- Sunday's game will be Clemson's first against a school from the state of Oklahoma since a 65-59 win over Tulsa in the 1997 NCAA Tournament.
- Through three games, Clemson is averaging 82 points per game and boasts six double-figure scorers.
- Donte Grantham is coming off a season-high 21 points against Xavier. It was the third-highest scoring output of his career.

TIGER TRACKS

- Clemson ranks among the ACC leaders in fewest turnovers per game, and assist-to-turnover ratio. The Tigers have committed just 28 miscues in three games, with single digits against Georgia and Davidson.
- The Tigers are 18th nationally in offensive efficiency (points scored per 100 possessions) by KenPom, while the Sooners are 21st in defensive efficiency.
- Clemson's five starters have all reached double figures in consecutive games.
- Despite playing with a thin bench early in the season, six players on the Clemson roster are averaging double figures.
- Gabe DeVoe has scored double figures in three straight games for the first time in his career. He leads the Tigers in scoring at 15.7 points per game.
- Jaron Blossomgame and Sidy Djitte both will make their 99th career appearance in a Clemson uniform Sunday against Oklahoma.
- Avry Holmes is 38 points shy of reaching 1,000 for his career. He scored 607 points in two seasons at San Francisco before transferring to Clemson.
- Marcquise Reed has made first 15 free throw attempts of his Tiger career.

HEAD COACH BRAD BROWNELL

- Named the 21st men's basketball head coach in Clemson history on April 13, 2010.
- Is coaching his 15th season in Division I, having previously coached four years each at UNC Wilmington and Wright State before coming to Clemson.
- Set Clemson records for total wins (22) and ACC wins (9) by a first-year head coach in 2010-11
- Led Clemson to first NCAA Tournament win in 14 years when the Tigers topped UAB in the first round in 2011.
- Has taken three different schools to the NCAA Tournament.
- Took the Tigers to the 2014 NIT semifinals.
- Winningest coach in history on a percentage basis against ACC competition, and needs just eight wins to pass Cliff Ellis for the career record (59) at Clemson.
- Coached K.J. McDaniels (2014) and Jaron Blossomgame (2016) to first-team All-ACC honors. McDaniels was ACC Defensive Player of the Year, while Blossomgame won the ACC's Most Improved Award.
- Named Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2006. He coached CAA Player of the Year Brett Blizzard in 2002-03, his first season.
- Took over Wright State in 2006-07 and guided the school to a record 23 wins in his first season and an NCAA Tournament bid.
- Played Division III ball at DePauw University in Greencastle, Ind.
- He and his wife, Paula, have two daughters, Abby (18), a freshman at Clemson, and Kate (16)

LITTLEJOHN COLISEUM BACK IN BUSINESS

- Clemson held a ribbon-cutting for the newly renovated Littlejohn Coliseum on Friday, October 14.
- The opener against Georgia on Nov. 11 served as the 'grand reopening' of the facility, complete with all the bells and whistles.
- The \$63.5 million project was completed after 16 months of renovation, which began almost immediately after the 2014-15 season.
- Renovation features include:
- -Newly configured seating bowl, with court rotating 90 degrees from its prior layout
- -Swann Pavilion, a newly designed operations complex and practice facility connected to the arena
- -Burton Gallery, a new 10,000 square foot main entrance space
- -Expanded portals, allowing for a more accessible in-game atmosphere from the concourse level
- -Nation's largest centerhung curved videoboard, as well as ribbon boards atop each portal in the seating bowl
- -Coliseum club & courtside club premium seating areas
- -Coaches offices overlooking the practice gym
- -Expansive space for staff conferences
- -Locker room for players, coaches and staff
- -Team film and meeting room
- -Players lounge
- -Recruiting lounge
- -Weight room connecting the players lounge to the practice gym
- -Athletic training room

TIGERS COMPLETE 'EARN YOUR ORANGE' CHALLENGE

- Brad Brownell took his team through a five-week series in the preseason entitled 'Earn Your Orange,' where players were given a weekly challenge that included mile runs, campus runs, hill runs, football field lengths, learning the alma mater, and a community service project with ClemsonLIFE.
- Clemson also practiced five sessions with the women's rowing staff, learning how to compete together as a team on Lake Hartwell.

