First Pitch...

The Bedlam Series opens with the University of Oklahoma baseball team taking on in-state rival Oklahoma State Friday night at the Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark in Oklahoma City. The Sooners and the Cowboys take the field for a nationally televised contest at 6:30 pm on ESPNU. OU and OSU move to Tulsa for games two and three from ONEOK Field Saturday at 7:30 pm and Sunday at 2:00 pm.

About the Sooners...

The Sooners have pounded out 54 runs in their last five games, including a 12-0 run-rule win to take the weekend series from Kansas State on Sunday. Oklahoma enters the weekend at 24-23-1 overall and 9-12, good enough for fifth place, in the Big 12. Junior shortstop **Sheldon Neuse** is the team's leading hitter at .376, which ranks fourth in the league. He has homered 10 times and driven in 42 runs. Neuse's .694 slugging percentage is best in the Big 12 and his .466 on-base percentage is sixth. Senior **Alex Wise** has taken over as the OU center fielder and leadoff hitter in the last two weeks and has seen his average rise to .303 on the season. He is tied with Neuse for the team-lead in runs at 33 with 12 doubles and seven steals. Junior outfielder **Cody Thomas** is hitting .469 (15-for-32) since April 12 to lift his average to .288 on the year. Freshman right-hander **Jake Irvin** (4-1) takes the mound for the series opener for the first time this season.

On the Air...

The series can be heard across the Sooner Sports Radio Network and locally on Sportstalk 1400 AM. The voice of the Sooners **Toby Rowland** will call the action alongside OU alum **Ross Hubbard**. Friday's ESPNU game will be called by **Jason Benetti** and **Mike Rooney**. Games two and three will air on FSSW+ with **Dave Hunziker** and **Tom Holliday** in the booth.

- Oklahoma pitchers have struck out 10 or more in a game 14 times, including a season-high 14 vs. Oklahoma State (4/20).
- The Sooners have won five walk-offs this season, including four in Big 12 games.
- Since 2013, 11 of the 16 Bedlam games have been decided by three runs or less, including five one-run games.
- Sheldon Neuse has been named to the midseason watch list for both the Golden Spikes (Player of the Year) Award and John Olerud (Two-Way Player of the Year) Award.
- Neuse is a .321 (17-for-53) career hitter in 13 games against Oklahoma State with 12 RBI and five doubles.
- Neuse and Domenic DeRenzo became the first OU teammates to hit two HRs in a game (KU, 4/30) since Casey Johnson, Jamie Johnson and J.T. Wise all hit two each at Kansas State (3/22/09).
- Freshman pitchers have accounted for 15 of Oklahoma's 24 wins. Overall, OU newcomers have totaled 18 this season. Alec Hansen became the third returner to win a game on Sunday.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 20 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 611-464-3 (.568), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children: Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Cowboys...

Oklahoma State, ranked as high as No. 12 in the country by *Collegiate Baseball News*, improved to 31-15 on the year with a midweek win over Oral Roberts. The Cowboys enter the weekend in second place in the Big 12 with a 12-6 record. Shortstop **Donnie Walton** leads OSU with a .355 batting average, 34 runs scored and 10 stolen bases. Second baseman **J.R. Davis** ranks second at .338, while first baseman **Dustin Williams** has slammed a team-high 10 home runs. Two-time Big 12 Pitcher of the Week, right-hander **Thomas Hatch** (5-1) gets the nod to start game one. He owns a 1.36 ERA with 71 strikeouts in 86 innings.

Last Time They Met...

No. 25 Oklahoma State came in to Norman and left with a narrow, 4-3 win over Oklahoma on April 20 in a non-conference tilt. The Sooners got a run in the first and rallied for two in the ninth, but a pair of two-run innings in the latter half of the game secured the win for the Cowboys. OU pitchers combined to strike out 14 in the loss as OSU totaled 12 hits on 25 balls hit in play. Despite striking out 10, including six in a row, **Jake Irvin** took the loss with one earned run against him in 5.1 innings. **Garrett Bengé** posted a three-hit day for the Cowboys, while **Andrew Rosa** came off the bench with two RBI-singles.

All-Time vs. Oklahoma State...

