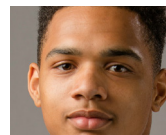

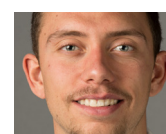

NORTHERN COLORADO FALLS DOWN THE STRETCH TO BUCKNELL

LAS VEGAS, Nev. — Northern Colorado (2-4, 0-0 Big Sky) held a lead midway through the second half, but a late surge by Bucknell (5-2, 0-0 Patriot) sent the Bears home from the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational with a 75-63 loss.

How It Happened:

It was an even opening act as the game saw five ties and three lead changes with the largest difference of the half being just six points.

The Bears opened the game with paint-points from redshirt sophomore forward, Ibrahim Sylla, for its first lead of the half.

Bucknell responded with a 12-4 run to take a 12-6 advantage just four minutes in to the contest.

UNC adventured on a 6-0 run of its own to tie up the game at 12 apiece, and used the next five minutes to build a 25-20 upper hand over the Bison at the 8:03 mark in the half.

From there, Bucknell and UNC tied the game up two more times, before a vital six-point swing from the Bison gave them the lead at halftime.

A foul on sophomore guard, Jordan Davis and then a technical foul on the UNC bench put Bucknell at the line for four free throw attempts, which they made three. Cue a three-ball from BU's Matt O'Reilly and in the matter of 90 seconds, the Bears found themselves behind by six.

Davis ended the half with back-to-back buckets, chipping the Bucknell lead down to four, 39-35.

Despite trailing, Northern Colorado outshot the Bison. The Bears were a solid 62.5% (15-of-24) from the floor, while Bucknell finished 50% (13-of-26) in the first half.

Davis picked up right where he left off at the end of the first half and scored 10 of UNC's first 15 points of the second half, giving the Bears a 50-47 lead with 14:04 remaining in the game.

A pair of free throws by junior guard, DJ Miles and five more points



from Davis gave Northern Colorado its largest command of the game at 57-51 over the Bison with a little over 10 minutes to go.

Unfortunately, the Bears shooting began to cool down, opening the door for Bucknell. The Bison went on a quick 8-0 run and suddenly the guys from Greeley found themselves down by two, 59-57 just two minutes later.

Northern Colorado remained within one possession of Bucknell, until the Bison knocked down their only two three-pointers of the half to push the Bears' deficit to 71-63 with 2:11 left to play, closing the door on any sort of comeback bid by UNC.

In the final 10:23 of the game, Bucknell outscored UNC 24-6, including a 16-4 run over the last six minutes.

Davis etched a new career-high in the loss, finishing with 28 points on 12-of-20 (60.0%) shooting. He also hauled in a team-best six rebounds.

Miles was the only other Bear in double figures, for the second time in as many games. The junior ended with 15 points, with nine of those coming from beyond the arc.

Zach Thomas led the way for the Bison, producing a team-high 22 points and seven rebounds.

- ▶ After shooting 62.5% from the floor in the first half, UNC shot just 37.0% in the second half, including going 2-of-13 (15.4%) from three-point range.

NEW ERA

- ▶ Jeff Linder was named the 19th head coach of the program on May 1, 2016. Linder came to UNC after six seasons at Boise State.
- ▶ Linder was an assistant coach during his first three years with the Broncos, but was elevated to associate head coach for the final three.
- ▶ He helped guide Boise State to two NCAA tournament appearances and the team's first Mountain West Conference Championship during his tenure.
- ▶ Renowned for his offensive game plans, Boise State saw immediate production with Linder on the bench. The Broncos led the conference in scoring in three of his six seasons and finished second in 2014-15. Boise State averaged 76.2 points per game in 2013-14, the second-highest season average the Broncos in nearly 40 years.
- ▶ In 2014-15, his second season as Associate Head Coach, the Broncos tied the school record for wins, going 25-9, including a 14-1 record in the team's final 15 regular season games. Boise State won 20-or-more games in five of Linder's six seasons.

WHO ARE YOU

- ▶ Northern Colorado added seven to members to its program in the offseason, five guards and two forwards.
- ▶ The Bears added three transfers in Andre Spight, DJ Miles and Gerad Davis, along with four freshman in Kai Edwards, Mike Ranson, Kyle Carey and Roberto Vercellino.
- ▶ It's the second time in two seasons that UNC has added at least five or more new members to the program.

