of work. Baker, a two-way player, is also hitting .336 with a team-high 32 runs driven in. The TCU pitching staff is holding opponents to a .238 average, while Frog hitters are hitting at a combined .312 clip. Third baseman **Elliott Barzilli** leads the Big 12 at .436 with five home runs and 29 RBI. Catcher **Evan Skoug** is one of five regulars hitting over .300 with a .308 average, five home runs and 30 RBI.

Last Time They Met...

TCU celebrated a Big 12 regular season championship in Norman last May after sweeping Oklahoma. The Sooners had an outside shot at the title going in to the series: had they picked up a sweep. The Horned Frogs won each game by two runs or less. OU would rally in the ninth in all three games, getting the potential tying run on base. **Anthony Hermelyn** hit .500 (7-for-14) in the series with eight RBI.

All-Time vs. TCU...

Oklahoma leads the series against TCU with a 57-29 all-time record. Since TCU joined the Big 12 in 2013, the Horned Frogs hold a 5-4 advantage in league games and 6-5 overall. Ten of the last 13 games between the two teams have been decided by one or two runs, including two extra-inning games. Oklahoma hosted TCU at the 2006 Norman Regional. The Horned Frogs opened with a 6-5 win over the Sooners before OU eliminated TCU, 15-6, on the way to advancing to the Houston Super Regional.

The 2016 Sooners vs. the Frogs...

Since the 2013 season, senior left fielder **Hunter Haley** has played in 11 games against TCU with a .267 (12-for-45) batting average. Junior shortstop **Sheldon Neuse** is hitting a team-best .312 (10-for-31) in eight games against the Frogs with a .421 OBP and .500 slugging percentage. He homered at TCU (5/11/14) as a freshman. Neuse also earned an extra-inning win (5/10/14) and took an extra-inning loss (3/24/15) in two pitching appearances against the Horned Frogs. Sophomore infielder **Kyle Mendenhall** chipped in with a .286 (4-for-14) season against TCU last year with two two-hit games.

Wild Walk Offs the Norm for Norman Nine...

Oklahoma has won four games in walk-off fashion this season, including each of the last three home Sunday contests. The Sooners added to their total with two to claim a series win over Baylor this past weekend. Oklahoma did not lead in either game until the winning run touched home. **Sheldon Neuse** singled and **Jack Flansburg** walked in the ninth of game one. **Renae Martinez** came in to pinch-hit and put down a sacrifice-bunt that was thrown away and allowed Neuse to score the walk-off run in a 4-3 win. On Sunday, in a game that featured four home runs by each side, it was three-straight singles that decided the game in extra innings. In the 11th, **Cade Harris** and **Ben Hollas** singled with two down to set up the game-winning hit for Flansburg; a 7-6 final. It marked the first series win for Oklahoma over Baylor since a 2012 sweep at home.

Powering Past the Patriots...

The Sooners snapped an eight-game losing streak in the all-time series against non-conference opponent Dallas Baptist last Tuesday. Oklahoma's offense exploded for five runs in the first and six in the third en route to a 12-2 win at home. It marked the first win for the Sooners over the Patriots since April 27, 2010. **Sheldon Neuse** went 2-for-4 with a home run and freshman center fielder **Steele Walker** added a three-hit night. Freshman right-hander **Jake Irvin** struck out five, worked out of a bases loaded jam in the first and lasted five innings to earn his first career win.

Weekend Series Captains...

Sheldon Neuse and **Hunter Haley** were elected team captains by their teammates for this weekend's series at TCU. It is the beginning of a new tradition for the Sooners to identify to captains prior to a weekend series. Oklahoma does not elect its season captains prior to the season, but rather at the end. In 2015, OU players voted **Jacob Evans** and **Anthony Hermelyn** after the season as the two players who, throughout the entire season, embodied the ultimate leader and teammate.

National Player of the Week...

For his efforts in the series win over Baylor, senior left fielder **Hunter Haley** was named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball News* on April 11. He hit .429 (6-for-14) in a 3-1 week for the Sooners and totaled eight RBI and three home runs; all of which came at the expense of the Bears. An OU player has earned the honor in each of the last three seasons as Haley joins former teammates **Kolbey Carpenter** (2/23/15) and **Mac James** (3/10/14).

Up Next...

Bedlam comes to Norman next Tuesday night. Oklahoma hosts Oklahoma State at on April 19 for a 6:00 pm first pitch. The Sooners will remain at home the following weekend against West Virginia.