Oklahoma trails Oklahoma State in the all-time series, 153-136. The Sooners hold the longest winning streak of the series with an 11-game stretch from 1976-1978. In the last three seasons, the Cowboys hold a 10-3 advantage. The longest game played between the two was a 12-9, 18-inning victory for Oklahoma in Stillwater on April 15, 2014. Since 2013, 11 of the 16 meetings have been decided by three runs or less, including five one-run games.

Neuse Hits New Career Marks...

Against Kansas State last weekend, **Sheldon Neuse** became the 40th player in program history to score 100 runs with 100 RBI in a Sooner career. He enters the weekend with 102 runs and 132 RBI. In Sunday's finale against the Wildcats, Neuse launched his 23rd career home run, which went for the 200th hit of his career. He became the 18th player in OU history to reach the 200-hit mark and the first since former teammate **Craig Aikin** did so in 2015.

Hansen Returns to the Rotation...

Junior right-hander **Alec Hansen** made his first start in the Sooner rotation since March 24 at Texas Tech with a six-inning start against Kansas State (5/8). He took a no-hitter into the sixth, which was broken up by a leadoff, bunt-single, and finished six-shutout innings with nine strikeouts. Hansen earned his first win of the season and first since beating the Wildcats in Manhattan (5/10/15).

2500 Wins in OU History...

The Sooners' 12-0 win over Kansas State (5/8) marked the 2,500th in program history. Oklahoma owns an all-time mark of 2,500-1,443-12 in 116 seasons. OU's win total ranks the third most among teams currently in the Big 12.

Rare Run-Rules...

Oklahoma picked up its second run-rule of the season with a 12-0, seven-inning decision over Kansas State (5/8). The Sooners previously defeated Kansas (5/1) in seven, 17-6. Prior to that, OU had last won by run-rule against New Orleans (4/21/13). Oklahoma had last won by run-rule twice in a season in 2013 as it first defeated Arkansas-Pine Bluff (2/19/13). The win against the Wildcats this season marked the first time the OU baseball and softball teams won on a run-rule on the same day since Sooner baseball defeated Western Illinois (2/21/09).

Freshmen Lead OU Past ORU...

In its last four meetings with Oral Roberts, Oklahoma had managed just one run in four losses. The Sooners quickly put that record behind them with a dominant, 12-3 win over the Golden Eagles (5/3) on Tuesday. Freshman RHP **Dylan Grove** made his first career start and took a no-hitter into the sixth. He finished with six strikeouts in six shutout innings. Freshman catcher **Domenic DeRenzo** provided the power at the bottom of the OU order with two home runs, including a grand slam.

Wild Walk Offs the Norm for Norman Nine...

Oklahoma has won five games in walk-off fashion this season, including four in Big 12 play and three coming on Sundays. The Sooners added to their total with two to claim a series win over Baylor (4/8, 4/10). Oklahoma did not lead in either game until the winning run touched home. **Sheldon Neuse** singled and **Jack Flansburg** walked in the ninth of game one. **Renee Martinez** came in to pinch-hit and put down a sacrifice bunt that was thrown away and allowed Neuse to score the walk-off run in a 4-3 win. In the second walk-off vs. Baylor, a game that featured four home runs by each side, it was three-straight singles that decided the game in extra innings. In the 11th, **Cade Harris** and **Ben Hollas** singled with two down to set up the game-winning hit for Flansburg: a 7-6 final. It marked the first series win for Oklahoma over Baylor since a 2012 sweep at home.

Up Next...

The Sooners head out on the road for a midweek contest against former Big 12 foe Missouri on Tuesday, May 17. Oklahoma then finishes the regular season in a non-conference series at Austin Peay beginning Thursday, May 19.

Pair of Jacks...

Sheldon Neuse and **Domenic DeRenzo** each went yard twice in the Sooners' 9-8 loss at Kansas (4/30). They became the first OU teammates to hit a pair of home runs in a game since **Casey Johnson**, **Jamie Johnson** and **J.T. Wise** all hit two each at Kansas State (3/22/09). Oklahoma totaled a program-record 11 home runs in a 29-4 win over the Wildcats in that game.

