First Pitch...

The University of Oklahoma baseball team is on the road this weekend for a three-game, Big 12 series at Kansas. Game one gets underway Friday night at 6:00 pm.

About the Sooners...

The Sooners have claimed three of their last four conference series and head towards the weekend with a 20-20-1 overall and 6-9 Big 12 record. Oklahoma has claimed all three league series wins at home, while being swept twice on the road at Texas Tech and TCU, both of which currently rank in the nation's top-10 of several polls. Junior shortstop **Sheldon Neuse** leads the Sooners offensively. He is hitting .367 with a .639 slugging and .469 on-base percentage; all of which rank in the top five among Big 12 hitters. Senior right fielder **Alex Wise** has been in the lineup in each game for Oklahoma and is second with a .308 batting average, including a .328 mark in conference play. He has scored 23 runs and is tied for the team lead in doubles at 12 with Neuse and freshman outfielder **Steele Walker**. Walker has hit .386 (17-for-44) over the last 12 games to lift his season average to .271. Freshman right-hander **Chris Andritsos** (4-3) leads the OU pitching staff with a 2.86 earned run average. He struck out eight in 7.2 innings of a no-decision vs. West Virginia last week. Andritsos had a no-hitter through six innings on the Sooners' eventual 1-0, 10-inning victory. Junior right-hander **Jake Elliott** (0-1) and freshman right-hander **Jake Irvin** (2-1) round out Oklahoma's rotation.

- Oklahoma pitchers have struck out 10 or more in a game 10 times, including a season-high 14 vs. Oklahoma State (4/20).
- The Sooners have won five walk-offs this season, including four in Big 12 games.
- Oklahoma won twice on walk-offs, both in the 10th inning, in a three-game sweep of Kansas in Norman last year.
- Sheldon Neuse has been named to the midseason watch list for both the Golden Spikes (Player of the Year) Award and John Olerud (Two-Way Player of the Year) Award.
- Freshman pitchers have accounted for 12 of Oklahoma's 20 wins. Overall, OU newcomers have totaled 15 this season. Neuse and Shawn Hunter are the only returning pitchers with a win.
- Jake Elliott last earned a win on April 17, 2015 at West Virginia as he struck out eight in 7.1 scoreless innings.
- Oklahoma boasted a program-best 3.27 GPA in the fall 2015 semester: the highest for a men's sport at OU.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 19 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 607-461-3 (.571), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children: Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Jayhawks...

Kansas is 17-23-1 overall and 3-8 in the Big 12 after a tie with Grand Canyon at home on Tuesday and a loss to Nebraska at Kauffman Stadium on Wednesday. The Jayhawks are hitting a collective .283, led by catcher **Michael Tinsley** at .369 with 35 runs scored. Left fielder **Devin Foyle**, who ranks fourth with a .324 average, has knocked in a team-high 29 runs. Lefty **Ben Krauth** (3-4) is Kansas' Friday starter. All three of the Jayhawks' league wins have come in their last three Friday games. He has thrown two complete games and owns a 3.02 ERA with 75 strikeouts in 65.2 innings pitched.

Last Time They Met...

A pair of walk-offs opened and closed a series sweep for Oklahoma over Kansas in Norman last season. The Friday dramatics came by way of a 7-6, 10-inning thriller that ended on a walk-off home run by the winning pitcher **Jacob Evans**. The Sooners took game two, 6-3, behind six-strong inning from **Alec Hansen**, who struck out nine, and a three-hit game from **Kolbey Carpenter**. Oklahoma needed extras again on Sunday as **Taylor Alspaugh** provided the walk-off base hit in the 10th of an 8-7 win.

All-Time vs. Kansas...

Oklahoma leads the all-time series over Kansas, 133-70-1, including a 38-17 mark in Big 12 regular season games. In postseason play, the two sides have met seven times with OU holding a 4-3 advantage, which includes a 2-1 mark in the Big 12 Championship with a 7-2 Sooner win in the 2013 title game. **Jacob Evans** got the win in five innings of relief and first baseman **Matt Oberste** provided four RBI.