Sooners Turn Down Horns...

Oklahoma won back-to-back series over Texas for the first time in program history and has now won three of the last four. The Sooners recorded their first home win over Texas (4/1) since April 5, 2008. Freshman RHP **Chris Andritsos** struck out five in 7.2 innings of one run ball. OU went deep three times, including a three-run shot from junior **Jack Flansburg** in a 6-1 victory. Oklahoma bounced back from a Saturday defeat to walk off the Longhorns on Sunday, 4-3. Flansburg tied the game in the sixth with a two-run single. In the ninth, the Sooners loaded the bases with one out. Junior **Ben Hollas** delivered the game-winning hit: a line drive single to right. The win marked the first home series win for Oklahoma over Texas since 1998: when OU swept UT. Senior outfielder **Hunter Haley** is the only player in program history to have played in three series wins over the Longhorns.

Making Noise at the Plate and on the Mound...

In a walk-off win over Texas (4/3), junior **Sheldon Neuse** made an impact at the plate and on the mound. As the starting shortstop, he gave Oklahoma its first lead of the day in the bottom of the first inning with a towering home run off the scoreboard in left-center. Neuse later moved to the mound with two runners on and only one out in the top of the eighth. He stranded both before pitching a 1-2-3 top of the ninth. After retiring all five batters faced, including a pair of strikeouts, Neuse was credited with the win. He became the first player at OU to homer and earn the win on the mound since **Jacob Evans** did so with a walk-off home run against Kansas (4/2/15).

The Long and Winding Road...

Oklahoma went 6-4 in its recent 10-game stretch away from L. Dale Mitchell Park. It marked the longest road swing since 1999, which was also 10 games and included a three-game Bedlam series in OKC and Tulsa. OU's longest stretch away from home in 2015 was nine games, including a four-game series against BYU in Las Vegas that was originally scheduled to be played in Norman. In the Sooners National Championship season of 1994, they were also on the road for 10 in a row with a 7-3 record. Oklahoma regularly had 10-game road trips under head coach **Enos Semore**, including 14 times in 16 seasons and a program-high 21 in a row on the road to open the 1976 season ahead of the Sooners' fifth-consecutive College World Series appearance.

Big 12 Openers...

The Sooners are 9-11 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after a 5-0 loss at Texas Tech (3/24/15). Oklahoma lost the series to the Red Raiders to mark the first series loss in the first Big 12 weekend since 2012 against Texas. OU won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Iowa State (3/7/97), 7-4.

#YardWork...

Oklahoma posted its best home run total since 2011 with 39 in 2015. The Sooners hit a season-high four in a 7-6 win over Baylor (4/10). It was the most since OU went yard four times against Purdue (3/8/15). **Sheldon Neuse** is OU's active career leader with 19, which is second among active Big 12 players, followed by **Hunter Haley** at 16.

Shave for the Brave...

On April 7, the Sooners shaved their heads to fight childhood cancer at their third annual "Shave for the Brave". Donations benefited the Vs. Cancer Foundation and OU Children's Hospital. In the three seasons, OU baseball has raised more than \$80,000 and in 2015 ranked first among 63 participating teams. The game following Shave for the Brave was be the team's seventh annual "Go Mitch Go" game against Baylor. **Mitchell Whitaker** was a friend of the program that passed in 2007 from Leukemia. The Sooners award one player each year in his honor. **Austin O'Brien** earned the award in 2016.

Triple Nation...

Oklahoma ranks second in the Big 12 and 57th in the NCAA with 10 triples. **Sheldon Neuse** is the team leader at five. He is first in Big 12 and fifth in the country. He recorded the 15th of his career against Baylor (4/9). Neuse has the fifth most career triples among active players in the NCAA and is now tied for fourth all-time at OU with **Bill Severns** (1972-75) and **Baine Brooks** (1986-87). His 15 are the most at OU in the Big 12 era.

Fresh Faces...

Coach Hughes started a season-high six freshmen in the lineup against Wichita State (3/8), including RHP **Kyle Tyler** making his first career start. The Sooners have started three or more freshmen in 21 of the last 24 games and 22 times overall this season.

Keepin' it 100...

Entering the week, **Sheldon Neuse** ranked in the top-100 of seven offensive statistical categories as well as 96th in the country with four saves. He peaks in the national rankings at fifth with five triples. **Chris Andritsos** ranks highest among Sooner pitchers with a 0.78 WHIP that is ninth in the nation and first in the Big 12. He is second on the team with four top-100 rankings. As a team, Oklahoma ranks 14th in the country with a .978 fielding percentage, which is the best in the conference.