Double Down on Steele...

Freshman center fielder **Steele Walker** has been in the OU lineup for 45 of 48 games this season and leads the Sooners with 14 doubles with 10 in the last 18 games. His 14 doubles are sixth most by a freshman on record (1993-present) after passing **Max White** (2010) and **Tommy Whiteman** (1999) on Sunday. In 2014, **Sheldon Neuse** doubled 17 times, which ranks second by a Sooner freshman. **Matt Bose** (2002) owns the record at 18.

Cool Ranch Andritsos...

Freshman **Chris Andritsos** has emerged as Oklahoma's Friday night starter and one of the top two-way players in the Big 12. On the mound, he is 4-5 with a team-leading 3.86 ERA and Big 12-leading 1.03 WHIP. In limited action at the plate as the OU designated hitter or first baseman, Andritsos is hitting .255 (12-for-47) with five runs scored and six driven in. Against West Virginia (4/22), he had a no-hitter through six and went on to strike out eight in 7.2 shutout innings in an eventual, 1-0 win. Andritsos then beat the Mountaineers (4/23) with his bat in game two as he went 3-for-5 and drove in the game-tying and go-ahead runs in the eighth inning.

Home Field Notes...

Oklahoma finished its home slate by winning all four Big 12 series at L. Dale Mitchell Park. The Sooners posted a .640 win percentage with a 16-9 record: the best since 2013 (.806). OU averaged 1,211 in home attendance: marking a rise in each of the past three seasons and the highest since 2012 (1,283).

Young Arms...

Sooner freshmen pitchers have combined for 15 of the team's 24 wins: the second highest total in the Big 12. Collectively, OU freshmen have posted a 3.81 ERA, 7.10 K/9 average and 1.82 K-to-BB ratio. **Chris Andritsos**, **Austin Hansen** and **Jake Irvin**, who has struck out a class-leading 41, have each won four games.

April Brings Spring to Wise's Bat...

In the month of April, senior Alex Wise hit .396 (24-for-65). After dropping to a .253 batting average on March 26, Wise busted out of a slump with a 2-for-4, two-double game at Little Rock (3/29) and has lifted his average to .308. Since that game, he has hit successfully in 20 of 23 games with nine multi-hit games and seven doubles.

Keepin' it 100...

Entering the week, **Sheldon Neuse** ranked in the top-100 of six offensive statistical categories. He peaks in the national rankings at 16th in slugging percentage (.694). **Chris Andritsos** ranks highest among OU pitchers with a 1.03 WHIP that is 63rd in the NCAA and first in the Big 12. As a team, Oklahoma ranks 15th with a .978 fielding percentage, which is tops in the Big 12. The Sooners are also 18th in the country with 46 double plays turned.

Wrist Injury Slows Sooner Senior...

Senior left fielder **Hunter Haley** finds himself on the shelf with a fractured wrist. A career .448 (13-for-29) hitter against Kansas, Haley was injured in last weekend's opener against West Virginia on a high-throw, swipe-tag play at first. For his career, Haley has registered 99 runs driven in and 98 scored, leaving him just shy of becoming the 41st player in program history to record 100 in each category throughout his Sooner career.

#YardWork...

Oklahoma matched its highest home run total of the BBCOR era with 41 this season: having last done so in 2011. The Sooners hit a season-high four in a 7-6 win over Baylor (4/10). It was the most since OU went yard four times against Purdue (3/8/15). **Sheldon Neuse** is OU's active career leader with 23, which is second among active Big 12 players, followed by **Hunter Haley** at 16.

Triple Nation...

Oklahoma ranks second in the Big 12 and 47th in the NCAA with 15 triples. **Sheldon Neuse** is the team leader at five. He is first in Big 12 and 24th in the country. He recorded the 15th of his career against Baylor (4/9). Neuse has the fifth most career triples among active players in the NCAA and is now tied for fourth all-time at OU with **Bill Severns** (1972-75) and **Baine Brooks** (1986-87). His 15 are the most at OU in the Big 12 era.

Five-Down to Six-Up...