Wrist Injury Slows Sooner Senior...

After having been voted a series captain by his teammates each of the past two weekends, senior left fielder **Hunter Haley** finds himself on the shelf with a fractured wrist. A career .448 (13-for-29) hitter against Kansas, Haley was injured in last weekend's opener against West Virginia on a high-throw, swipe-tag play at first. For his career, Haley has registered 99 runs driven in and 98 scored, leaving him just shy of becoming the 40th player in program history to record 100 in each category throughout his Sooner career.

Wild Walk Offs the Norm for Norman Nine...

Oklahoma has won five games in walk-off fashion this season, including four in Big 12 play and three coming on Sundays. The Sooners added to their total with two to claim a series win over Baylor (4/8, 4/10). Oklahoma did not lead in either game until the winning run touched home. **Sheldon Neuse** singled and **Jack Flansburg** walked in the ninth of game one. **Renae Martinez** came in to pinch-hit and put down a sacrifice bunt that was thrown away and allowed Neuse to score the walk-off run in a 4-3 win. In the second walk-off vs. Baylor, a game that featured four home runs by each side, it was three-straight singles that decided the game in extra innings. In the 11th, **Cade Harris** and **Ben Hollas** singled with two down to set up the game-winning hit for Flansburg; a 7-6 final. It marked the first series win for Oklahoma over Baylor since a 2012 sweep at home.

Cool Ranch Andritsos...

Freshman **Chris Andritsos** has emerged as Oklahoma's Friday night starter and one of the top two-way players in the Big 12. On the mound, he is 4-3 with a team-leading 2.86 ERA and Big 12-leading 0.83. In limited action at the plate as the OU designated hitter or first baseman, Andritsos is hitting .250 (9-for-36) with five runs scored and five driven in. Against West Virginia, he had a no-hitter through six and went on to strike out eight in 7.2-shutout innings in an eventual, 1-0 win. Andritsos then beat the Mountaineers with his bat in game two as he went 3-for-5 and drove in the game-tying and go-ahead runs in the eighth inning.

Five-Down to Six-Up...

Oklahoma overcame a five-run deficit to win in a 12-6 decision over West Virginia on Saturday. It marked the first come-from-behind win of five runs or more since defeating BYU (2/28/15) in Las Vegas. The Sooners trailed 6-1 and chipped away with a three-run sixth and pulled within one on a home run by freshman catcher **Domenic DeRenzo**. Oklahoma then turned the game upside down with a seven-run inning in the eighth to clinch the series.

Young Arms...

Sooner freshmen pitchers have combined for 12 of the team's 20 wins, which is the second highest total among Big 12 staffs. Collectively, OU freshmen have posted a 3.62 ERA, 7.64 K/9 average and 2.14 K-to-BB ratio. **Chris Andritsos** and **Austin Hansen** have each won four games, while **Jake Irvin** has struck out a class-leading 35.

April Brings Spring to Wise's Bat...

In the month of April, senior right fielder Alex Wise is hitting .386 (22-for-57). After dropping to a season-low .253 batting average on March 26, Wise busted out of a slump with a 2-for-4, two-double game at Little Rock (3/29) and has lifted his average to .308. Since that game, he has hit successfully in 13 of 16 games with eight multi-hit games and seven doubles.

Keepin' it 100...

Entering the week, **Sheldon Neuse** ranked in the top-100 of five offensive statistical categories. He peaks in the national rankings at 11th with five triples. **Chris Andritsos** ranks highest among Sooner pitchers with a 0.83 WHIP that is sixth in the nation and first in the Big 12. He is second on the team with four top-100 rankings. As a team, Oklahoma ranks 16th in the country with a .978 fielding percentage, which is the best in the conference. The Sooners are also 20th in the country with 40 double plays turned.

#YardWork...