Iron Man Streak Ended...

At Fresno State (3/15), head coach **Pete Hughes** wrote out his lineup card without **Sheldon Neuse** on it for the first time since the two arrived at OU together for the 2014 season. Neuse had a stretch of 135 consecutive games started snapped. It is the longest streak on record at Oklahoma (2003-present). The previous record was held by **Jack Mayfield** at 120 (5/7/12-6/8/13). Neuse's former teammate, **Craig Aikin** was left out of the lineup just once in his career and had separate 91-game streak to start and end his career.

The Big Inning...

The Sooners have scored more than two runs in an inning 21 times this season after scoring a season-high eight in the third at Wichita State (4/12). Oklahoma had previously scored six runs in an inning three times: vs. Dallas Baptist (4/5), at CSU Bakersfield (3/19) and vs. Northeastern (2/21). In its comeback win over Long Beach State (3/13), Oklahoma brought in four runs in the ninth. OU pitchers have limited the opposition to scoring more than twice in an inning 15 times. The Sooners have allowed three runs or more in the first or second inning six times this season.

Oklahoma is Home...

The Sooner roster features 11 players from within the state's borders and 11 from Texas. This season marks the most Oklahoma born players at OU since 12 in 2012 and the first time with as many or more players from Oklahoma than Texas since 2006. In 2006, 13 Sooner players called Oklahoma home, while just five were from Texas.

Sooners Bat Around California...

Oklahoma extended its win streak to six games with five wins coming in a five-day span in California. The Sooners started with a narrow 3-2 win at Fresno State (3/15) followed by a four-game sweep over CSU Bakersfield. OU lifted its season batting average by 19 points over the week with a collective .306 as a team. The Sooners posted double-digit hits in three games and scored double-figure runs in two, while matching a season-high 13 in the finale against the Roadrunners (3/19). **Sheldon Neuse** (.450) and **Austin O'Brien** (.438) led the Oklahoma offense in hitting.

A Bunt and a Blast Key Walk-Off...

Looking to avoid their fourth one-run loss of the season, the Sooners rallied in the ninth against Long Beach State (3/13) to win 6-3 on a walk-off, three-run homer by senior left fielder **Hunter Haley**. Trailing 3-2 entering the bottom of the ninth, Oklahoma got back-to-back singles from senior right fielder **Alex Wise** and freshman center fielder **Steele Walker** to set the table with runners at the corners. In a pinch-hit appearance, junior **Ben Hollas** put down a bunt to score Wise from third on a suicide-squeeze that tied the game. Haley then blasted a 2-2 pitch to right-center for his first home run of the season. It was Oklahoma's first win of the year when trailing after the sixth inning or later.

Oh man, oh man, oh man, not again...

Sheldon Neuse smashed his second home run of the season vs. Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium and followed with a home run against Wichita State (3/8). He later homered against Texas (4/3) and Dallas Baptist (4/5) in back-to-back games. Neuse has homered in back-to-back games four times in his career. He did so twice in 2015 against BYU (2/28) and Little Rock (3/3) and later against Purdue (3/7-8). His 19 career home runs are the most among active Sooners and are the most at OU since the introduction of the BBCOR bats in 2011: passing **Matt Oberste's** (2012-13) 17.

One-Hit Shutout...

In his second career start, freshman RHP **Chris Andritsos** threw seven innings of shutout, one-hit ball. He retired the first eight Central Arkansas (3/1) batters of the game before allowing the only hit of the day in the third. The Sooners totaled six hits in the win, including solo home runs from **Sheldon Neuse** and **Cody Thomas**. Freshman RHP **Connor Berry** finished the game with two scoreless innings of relief to earn the first save of his career, while tallying three strikeouts. The win marked the first shutout for OU since beating Alcorn State (4/22/15), 8-0. The Sooners have shutout UCA in back-to-back seasons by a score of 10-0. Andritsos has totaled 12 innings and 11 strikeouts in two starts with only two hits against and one run.

Hog Tied...

Due to travel restrictions, Oklahoma's game with Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium ended after nine innings in a 5-5 tie. It marked the 12th tie in OU history and first since a 5-5, 11-inning game at Nebraska (3/22/08). The Sooners overcame a 5-1 deficit after the third inning.

