- ► Wichita State (8-2) and Oklahoma (6-2) square off on the hardwood for the first time in over four decades Saturday afternoon at Oklahoma City's Chesapeake Energy Arena.
- ▶ 0U will make a return trip to Wichita in 2017-18 to take part in the Shockers' annual downtown game at INTRUST Bank Arena.
- ▶ WSU plays back-to-back games against Big 12 teams from the Sooner State, continuing at home next Saturday against Oklahoma State (6 p.m. CT, ESPN3).

- ► Catch every Shocker game, home and away, on FM 103.7 KEYN and online at goshockers.com/listen. Mike Kennedy -- now in his 37th year as Voice of the Shockers -- will call his 1,183rd consecutive game, alongside Bob Hull.
- ► Kennedy also hosts the *Gregg Marshall Coaches Show* on Monday nights from 6-7 p.m. Fans can tune in on KNSS 1330AM/98.7 FM or watch it live at AJ's Sports Bar & Grill at the corner of 13th & Greenwich Road.

ALL-COLLEGE CLASSIC

- ► WSU-OU doubles as the 79th All-College Classic.
- ► Though its format has evolved over the years (from an eight team tournament bracket to a single-game), the All-College Classic is considered the nation's oldest basketball event, outdating the NCAA, NIT, NAIA and NBA.
- ► Originated and sponsored for 21 years by the Oklahoma Publishing Company, the event became the major annual project of the OKC All-Sports Association in 1957.
- This is the Shockers' ninth overall appearance in the event but their first since 1970.
- ▶ Under the previous tournament format, WSU went 16-8 with two titles (1961 & 64) and one runner-up finish.

- Through 10 games, WSU ranks fourth nationally in scoring margin (+24.2) and 11^{th} in rebound margin (+10.9). Opponent average just 58.1 pts (8th) on 35.1% shooting (6th).
- ▶ Team Depth... WSU leads the nation in bench scoring (49.2), and all 10 rotation players average at least 5.6 points and 13.0 minutes. None are averaging more than 11.1 points or 23.0 minutes.
- ► The Shockers needed less than a month to set a single-season school record. Tuesday's 75-45 win over Saint Louis was their sixth 30-point win of the year.
- The team has won three-straight, and their only losses this year have come to top-25 teams (Louisville & Michigan State).
- ▶ The Shockers went 9-3 last year in true road games and are out to a 1-0 start this year.. WSU has been this decade's best true road team, with an .814 road percentage (58-10) since 2010-11.



GREGG MARSHALL...

- Coached his 600th career game 11/29/16 vs. So. Nazarene
- ▶ Began the year ranked 19th among active D-1 coaches in winning percentage (.716) and 42nd in total wins (424).
- ► Passed Ralph Miller as WSU's career wins leader on 2/3/16
- ► Led WSU to its first MVC three-peat (51-3) last spring
- ► Has a conference record seven-straight 25-win seasons
- ► Took WSU to Final Four for first time in 48 years in 2013
- Logged the first 35-0 start in NCAA history in 2013-14.
- Coached WSU to its first NIT Championship in 2011.
- ► Has earned a school-record 5-straight NCAA bids since.
- ► Has produced 29 Shocker pros in his first nine seasons.
- ► Has coached 19 Shockers to postseason All-MVC honors, in his first nine seasons, including 12 First-Teamers since 2010 (equaling WSU's total from the previous 28 years combined)
- ► Has had five former players reach that NBA since 2013:

Ron Baker (Knicks), Fred VanVleet (Raptors), Cleanthony Early (Knicks), Gal Mekel (Mavericks, Pelicans), Toure' **Murry** (Knicks, Jazz, Wizards)

Has mentored seven assistants who went on to become D-I head coaches, including five who are currently leading programs: Steve Forbes (ETSU), Earl Grant (College of Charleston), Dana Ford (Tennessee State), Barclay Rade**baugh** (Charleston Southern), **Zach Spiker** (Drexel)

WSU in NBA ARENAS

- The Shockers make their first-ever appearance at Chesapeake Energy Arena, home to the NBA's Oklahoma City Thunder.
- WSU last played a regular season game in a current NBA arena on Dec. 10, 2005 when they lost to No. 13 Michigan State at the Palace at Auburn Hills (home of the Detroit Pistons).
- Previous Shocker appearances in NBA arenas have brought mixed results. WSU is 6-2 under Marshall, with all eight games coming in the postseason (2015 Sweet 16 in Cleveland, 2013 1st & 2nd Rounds in Utah, 2013 Sweet 16 & Elite 8 in Los Angeles, 2012 1st Round in Portland, 2011 NIT Semifinals and Championship at New York's Madison Square Garden).