Oklahoma posted its best home run total since 2011 with 39 in 2015. The Sooners hit a season-high four in a 7-6 win over Baylor (4/10). It was the most since OU went yard four times against Purdue (3/8/15). **Sheldon Neuse** is OU's active career leader with 19, which is second among active Big 12 players, followed by **Hunter Haley** at 16.

Double Down on Steele...

Freshman center fielder **Steele Walker** has been in the OU lineup for 39 of 41 games this season and is tied for first on the team with 12 doubles with eight in the last 12 games. His 12 doubles are tied for eighth most by a freshman on record (1993-present) with **Jackson Williams** (2005). In 2014, **Sheldon Neuse** doubled 17 times, which ranks second by a Sooner freshman. **Matt Bose** (2002) owns the record at 18.

Triple Nation...

Oklahoma ranks fourth in the Big 12 and 84th in the NCAA with 11 triples. **Sheldon Neuse** is the team leader at five. He is first in Big 12 and fifth in the country. He recorded the 15th of his career against Baylor (4/9). Neuse has the fifth most career triples among active players in the NCAA and is now tied for fourth all-time at OU with **Bill Severns** (1972-75) and **Baine Brooks** (1986-87). His 15 are the most at OU in the Big 12 era.

National Player of the Week...

For his efforts in the series win over Baylor, senior left fielder **Hunter Haley** was named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball News* on April 11. He hit .429 (6-for-14) in a 3-1 week for the Sooners and totaled eight RBI and three home runs: all of which came at the expense of the Bears. An OU player has earned the honor in each of the last three seasons as Haley joins former teammates **Kolbey Carpenter** (2/23/15) and **Mac James** (3/10/14).

Making Noise at the Plate and on the Mound...

In a walk-off win over Texas (4/3), junior **Sheldon Neuse** made an impact at the plate and on the mound. As the starting shortstop, he gave Oklahoma its first lead of the day in the bottom of the first inning with a towering home run off the scoreboard in left-center. Neuse later moved to the mound with two runners on and only one out in the top of the eighth. He stranded both before pitching a 1-2-3 top of the ninth. After retiring all five batters faced, including a pair of strikeouts, Neuse was credited with the win. He became the first player at OU to homer and earn the win on the mound since **Jacob Evans** did so with a walk-off home run against Kansas (4/2/15).

The Long and Winding Road...

Oklahoma went 6-4 in its 10-game stretch away from L. Dale Mitchell Park in March. It marked the longest road swing since 1999, which was also 10 games and included a three-game Bedlam series in OKC and Tulsa. OU's longest stretch away from home in 2015 was nine games, including a four-game series against BYU in Las Vegas that was originally scheduled to be played in Norman. In the Sooners National Championship season of 1994, they were also on the road for 10 in a row with a 7-3 record. Oklahoma regularly had 10-game road trips under head coach **Enos Semore**, including 14 times in 16 seasons and a program-high 21 in a row on the road to open the 1976 season ahead of the Sooners' fifth-consecutive College World Series appearance.

Shave for the Brave...

On April 7, the Sooners shaved their heads to fight childhood cancer at their third annual "Shave for the Brave". Donations benefited the Vs. Cancer Foundation and OU Children's Hospital. In the three seasons, OU baseball has raised more than \$80,000 and in 2015 ranked first among 63 participating teams. Fresh Faces...

Coach Hughes started a season-high six freshmen in the lineup against Wichita State (3/8), including RHP **Kyle Tyler** making his first career start. The Sooners have started three or more freshmen in 27 of the last 30 games and 28 times overall this season.

Powering Past the Patriots...

The Sooners snapped an eight-game losing streak in the all-time series against non-conference opponent Dallas Baptist last Tuesday. Oklahoma's offense exploded for five runs in the first and six in the third en route to a 12-2 win at home. It marked the first win for the Sooners over the Patriots since April 27, 2010. **Sheldon Neuse** went 2-for-4 with a home run and freshman center fielder **Steele Walker** added a three-hit night. Freshman right-hander **Jake Irvin** struck out five, worked out of a bases loaded jam in the first and lasted five innings to earn his first career win.

Sooners Turn Down Horns...