SCOUTING OKLAHOMA

- Oklahoma, a 2015-16 NCAA Final Four team, has started the season off with a 4-1 record after besting Abilene Christian 72-54 last Friday.
- The Sooners have three players averaging double figures on the season, led by Jordan Woodward. Woodward is putting up 17.6 points per game and also leads the team in assists, averaging 4.2. Khadeem Lattin (11.8 ppg) and Christian James (10.8 ppg) are the other two OU players in double figures for the year.
- Oklahoma has won 124 of its last 129 non-conference games at home, including 58 of its last 60. The Sooners are 59-14 against non-conference opponents under Lon Kruger, including 32-2 at home
- The Sooners welcome in seven newcomers to the program this season, including junior college transfer Darrion Strong from Coffeyville Community College in Kansas. He'll be joined by the incoming class of freshmen Kristian Doolittle, Kameron McGusty and Jordan Shepherd. Freshman Matt Freeman joined the Sooners midway through the 2015-16 season as a redshirt after finishing high school in his home country of New Zealand, and will be eligible to play in 2016-17. Walk-on freshmen Richard Anderson, Grant Quinn and Marshall Thorpe round out the group of newcomers. Media outlets such as ESPN, USA Today and 247 Sports have regarded OU's incoming freshman class as a top-30 recruiting class nationally
- For the first time since 2013, the Sooners opened the season unranked in both the AP and Coaches preseason polls. Oklahoma was also voted sixth in the Big 12 Conference's preseason poll – it's lowest preseason projection since 2012.

DAVIS DELIGHT

- Sophomore guard, Jordan Davis is putting up Russell Westbrook type numbers to begin the season.
- Davis is currently averaging 24.0 ppg, 5.8 rebounds and 5.3 assists. His points per game rank him first in the Big Sky and 7th in all of the NCAA. His 5.3 assists per game also is a conference best.
- The sophomore is coming off a career-high 28 points in the loss to Bucknell in the championship round of the Mid-Major bracket at the Las Vegas Invitational. The game prior against Sacred Heart, Davis produced his first career double-double with 25 points and 12 boards.
- Davis currently is riding a six-game streak of scoring 20+ points.

MILES FOR THREE

- After missing a month due to a concussion, junior transfer, DJ Miles is back in full form and it showed over Thanksgiving Weekend.
- Miles, a JUCO All-American from Otero JC, posted back-to-back double-digit games against Sacred Heart and Bucknell.
- The junior lit it up from beyond the arc against Sacred Heart, scoring a career-high 17 points, while shooting 5-of-7 on 3FGs. He followed that up with a 16-point performance in the loss to Bucknell, going 5-of-12 from the field and 3-of-8 from downtown.
- He earned his first-career start against Bucknell, in place of an injured Chaz Glotta, who suffered an ankle injury in the Sacred Heart game.

HE'LL BE BACK

- Junior college transfer, Gerad Davis will miss some playing time in the month of November with a leg injury.
- Davis is expected to return in 3-4 weeks, and could return as early Nov. 29 when the team heads to Oklahoma to play the Sooners.

WINDEX BEARS

- Jeff Linder has his team cleaning up the glass in the early goings of the season. The Bears are currently averaging 36.0 rebounds a game, with a +2.3 rebounding margin. UNC has limited its opponents to 33.7 rebounds a game, ranking the team second in the Big Sky in defensive rebounding.
- The Bears are 3-3 thus far on the year in winning the rebound battle, including out boarding No. 8 Arizona.

BANK OF COLORADO ARENA

THE BEARS ARE 320-204 IN 41 SEASONS AT 'THE BANK' ■ UNC IS 89-37 SINCE 2007

Located on Northern Colorado's west campus, Bank of Colorado Arena serves as "The Home of the Bears."

Newly named Bank of Colorado Arena first opened as "Butler-Hancock Hall" on Feb. 4, 1975, with a women's and men's basketball doubleheader. The Northern Colorado women played Wyoming, while the men played host to Air Force.

The building's name was changed to "Bank of Colorado Arena" Nov. 14, 2014 this school year and remains home for Northern Colorado's men's and women's basketball programs, as well as its volleyball and wrestling teams.