WSU-OKLAHOMA SERIES SNIPPETS

- ► WSU and OU last battled 41 years ago but will play a two-year homeand-home series. The Sooners make a return visit to Wichita's INTRUST Bank Arena in December of 2017.
- ► This only the third post-World War II meeting between the programs. The teams split a home-and-home series in December of 1974 and 1975. **Robert Elmore** (brother of former NBA player, turned TV analyst Len Elmore) scored 20 points for the Shockers in both games.
- Silver Lake, Kan. native Lon Kruger played and coached at Kansas State. As a head coach, he's 7-1 all-time against the Shockers (4-1 at K-State, 2-0 at Florida, 1-0 at Illinois) with a 2-1 mark in Wichita.\
- Kruger and Marshall have never gone head-to-head.
- Marshall's lone meeting with Oklahoma came during his second season at Winthrop when his 14th-seeded Eagles lost to No. 3 seed Oklahoma in the NCAA Round of 64.

HOMECOMING COURT

A couple of Shockers have Oklahoma City roots:

- Redshirt junior center, **Shaquille Morris** attended Edmond Santa Fe High School before finishing up at Edmond Memorial HS.
- Senior point guard **John Robert Simon** is a Putnam City North grad and earned honorable mention Big All-City honors in both football (quarterback) and basketball.
- Morris and Simon (along with walk-on senior Zach Bush) are the last three links to the Shockers' 2013-14 undefeated team. Morris redshirted, while Simon saw time in 25 games as a deep reserve.

FRIEND TURNED FOE

WSU redshirt junior center, **Shaquille Morris** will go head-to-head with his former Edmond Memorial High School teammate Jordan Woodard for the first time in his collegiate career. Morris averaged 20 points and 8.7 rebounds, and fellow-senior Woodward put up 15 points, 7 boards and just under 7 assists for a team that won the Oklahoma Class 6A State Championships in 2013. Allen registered a steal and game-winning tipin to bring home the title.

A SENIOR MOMENT

WSU began the school year without a scholarship senior, but circumstances changed in mid-October. After sophomore **Peyton Allen** departed for personal reasons, Marshall successfully petitioned the NCAA to allow the open scholarship to be used by fourth-year walk-on **John Robert Simon**. Marshall made a surprise announcement at a team gathering with many of Simon's family members present.

MORE LINDSTED LINKS

- ► WSU assistant **Kyle Lindsted** built tiny Sunrise Christian Academy into a high school and prep basketball powerhouse, producing nearly threedozen Division I players over the last decade.
- Lindsted brought **Buddy Hield** (from Freeport, Bahamas) to the United States as a high school junior and coached him for two seasons. Hield, of course, went on to earn NCAA National Player of the Year honors at Oklahoma and led the Sooners to a Final Four last spring.
- Lindsted made the jump the collegiate level in the summer of 2015 and is now in his second season working under Gregg Marshall.

ROAD HOGS

Wichita State is this decade's most successful road team, going 58-13 in true road contests since the start of the 2010-11 campaign. That includes a 12-5 mark in non-conference games, helped by Saturday's win at Colorado State.

SHOCKER NOTES

400-WIN CLUB HOPPING

► Gregg Marshall (432 career wins) goes head-to-head with yet another fellow-member of the college basketball's 400-win club in Oklahoma's Lon Kruger (595 career victories). At the Battle 4 Atlantis, WSU faced Louisville's **Rick Pitinto** (752) and Michigan State's **Tom Izzo** (529) on back-to-back days. On Dec. 3, the Shockers defeated Colorado State and Larry Eustachy (494).