Oklahoma won back-to-back series over Texas for the first time in program history and has now won three of four. The Sooners recorded their first home win over Texas (4/1) since April 5, 2008. Freshman RHP **Chris Andritsos** struck out five in 7.2 innings of one run ball. OU went deep three times, including a three-run shot from junior **Jack Flansburg** in a 6-1 victory. Oklahoma bounced back from a Saturday defeat to walk off the Longhorns on Sunday, 4-3. Flansburg tied the game in the sixth with a two-run single. In the ninth, the Sooners loaded the bases with one out. Junior **Ben Hollas** delivered the game-winning hit: a line drive single to right. The win marked the first home series win for Oklahoma over Texas since 1998; when OU swept UT. Senior outfielder **Hunter Haley** is the only player in program history to have played in three series wins over the Longhorns.

Iron Man Streak Ended...

At Fresno State (3/15), head coach **Pete Hughes** wrote out his lineup card without **Sheldon Neuse** on it for the first time since the two arrived at OU together for the 2014 season. Neuse had a stretch of 135 consecutive games started snapped. It is the longest streak on record at Oklahoma (2003-present). The previous record was held by **Jack Mayfield** at 120 (5/7/12-6/8/13). Neuse's former teammate, **Craig Aikin** was left out of the lineup just once in his career and had separate 91-game streak to start and end his career.

Big 12 Openers...

The Sooners are 9-11 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after a 5-0 loss at Texas Tech (3/24/15). Oklahoma lost the series to the Red Raiders to mark the first series loss in the first Big 12 weekend since 2012 against Texas. OU won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Iowa State (3/7/97), 7-4.

The Big Inning...

The Sooners have scored more than two runs in an inning 24 times this season, including a season-high eight in the third at Wichita State (4/12). Oklahoma had previously scored six runs in an inning three times: vs. Dallas Baptist (4/5), at CSU Bakersfield (3/19) and vs. Northeastern (2/21) In its comeback win over Long Beach State (3/13), Oklahoma brought in four runs in the ninth. OU pitchers have limited the opposition to scoring more than twice in an inning 20 times. The Sooners have allowed three runs or more in the first or second inning seven times this season.

Oklahoma is Home...

The Sooner roster features 11 players from within the state's borders and 11 from Texas. This season marks the most Oklahoma born players at OU since 12 in 2012 and the first time with as many or more players from Oklahoma than Texas since 2006. In 2006, 13 Sooner players called Oklahoma home, while just five were from Texas.

Turf and Turf...

Through nine games, Oklahoma had played every game on a synthetic turf field. The Sooners are 8-5 at home on L. Dale Mitchell Park's new AstroTurf® surface. The first road trip of the season saw OU play on Sam Houston State's newly resurfaced Don Sander Stadium. The Sooners played their first game on natural grass this season last at USC and are 5-6-1 on natural surfaces and 15-14 on turf.

Sooners Bat Around California...

Oklahoma extended its win streak to six games with five wins coming in a five-day span in California. The Sooners started with a narrow 3-2 win at Fresno State (3/15) followed by a four-game sweep over CSU Bakersfield. OU lifted its season batting average by 19 points over the week with a collective .306 as a team. The Sooners posted double-digit hits in three games and scored double-figure runs in two, while matching a season-high 13 in the finale against the Roadrunners (3/19). **Sheldon Neuse** (.450) and **Austin O'Brien** (.438) led the Oklahoma offense in hitting.

A Bunt and a Blast Key Walk-Off...

Looking to avoid their fourth one-run loss of the season, the Sooners rallied in the ninth against Long Beach State (3/13) to win 6-3 on a walk-off, three-run homer by senior left fielder **Hunter Haley**. Trailing 3-2 entering the bottom of the ninth, Oklahoma got back-to-back singles from senior right fielder **Alex Wise** and freshman center fielder **Steele Walker** to set the table with runners at the corners. In a pinch-hit appearance, junior **Ben Hollas** put down a bunt to score Wise from third on a suicide-squeeze that tied the game. Haley then blasted a 2-2 pitch to right-center for his first home run of the season. It was Oklahoma's first win of the year when trailing after the sixth inning or later.