The building has undergone impressive renovations during the last decade, including in 2006 and 2014, when, as part of a \$19 million dollar student-fee referendum, the Arena received a much needed makeover. New chairback seats were installed throughout, a new sound system and message and scoreboard center were added, as were renovated restrooms, an onsite ticket center improved entry points, two new Daktronics video boards, air conditioning, a new flooring system, and sports lighting.

BOCA's official seating capacity used to be 4,500 but the renovations in 2006-07 brought that down to 3,018, creating a much more intimate feeling for spectators.

Northern Colorado Men's Basketball has experienced a pretty sizeable homecourt advantage inside Bank of Colorado's brick walls and are well over .500 (chart at left) at home since it opened in 1975.

That home winning tradition has continued since 2007, when the Bears began playing at the NCAA Division I level, too. After struggling in its inaugural season at Division I, Northern Colorado has compiled a winning record at home every season but once since 2007 including 2010-11 when the Bears finished 14-0 for just the third undefeated home season in school history.

Northern Colorado entered the 2015-16 season with a 313-194 record inside BOCA and were 82-28 since 2007, before the year started.

The biggest "names" to play in Bank of Colorado Arena in the last decade include Oregon State (2006), San Diego State (2008) and New Mexico State (2011).

Bank of Colorado Arena has been the site of numerous memorable events in its history, including the 2011 Big Sky Conference Men's Basketball Championship, which was won by the Bears and broadcast nationally on Altitude (semi national) and ESPN2 (national). BOCA has also hosted NCAA regional volleyball tournaments in 1981, 1989, 1990 and 2002, a regional men's basketball tournament in 1989 and a regional women's basketball game in 1995.

Bank of Colorado Arena was also the site of the 1992, 1996 and 2001 NCAA Division II National Wrestling Championships, and in summer 2002, the Arena hosted a men's Olympic volleyball exhibition match between the United States and Korean national teams.

Jeff Linder became the 19th head coach of the Northern Colorado men's basketball program on May 1, 2016.

Linder comes to UNC after six seasons at Boise State with the last three years as the Associate Head Coach of the Broncos and brings over 15 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Bears.

Linder is also no stranger to the Big Sky Conference or the state of Colorado. He served under Randy Rahe's staff at Weber State and played his high school basketball at Centaurus HS in Lafayette, Colorado, going on to play one season at Mesa State. After his freshman year, Linder transferred to Western Colorado State where he played three seasons under coach Bob Hofman. As a Mountaineer, Linder earned All-Rocky Mountain Conference honors, both on the court and in the classroom, three times.

Linder helped guide Boise State to two NCAA tournament appearances and the team's first Mountain West Conference Championship during his tenure.

In 2014-15, his second season as Associate Head Coach, the Broncos tied the school record for wins, going 25-9, including a 14-1 record in the team's final 15 regular season games. Boise State won 20-or-more games in five of Linder's six seasons.

Renowned for his offensive game plans, Boise State saw immediate production with Linder on the bench. The Broncos led the conference in scoring in three of his six seasons and finished second in 2014-15. Boise State averaged 76.2 points per game in 2013-14, the second-highest season average the Broncos in nearly 40 years.

In his first year with at Boise State, Linder helped head coach Leon Rice steer the Broncos to one of its most successful seasons in school history, one that culminated in an appearance in the conference tournament championship game and just the fourth postseason appearance in the last 17 years.

Prior to Boise State, Linder served as an assistant and associate head coach at the University of San Francisco.

In 2009-10 at USF, the Dons posted a 12-18 record, including a 9-4 record at home. San Francisco was able to record a memorable highlight on Jan. 30, as the Dons knocked off No. 8 Gonzaga in an 81-77 overtime thriller, which snapped the Bulldogs' West Coast Conference regular-season winning streak of 27 games. During his stint at Weber State, Linder helped the Wildcats to a 36-26 overall record, and in 2006-07 the Wildcats won the Big Sky Conference regular season and tournament titles and earned

a trip to the NCAA Tournament. Linder also recruited Damian Lillard to Weber State, who was selected sixth-overall by the Portland Trail Blazers in the 2012 NBA Draft.