GREAT BALANCING ACT

- ► Through nine games, eight different Shockers have taken a turn as leading scorer, most recently Rashard **Kelly**, who scored a career-high 15 points in the win over Saint Louis.
- ► WSU has had a bench player lead or share the lead in scoring in eight consecutive games and in 9-of-10 games overall.

DEPTH CHARGED

- A total of 10 Shockers are logging at least 13 minutes per game, led by **Markis McDuffie** (team-high 22.3).
- All 10 regulars are all averaging at least 5.6 points, again led by McDuffie (11.1) and **Darral Willis** (10.0).
- Nine different WSU players have made multiple starts.
- Landry Shamet is the only Shocker who has started in all 10 games.

CHANGING OF THE GUARDS

- ► Ron Baker and Fred VanVleet are no longer on the roster, but a quard-by-committee approach has posted comparable offensive numbers (see chart below)
- ► The quartet of Conner Frankamp, Daishon Smith, Landry Shamet and Austin Reaves have played the bulk of the minutes this year.

- A Shocker reserve has led or shared the scoring lead in 9 of the first 10 contests, and bench players have accounted for just under **60%** of the team's overall output (49.2 out of 82.3).
- ► WSU's unofficial season record for bench scoring is **31.7** point per game by its 2011 NIT Championship squad -- a group that has been frequently compared to the current Shocker squad for its remarkable scoring balance and bench depth.
- ► Though it will be tough to maintain, the Shockers' current pace (49.7) would be the highest total for an NCAA team in the last **20** years. **Northwestern State** (47.4 in 2012-13), Texas State (42.8 in 2007-08), VMI (40.8 in 2009-10) and **Belmont** (40.3 in 2010-11) are the only teams to finish north of 40.0.
- Among MVC schools, only four teams in the past 20 years have finished a season with an average of more than 30.0 points from its non-starters. **Creighton**'s 36.9 points in 2007-08 is the standard.

A "BROWNOUT" AT COLORADO STATE

Zach Brown's streak of 40 consecutive starts ended after a rough three-game stretch at the Battle 4 Atlantis that saw him score just 10 points on 4-of-15 shooting (1-for-8 at the foul line). In two games off the bench last week, he bounced back to average 14.5 points and hit 9-of-14 shots. On Saturday 7,000 CSU fans dressed in white shirts as part of a special "white out" promotion, but Brown sent them home disappointed, scoring nine of his team-high **16** points in the final eight minutes to help key a Shocker run.

NEW JOB FOR MARSHALL?

Gregg Marshall has led the Shockers to more wins than any other coach and taken the team to a Final Four. How popular is Marshall in Wichita? A handful of local citizens are ready to see how those talents apply to areas like health care and social security. According to official numbers from the Sedgwick County election office, released to the Wichita Eagle, Marshall earned at least 10 write-in votes during the recent election, including two votes for the oval office.

BEAT-THE-ODDS COUPLE

Former Shockers Ron Baker and Fred VanVleet have made a habit of exceeding expectations, and that trend continues at the next level. Baker (New York Knicks) and VanVleet (Toronto Raptors) were two of only a dozen undrafted rookie free agents from last year's NCAA ranks to make a 2016 Opening Night roster. A total of five Shockers have now made their NBA debut in the last four seasons.

BUILDING BLOCKS

Junior Shaquille Morris picked up sixth block of the season last Saturday and upped his career total to 66. That's the 10th-highest for a Shocker since the block became an official NCAA statistic in 1985-86. Morris is on pace to eventually top that list, needing just 43 more to catch Claudius Johnson (109 from 1989-93). The overall record holder is **Antoine Carr** (209 from 1979-83).

ANOTHER HOME RUN

► The Shockers are 6-0 at Charles Koch Arena and are outscoring opponents by an average of 34.5 points per game. All six wins have come by 27 or more.

- ► WSU is 52-1 at home over the past four seasons. The lone loss came against UNI on Feb. 13, 2016.