Oklahoma overcame a five-run deficit to win in a 12-6 decision over West Virginia on Saturday. It marked the first come-from-behind win of five runs or more since defeating BYU (2/28/15) in Las Vegas. The Sooners trailed 6-1 and chipped away with a three-run sixth and pulled within one on a home run by freshman catcher **Domenic DeRenzo**. Oklahoma then turned the game upside down with a seven-run inning in the eighth to clinch the series.

National Player of the Week...

For his efforts in the series win over Baylor, senior left fielder **Hunter Haley** was named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball News* on April 11. He hit .429 (6-for-14) in a 3-1 week for the Sooners and totaled eight RBI and three home runs; all of which came at the expense of the Bears. An OU player has earned the honor in each of the last three seasons as Haley joins former teammates **Kolbey Carpenter** (2/23/15) and **Mac James** (3/10/14).

Making Noise at the Plate and on the Mound...

In a walk-off win over Texas (4/3), junior **Sheldon Neuse** made an impact at the plate and on the mound. As the starting shortstop, he gave Oklahoma its first lead of the day in the bottom of the first inning with a towering home run off the scoreboard in left-center. Neuse later moved to the mound with two runners on and only one out in the top of the eighth. He stranded both before pitching a 1-2-3 top of the ninth. After retiring all five batters faced, including a pair of strikeouts, Neuse was credited with the win. He became the first player at OU to homer and earn the win on the mound since **Jacob Evans** did so with a walk-off home run against Kansas (4/2/15).

Fresh Faces...

Coach Hughes started a season-high six freshmen in the lineup against Wichita State (3/8), including RHP **Kyle Tyler** making his first career start. Oklahoma matched that total against Oral Roberts (5/3) with RHP Dylan Grove making his first career start. The Sooners have started three or more freshmen in 35 of 48 games this season.

Shave for the Brave...

On April 7, the Sooners shaved their heads to fight childhood cancer at their third annual "Shave for the Brave". Donations benefited the Vs. Cancer Foundation and OU Children's Hospital. In the three seasons, OU baseball has raised more than \$80,000 and in 2015 ranked first among 63 participating teams. The game following Shave for the Brave was be the team's seventh annual "Go Mitch Go" game against Baylor. **Mitchell Whitaker** was a friend of the program that passed in 2007 from Leukemia. The Sooners award one player each year in his honor. **Austin O'Brien** earned the award in 2016.

Powering Past the Patriots...

The Sooners snapped an eight-game losing streak in the all-time series against non-conference opponent Dallas Baptist last Tuesday. Oklahoma's offense exploded for five runs in the first and six in the third en route to a 12-2 win at home. It marked the first win for the Sooners over the Patriots since April 27, 2010. **Sheldon Neuse** went 2-for-4 with a home run and freshman center fielder **Steele Walker** added a three-hit night. Freshman right-hander **Jake Irvin** struck out five, worked out of a bases loaded jam in the first and lasted five innings to earn his first career win.

Sooners Turn Down Horns...

Oklahoma won back-to-back series over Texas for the first time in program history and has now won three of four. The Sooners recorded their first home win over Texas (4/1) since April 5, 2008. Freshman RHP **Chris Andritsos** struck out five in 7.2 innings of one run ball. OU went deep three times, including a three-run shot from junior **Jack Flansburg** in a 6-1 victory. Oklahoma bounced back from a Saturday defeat to walk off the Longhorns on Sunday, 4-3. Flansburg tied the game in the sixth with a two-run single. In the ninth, the Sooners loaded the bases with one out. Junior **Ben Hollas** delivered the game-winning hit: a line drive single to right. The win marked the first home series win for Oklahoma over Texas since 1998: when OU swept UT. Senior outfielder **Hunter Haley** is the only player in program history to have played in three series wins over the Longhorns.

Iron Man Streak Ended...

At Fresno State (3/15), head coach **Pete Hughes** wrote out his lineup card without **Sheldon Neuse** on it for the first time since the two arrived at OU together for the 2014 season. Neuse had a stretch of 135 consecutive games started snapped. It is the longest streak on record at Oklahoma (2003-present). The previous record was held by **Jack Mayfield** at 120 (5/7/12-6/8/13). Neuse's former teammate, **Craig Aikin** was left out of the lineup just once in his career and had separate 91-game streak to start and end his career.