Against the West...

Under head coach Pete Hughes, the Sooners are 10-4 against schools from California. When playing against teams from the Pacific or Hawaii Time Zones, OU is 16-9. When playing in the Pacific of Hawaii Time Zones, Oklahoma is 13-4-1. In the last two seasons, the Sooners have played seven of the 11 Pac-12 schools and posted a 3-4 record.

Turf and Turf...

Through nine games, Oklahoma had played every game on a synthetic turf field. The Sooners are 8-5 at home on L. Dale Mitchell Park's new AstroTurf® surface. The first road trip of the season saw OU play on Sam Houston State's newly resurfaced Don Sander Stadium. The Sooners played their first game on natural grass this season last at USC and are 5-3-1 on natural surfaces and 13-12 on turf.

Road Test...

Gearing the schedule toward the RPI, Oklahoma plays 30 games away from L. Dale Mitchell Park, which includes the Bedlam Series hosted by Oklahoma State and a game at Dodger Stadium against Mississippi State. It is the most for the Sooners since 1999 when they played 32 games away from home. The last three times that Oklahoma went on the road 28 times or more in a season, the Sooners hosted a regional in Norman in 2006, 2009 and 2010.

Major League Diamonds...

Since the Big 12 Championship was last hosted in Arlington at Globe Life Park (Ameritrust Field at the time) in 2004, Oklahoma has played at a Major League Baseball park five times. The Sooners are 3-1-1 in such games following a tie vs. Mississippi State (3/6). OU most recently defeated UT-Arlington (3/11/14), 3-2 in 10 innings, in Arlington. In 2008, Oklahoma went 2-1 at the Houston College Classic at Minute Maid Park. The Sooners lost the opener to Rice (2/29/08), 7-2, before picking up wins over Houston (3/1/08) and Tennessee (3/2/08) by scores of 8-5 in 10 innings and 2-0.

Power and Speed...

Senior **Hunter Haley** has 16 home runs and 30 stolen bases in his career. Over the last decade, he is one of just four players at OU to record 10 homers and 25 steals in a career. **Max White** (2010-13) and **Jamie Johnson** (2008-09) are the other two. White hit 23 homers and swiped 29 bags, while Johnson posted 18 and 38. Junior **Sheldon Neuse** joined that group (19 HR, 25 SB) at Little Rock (3/29).

CONFERENCE NOTES

✚ Texas Tech, picked to finish fifth in the coaches preseason poll, sits atop the Big 12 standings at 11-1 with a 10-game conference win streak intact. The Red Raiders' 10 straight Big 12 wins is tied for the fifth longest single-season win streak in conference history as TTU is the sixth team since 2000 to win 10 or more consecutive Big 12 games.

✚ The 10-1 start by Texas Tech is the best in Big 12 play since Baylor opened the 2012 campaign with six straight conference series sweeps for an 18-0 start.

✚ With its first sweep of a ranked conference opponent on the road in program history last weekend at Oklahoma State, Tech climbed in this week's national polls, checking in as high as No. 10 and ranked in the top 15 on two additional lists.

✚ TCU remains in the top 10 as the Frogs are as high as No. 7. TCU posted its sixth shutout of the season last Saturday. It's the 30th shutout for TCU in the last three years, a mark that is tops in the NCAA. Ranked 14th nationally in ERA and 16th in batting average, the Frogs are one of four teams in the nation in the top 20 in both categories.

✚ Close contests have been the trend this season for league teams as 39 of the 86 non-conference losses have been by a margin of three runs or less.

✚ In the 41 conference games thus far, 21 have been decided by three runs or less with 17 by just one run (41 percent).

✚ Three of last week's four conference series were won by the road team. Eight of the 14 league series have thus far have gone to the home team with TTU the only team to record multiple conference series wins on the road.

✚ With two triples last week, Oklahoma's Sheldon Neuse cracked the top 10 of the Big 12 career list and is tied with three players with 15 career triples. The conference record for career triples is 20.

✚ TCU's Cam Warner has recorded a hit in 20 straight games for the Frogs. If the junior hits safely in the Frogs' four games this week, he will rank in the top 10 for longest hit streaks in conference history. A league player has not recorded a hit in 20 or more straight games since the 2013 season.

✚ West Virginia's Jackson Cramer increased his reached base streak to 49 straight games, which ranks as the fourth-longest reached base streak over multiple seasons since 2003.