Linder got his start in collegiate coaching as the assistant director of men's basketball operations at Colorado under head coach Ricardo Patton. After one season at CU, Linder was hired as an assistant coach on David Moe's staff at Emporia State, where he spent three seasons. Emporia State went 22-5 during his final campaign and earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Division II Tournament.

Linder moved from Emporia State to Midland Junior College in Midland, Texas, where he spent two seasons as an assistant coach to Grant McCasland. Linder helped coach Midland to a 53-16 record during his tenure, and in 2005-06 the team finished 26-10 and made an appearance in the "Elite Eight" at the national junior college tournament.

Linder and his wife, Kelli, have four children, two daughters, Adison and Makalyn, and two sons, Jordan and Devon.

@UNCO_MBB TAKES CARE OF BUSINESS AGAINST JWU

GREELEY, Colo. — Northern Colorado men's basketball shook off the year long rust in an exhibition game against Johnson & Wales (Colo.) on Wednesday night. As expected, the Bears took care of business with a 91-67 win over the Wildcats.

How It Happened:

It took UNC some time to get adjusted offensively and played back and forth with the Wildcats for the first five minutes of the game.

Once the nerves of the new season were gone, the Bears played ball, particularly behind the shot of sophomore guard, Jordan Davis. Davis put up 15 points on 5-of-8 shooting in the first half.

After two straight trips to the free throw line, Johnson and Wales cut to within two of UNC, 15-13 at the 9:05 mark. From there, the home team used an 18-3 run, with Davis accounting for 10 of those 18 points to gather some breathing room.

Once the Bears got comfortable running first year head coach, Jeff Linder's offense, they worked like a well oiled machine and were especially good in transition, recording 15 fast break points in the first half alone and took a 40-22 lead into the break.

Though they didn't shoot particularly well from beyond the arc (18.8%), they didn't need to, getting 14 of their 40 points down low in the paint.

The beginning of the second half was more of the same. UNC shared the rock, dishing out 15 of its 21 assists and pushed the lead to over 30 points (63-31) with 13:45 to play.

Coach Linder used the remaining minutes to give much needed playing time to the younger players, such as, Kai Edwards, Mike Ranson and Roberto Vercellino. Vercellino made the minutes count, finishing with a double-double of 10 points and 13 rebounds.

JWU crawled back into the game some, cutting the UNC lead from 31 to 15 (79-62) over a 10-minute stretch, but that is as close as it came for the Wildcats for the remainder of the contest.

After it was all said and done, the Bears shot 40.6% (26-of-64) from the field and 25.0% (8-of-25) from three-point land.

@UNCO_MBB DROPS SEASON OPENER AT BUTLER

Indianapolis, Ind. — Northern Colorado (0-1, 0-0 Big Sky) opened up the season on the road at Butler (1-0, 0-0 Big East) on Saturday night. The Bears hung with the Bulldogs throughout the first half, but were outscored 48-21 in the second half en route to an 89-52 loss.

How It Happened:

Butler, who earned the No. 9 seed in the 2015 NCAA Tournament, is just one of three 2015 tournament teams UNC will see in the month of November.

The Bears hung toe-to-toe with the Bulldogs in the first half, as the Butler lead never eclipsed more than 13 points.

A three-ball from freshman guard, Kyle Carey cut the UNC deficit to just one (16-15) with 12:23 remaining in the half, before two quick buckets from Butler pushed it back to six.

The Bears leaned heavily on sophomore guard, Jordan Davis for production in the first act and he didn't disappoint, scoring 20 of his game-high 25 points.

Davis was the only player for Northern Colorado to finish in double figures on the night.

The largest lead of the half came during a UNC dry spell. From 6:22 to 3:07, the Bears had trouble finding the hoop. Meanwhile, Butler used a 10-0 run to go up 40-27.

Northern Colorado got the Bulldog lead back down to 10 before halftime, taking a 41-31 deficit into the locker room.

The second half was a different tale all together.

Shots began to fall for the perennial NCAA Tournament team, and just like that, the Bulldogs were up by 20 (58-38) just six minutes into the final 20 minutes of action.

UNC had no answer for the potent offense after Davis was forced to take an early leave from the game due to cramping, shooting just 28.0% from the floor and 0-of-7 from beyond the arc in the second half, as Butler expanded its lead to 37 before it was all said and done.

Northern Colorado finished the game 16-of-46 (34.8%) from the field and 4-of-20 (20.0%) from three-point land.