GAME NOTES & MISCELLANEOUS STATS

CLEMSON. OKLAHOMA MEET FOR THE FIRST TIME

- The Tigers and Sooners meet Sunday for the first time in men's basketball. Clemson is 11-8 all-time against teams currently in the Big 12 Conference.
- Clemson has played the other three Division I teams from the state of Oklahoma previously, but never the Sooners. The Tigers are 1-0 in history against Oklahoma State, 1-0 against Oral Roberts, and 1-1 versus Tulsa.

OKLAHOMA SCOUTING REPORT

- One game after facing 2016 NCAA Tournament two-seed Xavier, Clemson will turn around and meet one-seed Oklahoma. The Sooners dropped their second round matchup to Northern Iowa in overtime, 73-67.
- Oklahoma, coached by veteran Lon Kruger, enters Sunday's game with a 2-1 record just like Clemson.
- The Sooners are paced by senior point guard Jordan Woodard, who leads OU with 17.0 points and 4.0 assists per game.
- OU's three-point success from a year ago has seemed to follow in 2016-17, as the Sooners enter Sunday's contest converting 44 percent from behind the arc.

TIGERS SCORE 95 POINTS IN WIN OVER DAVIDSON

- Clemson put together the best offensive output in the Brad Brownell era (196 games) when it scored 95 against Davidson in the opening round of the Tire Pros Invitational.
- The previous high by a Brownell coached Clemson team was 92 against The Citadel on Jan. 1, 2013.
- It was the highest point total by a Tiger team since December 2009 when Oliver Purnell's final team scored 102 against Winthrop.

PROTECTING THE BASKETBALL

- One of Clemson's strengths a season ago has picked up right where it left off to begin the 2016-17 season.
- The Tigers are committing just 9.3 turnovers per game and are second among ACC teams in turnover margin (+6.7). Clemson committed just eight turnovers in each of its first two games.

• Last season, Clemson committed the fewest turnovers per game in a single season in program history.

CLEMSON OPENS LITTLEJOHN COLISEUM WITH WIN OVER GEORGIA

- The Tigers long anticipated a return to their home arena, which finished a 16-month renovation in October 2016.
- Clemson did not disappoint in its return before a capacity crowd. The Tigers beat nearby rival Georgia, avenging a 23-point loss the year before with a 74-64 win to open the season November 11.
- The win was the program's first over a team currently in a "Power 5" conference to open the season since 1996-97, when Rick Barnes' club shocked the college basketball world by beating defending national champion Kentucky in Indianapolis, Ind.

SPECIAL SEASONS HAVE ENDED IN THE YEAR '7'

- In one of the oddest coincidences in Clemson men's basketball history, some of the program's best seasons end in the number seven.
- Dating 50 years to the 1966-67 season, Clemson has a combined record of 112-41 (.732) ever since (1976-77, 86-87, 96-97, 06-07).
- Clemson also won 60 percent of its ACC games during those five seasons, compared to the program's career 36 percent standard.

BROWNELL CLEMSON'S WINNINGEST COACH VS. ACC COMPETITION

- Head coach Brad Brownell opens his seventh season with the Tigers on Friday. He carries a career record of 274-172 overall, 107-87 at Clemson.
- Brownell is Clemson's career winning percentage leader against ACC competition, and has led the Tigers to 10 regular-season wins in two of the past three seasons.
- Brownell owns 52 career wins over ACC teams, second-most in school history behind Cliff Ellis (58). He needs seven to move atop the recordbooks.

TOP THREE SCORERS RETURN

• For the first time since 1996-97, Clemson returns its top three scorers from the previous season.