The Big Inning...

The Sooners have scored more than two runs in an inning 36 times this season, including a season-high eight in the third at Wichita State (4/12). Oklahoma had previously scored six runs in an inning three times: vs. Dallas Baptist (4/5), at CSU Bakersfield (3/19) and vs. Northeastern (2/21). In its comeback win over Long Beach State (3/13), Oklahoma brought in four runs in the ninth. OU pitchers have limited the opposition to scoring more than twice in an inning 23 times. The Sooners have allowed three runs or more in the first or second inning eight times this season.

Oh man, oh man, oh man, not again...

Sheldon Neuse smashed his second home run of the season vs. Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium and followed with a home run against Wichita State (3/8). He later homered against Texas (4/3) and Dallas Baptist (4/5) in back-to-back games. Neuse homered in back-to-back games for a third time at Kansas (4/30-5/1). He has homered in back-to-back games five times in his career. Neuse did so twice in 2015 against BYU (2/28) and Little Rock (3/3) and later against Purdue (3/7-8). His 22 career home runs are the most among active Sooners and are the most at OU since the introduction of the BBCOR bats in 2011: passing **Matt Oberste's** (2012-13) 17.

Oklahoma is Home...

The Sooner roster features 11 players from within the state's borders and 11 from Texas. This season marks the most Oklahoma born players at OU since 12 in 2012 and the first time with as many or more players from Oklahoma than Texas since 2006. In 2006, 13 Sooner players called Oklahoma home, while just five were from Texas.

Turf and Turf...

Through nine games, Oklahoma had played every game on a synthetic turf field. The Sooners are 8-5 at home on L. Dale Mitchell Park's new AstroTurf® surface. The first road trip of the season saw OU play on Sam Houston State's newly resurfaced Don Sander Stadium. The Sooners played their first game on natural grass this season last at USC and are 5-6-1 on natural surfaces and 19-17 on turf.

CONFERENCE NOTES

❖ Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas Tech enter the week ranked in the top 15 on three national lists. The Red Raiders check in as high as No. 5, the Frogs at No. 8 and the Cowboys at No. 15. It's the highest ranking on the year for OSU and TTU, while the Frogs have sat in the top 10 since February 29.

❖ The Big 12 is one of three conferences nationally with three or more teams ranked in the top 15. The trio is also ranked in the RPI top 30 entering the week - 11. Texas Tech, 19. TCU and 27. Oklahoma State - making the Big 12 one of three conferences with three-plus teams in the top 30 (ACC, SEC).

❖ Despite a bye weekend ahead, Texas Tech, which can't finish with more than seven conference losses, can clinch the regular season title this weekend based on the following circumstances:

- With one TCU loss AND two OSU losses, Tech wins the title outright.
- With one OSU loss, Tech wins a share of the title.
- Should OSU or TCU finish this weekend at seven conference losses or less, the title could be shared based on next weekend's outcomes.

❖ The Big 12 is the only "Power Five" conference in which a different league team has won the regular season each of the past five seasons. The Conference can boast the same feat in its postseason championship as the event has produced a different winner each of the past five years, which can not be said for the league's peer conferences.

❖ This weekend's three conference series feature a slate of "rivalry" matchups headlined by Bedlam. Additionally, Baylor hosts TCU and Kansas travels to Kansas State.

❖ Oklahoma State and Texas Tech both own 10-2 conference records away from home, marking just the third time in Big 12 history that multiple teams have had double-digit win totals on the road in conference play. It was done by the same two teams in 1997 and also by Missouri and Texas in 2007.

❖ West Virginia's Jackson Cramer became the fifth player in conference history to win the Big 12 Player of the Week three or more times in the same season. Cramer is also the seventh player to win the award in back-to-back weeks (last done in 2013).

❖ OSU's Thomas Hatch has thrown three consecutive complete game shutouts and has not allowed an earned run in 35.1 consecutive innings. Co-winner of this week's Pitcher of the Week, Hatch brings the OSU haul for the award up to seven, which is a conference single-season record.

❖ Half of the league's ERA leaders (5 of 10) are underclassmen, including four freshman.