GREELEY, Colo. -- Everybody got a taste of the action on Wednesday night as Northern Colorado (1-1, 0-0 Big Sky) cruised to a 94-73 win over Colorado Christian (2-0, 0-0).

How It Happened:

The Bears took their time to get things going on both ends of the court in the opening minutes of the game.

Just six minutes deep into the first period, the Cougars rattled off a 10-0 run and went from down to two, to up eight (18-10) with 12:05 to play.

Freshman guard, Mike Ranson knocked down a three in transition to halt the rally, but the Cougars clung to the lead through the midway point in the half. Cue sophomore guard, Jordan Davis, who, up until that point had been relatively quiet. Davis single handedly took the Bears on a 7-0 run, to claw UNC back within one, 21-20 with 8:59 to play.

From there, everything clicked. Shots, shots and more shots fell as UNC outscored CCU 37-8 in the remaining nine minutes of the half to take a 50-29 heading into the locker room. The Bears shot a solid 45.5% from the field and 41.7% from beyond the arc in the first half, while limiting Colorado Christian to 33.3% from the floor and 10.0% on three-point field goals.

The first 14 minutes of the second half was more of the same. UNC moved the ball well, especially in transition, and pushed its lead to as many as 36, putting the game well out of reach.

Northern Colorado had five players finish in double figures with Davis leading the charge with 22 points, adding in seven assists, six boards and three steals. Redshirt sophomore guard, Chaz Glotta also put on a display, finishing with 18 points, going 4-of-7 from three-point land.

Sophomore forward, Ibrahim Sylla (12 points), Ranson (11 points) and redshirt freshman, Jonah Radebaugh (10 points) rounded out the double-digit scorers. Radebaugh produced his first-career double-double, as he hauled in a game-high 11 rebounds to complement his 10 points.

Santa Clara, Calif -- Beginning the first of five games on the road, Northern Colorado was in the northern end of California Saturday evening, facing Santa Clara. A second half surge from the Broncos was too much to handle for the Bears, falling 88-72.

How It Happened:

It was the UNC defense that got out after it early, forcing three early turnovers. Chaz Glotta made the most of the opportunities, scoring five early points and, aiding the Bears to a 11-7 early advantage.

The Bears' offense looked like a well-oiled machine. Mid-way through the first half, Northern Colorado had made nine of 10 from the field, increasing the UNC lead.

As quickly as the Bears and Broncos started the contest, scoring dropped sharply late in the half, with both teams going three plus minutes without finding a basket.

In the initial 20 minutes, Northern Colorado shot 53 percent from the field and saw two players in double figures, Chaz Glotta and Ibrahim Sylla. Sylla had a game-high 13 points and six rebounds at the mid-way point.

Jordan Davis didn't go unnoticed lighting up the stat columns, totaling nine points, three rebounds and five assists. Santa Clara opened the second frame on a nine to five run, closing the gap three minutes in.

Another scoring drought would damper the mood for Bears fans on-hand in Santa Clara. Scoreless for more than five minutes, the Broncos would go on a 14-0 run to take the lead 65-55.

SCU stretched the lead to as much as 17 in the game, much in part to 13 three-point shots made by the Broncos. Santa Clara also did not commit a single turnover in the second half en route to their victory.

TUCSON, Ariz. — Northern Colorado (1-3, 0-0 Big Sky) was in a dogfight on Monday night at No. 8 Arizona (4-0, 0-0 Pac 12). The Bears took a halftime lead into the locker room, but eventually shots began to drop for the Wildcats, using a 12-2 run in the final four minutes of the game to pull away from UNC for the win, 71-55.

How It Happened:

After Davis took his leave, Northern Colorado went on its second dry spell of the half, that one lasting over four minutes. The Wildcats took advantage and extended its lead to five (44-39) with 10:10 to play in the game and head coach, Jeff Linder quickly sent Davis back into the game.

Arizona's lead continued to grow, but UNC never shied away from the challenge. Another Glotta three and a traditional three-point play from senior forward, Jon'te Dotson got the deficit back down to four (51-47) with a little under eight minutes to play.

Unfortunately, Northern Colorado's offense stalled out once again at the wrong time as Zona was able to outscore the Bears 12-2 over the remaining four and half minutes to seal the victory.