- Two members of the Tiger team will begin play in their final seasons with an undergraduate Clemson degree already in hand, Jaron Blossomgame and Riley McGillan.
- $\bullet\,$ The two roomates both graduated this year, McGillan with a marketing degree in May and Blossomgame with a sociology degree in August.
- A third, Avry Holmes, is on track to join them in December.

DEVOE EXCELLING IN STARTING ROLE

• Junior guard Gabe DeVoe made the most of his 51st appearance in a Clemson uniform on November 11.

- DeVoe started for the first time in his career in the season opener against Georgia and responded with a big outing, posting 12 of his 15 points in the first half as Clemson built a comfortable cushion.
- DeVoe wasted no time in following up that solid performance, scoring 16 in a career-high 34 minutes against Davidson.
- In three starts, DeVoe leads the team at 15.7 points per game and is shooting 44 percent from three-point distance.

DJITTE EMBRACING NEW ROLE

- Senior center Sidy Djitte has waited patiently to become the starter for the Tigers, spending three years as a backup to Landry Nnoko.
- Djitte has thrived in the new role, averaging 10.3 points and 7.3 rebounds per game.
- He is the team's leader in field goal percentage (.688), and leads the Tigers in rebounds per game and offensive rebounds (11).

GRANTHAM REACHES CENTURY MARK FOR CAREER THREES

- Clemson's best three-point marksman each of the past two seasons has been 6-8 wing Donte Grantham, now a junior for the Tigers.
- Grantham led the Tigers in three-point makes in 2014-15 as a freshman, and again last season when he buried 56 from behind the arc. His three-point total last season was an individual high since Andre Young made 66 as a senior in 2011-12.
- A starter in all 65 games of his career, Grantham reached his 100th three-pointer on his first make against Xavier in the Tire Pros Invitational.

HOLMES CHASING 1,000 CAREER POINTS

- Senior guard Avry Holmes is closing in on the 1,000-point plateau. He needs just 38 total points, coming off a 12-point outing against Xavier.
- Holmes scored 607 points his first two seasons for the University of San Francisco, and added 311 in his first year of eligibility at Clemson.
- He will join Jaron Blossomgame as 1,000-point scorers on Clemson's roster when he achieves the feat.

MITCHELL UNDERGOES SURGERY, OUT INDEFINITELY

- Sophomore point guard Shelton Mitchell, one of Clemson's most anticipated newcomers, sustained a knee injury in practice on Monday, November 7.
- Mitchell underwent a minor procedure the following day to clean up the affected area, and is day to day.

REED IMPRESSIVE IN CLEMSON DEBUT

- Marcquise Reed, former Robert Morris standout and 2015 Northeast Conference Rookie of the Year after scoring 15.1 points per game for the Colonials, did not disappoint in his Clemson debut.
- Reed scored a team-high 19 points, hitting five of 11 field goal attempts and all six of his free throws. He was 3-6 behind the three-point arc.
- Reed's point total was the highest by any Clemson player in a debut since Elden Campbell also scored 19, as a freshman in 1986-87.
- No Clemson player has scored at least 20 points in his debut since Larry Middleton in 1985-86.

FOUR SIGNEES ADDED FROM CLASS OF 2017

- Clemson enjoyed a fruitful early signing period, adding A.J. Oliver, Aamir Simms, Clyde Trapp Jr. and Malik William from the class of 2017.
- Oliver is a four-star guard whose mother, Audra Smith, is the head women's basketball coach at Clemson.
- Simms is a top-100 prospect by Rivals and is a former teammate of Scott Spencer, now a freshman at Clemson, at the Blue Ridge School in Virginia.
- Trapp played AAU basketball for former Clemson guard Edward Scott, an All-ACC selection in 2003 and ACC Legend choice in 2017.
- William played at First Academy in Orlando, Fla., averaging a double-double in his first season with the school.