Power and Speed...

Senior **Hunter Haley** has 16 home runs and 30 stolen bases in his career. Over the last decade, he is one of just four players at OU to record 10 homers and 25 steals in a career. **Max White** (2010-13) and **Jamie Johnson** (2008-09) are the other two. White hit 23 homers and swiped 29 bags, while Johnson posted 18 and 38. Junior **Sheldon Neuse** joined that group (19 HR, 25 SB) at Little Rock (3/29).

Oh man, oh man, oh man, not again...

Sheldon Neuse smashed his second home run of the season vs. Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium and followed with a home run against Wichita State (3/8). He later homered against Texas (4/3) and Dallas Baptist (4/5) in back-to-back games. Neuse has homered in back-to-back games four times in his career. He did so twice in 2015 against BYU (2/28) and Little Rock (3/3) and later against Purdue (3/7-8). His 19 career home runs are the most among active Sooners and are the most at OU since the introduction of the BBCOR bats in 2011: passing **Matt Oberste's** (2012-13) 17.

Hog Tied...

Due to travel restrictions, Oklahoma's game with Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium ended after nine innings in a 5-5 tie. It marked the 12th tie in OU history and first since a 5-5, 11-inning game at Nebraska (3/22/08). The Sooners overcame a 5-1 deficit after the third inning.

Against the West...

Under head coach Pete Hughes, the Sooners are 10-4 against schools from California. When playing against teams from the Pacific or Hawaii Time Zones, OU is 16-9. When playing in the Pacific of Hawaii Time Zones, Oklahoma is 13-4-1. In the last two seasons, the Sooners have played seven of the 11 Pac-12 schools and posted a 3-4 record.

CONFERENCE NOTES

Following conference series losses, the league's top two teams will meet this weekend as Texas Tech travels to TCU. It marks a meeting of the top two hitting teams as both squads also rank in the top 25 nationally in scoring.

While last weekend featured the top four teams facing off, this weekend can vouch for the same as Oklahoma State visits Texas with the two teams tied for third place.

The Longhorns have won three straight conference series and, along with Tech, are the only league team to win four of five Big 12 series on the year.

OSU, TCU and TTU remain ranked in the top 25 this week as the Frogs and Red Raiders sit in the top 10 (TCU at No. 7 and Tech at No. 10). Oklahoma State ranks as high as No. 21. The three teams are also ranked in the NCAA RPI top 25 - 15. Texas Tech, 21. TCU and 25. Oklahoma State - as the Big 12 is one of three conferences with three or more teams in the top 25.

Oklahoma State has won a Pitcher of the Week honor in six of the season's 10 weeks as the Cowboys tied the single-season record for awards in that category with their latest honor this week. Their six accolades this year are the most for one team since Baylor in 2005.

In the 69 conference games thus far, 30 have been decided by three runs or less with 19 by just one run. Forty-six percent (44 of 95) of the league's non-conference losses have been by a margin of three runs or less.

All but 18 of Oklahoma's State 39 games have been determined by two runs or less, while 18 of Texas' 40 contests thus far have been by a two-run margin.

The Big 12 is the only "Power Five" conference in which a different league team has won the regular season each of the past five seasons. The Conference can boast the same feat in its postseason championship as the event has produced a different winner each of the past five years, which can not be said for the league's peer conferences.

Nationally, only three rookie pitchers have at least six wins and an undefeated record, including TCU's Dalton Horton (7-0) and Tech's Davis Martin.

Last Sunday's games produced a pair of grand slams as KU's Ty Denzer hit a ninth inning one and WVU freshman Cole Austin hit one in the Mountaineers' comeback over Oklahoma.

The Big 12 is the only conference in the nation with three or more teams ranking in the top 20 in double plays with TTU (third) and Oklahoma State (fifth) in the top five along with Oklahoma ranking 17th.