@UNCO_MBB BLOW BY SACRED HEART ON THANKSGIVING

LAS VEGAS, Nev. — Northern Colorado (2-3, 0-0 Big Sky) had much to be thankful for on Thanksgiving Day. The Bears earned their first win over a Division I opponent on Thursday, defeating Sacred Heart (1-4, 0-0) 81-59 in the opening round of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational.

How It Happened:

The Bears got off to a slow start in the first 10 minutes of the ball game. After needing just two minutes to put up seven points, UNC's offense stalled out, adventuring on two, three-plus minute scoring droughts.

Sacred Heart took advantage of the Bears' offensive woes, extending its lead into double figures (25-15) with 9:20 to play in the first half.

The Pioneers built their lead to as many as 12 points (27-15), before Northern Colorado got hot. The Bears outscored SHU 22-9 in the final nine minutes of the half to take a one-point, 37-36 lead into the locker room.

Northern Colorado secured runs of 8-0 and 7-0, putting themselves right back into the game at 30-30 at the 3:13 mark. Much of the credit can go to the UNC bench for getting the team back into the game. Junior guard, DJ Miles came off the bench put up eight of his 17 points in the first half. Miles was 3-of-6 from the field and 2-of-3 from beyond the arc in the first act.

If anything, the effort at both ends of the court only got better in the second half. Northern Colorado outscored the Pioneers 30-7 through the first 13 minutes of the game, including a 17-0 run that went from 14:17 to the 11:05 point. UNC was especially lethal from three-point range. The Bears shot 8-of-15 (53.3%) from beyond the arc in the second half, and 13-of-24 (54.2%) for the game, pouring 39 in of their 81 points on three-point field goals.

Sophomore guard, Jordan Davis put on a show in front of his hometown crowd. The Las Vegas product produced his second double-double of the season, dropping a game-high 25 points with 12 rebounds and dished out seven assists. Three other Bears reached double figures on the afternoon. Miles finished with a career-high 17 points, Carey scored a career-best 10 points and redshirt freshman

@UNCO_MBB FALL DOWN THE STRETCH TO BUCKNELL

LAS VEGAS, Nev. — Northern Colorado (2-4, 0-0 Big Sky) held a lead midway through the second half, but a late surge by Bucknell (5-2, 0-0 Patriot) sent the Bears home from the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational with a 75-63 loss.

How It Happened:

It was an even opening act as the game saw five ties and three lead changes with the largest difference of the half being just six points.

The Bears opened the game with paint-points from redshirt sophomore forward, Ibrahim Sylla, for its first lead of the half. Bucknell responded with a 12-4 run to take a 12-6 advantage just four minutes in to the contest.

UNC adventured on a 6-0 run of its own to tie up the game at 12 apiece, and used the next five minutes to build a 25-20 upper hand over the Bison at the 8:03 mark in the half. From there, Bucknell and UNC tied the game up two more times, before a vital six-point swing from the Bison gave them the lead at halftime.

A foul on sophomore guard, Jordan Davis and then a technical foul on the UNC bench put Bucknell at the line for four free throw attempts, which they made three. Cue a three-ball from BU's Matt O'Reilly and in the matter of 90 seconds, the Bears found themselves behind by six.

Davis ended the half with back-to-back buckets, chipping the Bucknell lead down to four, 39-35. Despite trailing, Northern Colorado outshot the Bison. The Bears were a solid 62.5% (15-of-24) from the floor, while Bucknell finished 50% (13-of-26) in the first half.

Davis picked up right where he left off at the end of the first half and scored 10 of UNC's first 15 points of the second half, giving the Bears a 50-47 lead with 14:04 remaining in the game.

A pair of free throws by junior guard, DJ Miles and five more points from Davis gave Northern Colorado its largest command of the game at 57-51 over the Bison with a little over 10 minutes to go.

Unfortunately, the Bears shooting began to cool down, opening the door for Bucknell. The Bison went on a quick 8-0 run and suddenly the guys from Greeley found themselves down by two, 59-57 just two minutes later.

Northern Colorado remained within one possession of Bucknell, until the Bison knocked down their only two three-pointers of the half to push the Bears' deficit to 71-63 with 2:11 left to play, closing the door on any sort of comeback bid by UNC.