LOUD NOISES

- ► Charles Koch Arena has played host to 187-consecutive regular season crowds of 10,000+, dating back to December of 2004.
- ► The Shockers' 45-game campus sellout streak ended on Nov. 29 when the ticket office reported 70 unsold general admission seats. That run began on Senior Day 2013 and lasted for nearly three-and-half years.
- For the fourth-consecutive year, WSU sold its entire allotment of season tickets (just over 9,000 total).
- ► The moral support has gone a long way. WSU is 107-9 (.922) over its last eight seasons at "The Roundhouse" and 113-9 (.926) overall in Wichita since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.
- ► WSU is **60-1** at home in regular season, non-conference games since November of 2008, with the only loss coming to a Final Four bound VCU in a 2011 Bracket Busters matchup.
- Including postseason NIT games, the Shockers have won 42 non-conference home games in a row (the nation's second-longest streak behind Duke).

MARSHALL 600th GAME

Gregg Marshall coached his 600th career game on Nov. 29 against Southern Nazarene... Just over half (324) of those 600 have come at WSU, where he's second only to Ralph Miller (353, 1951-64) in total games coached... Marshall's is WSU's all-time wins leader (237) and holds the same distinction at Winthrop (194), where he logged 277 games in nine years.

2017 TOURNAMENT SCENE

Wichita State has signed on to participate in the 2017 Maui Jim Maui Invitational in Hawaii, alongside California, LSU, Marquette, Michigan, Notre Dame, VCU and host Chaminade, Nov. 20-22, 2017. The Shockers finished 2-1 at the 2010 Maui Invitational, collecting wins over Chaminade and Virginia after a heart-breaking guarterfinal loss to eventual national champion UConn.

GUMBY NO MORE

Markis McDuffie arrived last year as a skilled albeit skinny freshman. Listed at 6-8, 185 pounds, coaches nicknamed him "Gumby" after the flexible, green claymation character. But what a difference 12 months makes. McDuffie packed on 27 pounds over the course of his freshman year and enters his second go-around at 6-8, 212.

- A record-breaking defensive performance and a career-night from Rashard Kelly powered Wichita State to a 75-45 win over Saint Louis Tuesday evening at Charles Koch Arena.
- ► WSU (8-2) held visiting SLU to 3-of-29 shooting in the first 20 minutes and took a 36-9 lead with them into the locker room.

► The Billikens' nine first-half points...

- Was the lowest-scoring half for a Shocker opponent in the Roundhouse's 62-year history.
- Broke the school's shot clock era record (12 vs. Centenary in February, 2000) by three full points.
- The third-lowest scoring half by an opponent in school history and the lowest since February, 1948 when the Shockers held Creighton to nine points.
- ► The Shockers notched their sixth 30-point win of the year, setting a new single-season program record for most 30-point victories.
- ► WSU continues to display remarkable depth. Kelly (career-high 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting) became the ninth-different Shocker to take a turn as leading scorer in just 10 games this year. He also led the rebounding with eight total boards.
- ▶ **Darral Wilis Jr.** was the only other Shocker in double figures, with 12 points. Shaquille Morris chipped in eight points and seven rebounds off the bench, and **Zach Brown** added eight points, four rebounds and three assists of his own.
- The Shockers finished at 45 percent from the field and knocked down 8-of-20 threes. They've shot better than 40 percent from deep in three straight.
- Defensively, WSU has held seven of its first 10 opponents under the 40-percent mark from the field, and the Billikens (26 percent) became the third foe to finish under 30-percent.
- ► WSU controlled the rebound battle, 52-29, and every other aspect of the game.
- ► After a miserable first half, Saint Louis (2-6) managed a little better in the second half, but by that time the game was out of hand.
- ► Wichita State pitched a shutout for the first 9:15 of the game, as the Shockers put 13 points on the board before SLU got a bucket to fall. SLU missed its first 12 shots and was 17 of its first 18 to start the game... Four straight points from Elliott Welmer pulled SLU to within 21-9 with 5:18 remaining in the first half, but the Billikens wouldn't score again until early in the second half.

- ► WSU shot 45 percent in the first half and outrebounded the Billikens 31-14.
- ► The Shockers would lead by as many as 35 in the second half — that margin coming at the 2:47 mark.
- ▶ WSU stretched its non-conference home winning streak to 42-games and won for the fifth consecutive time against SLU.

GREGG MARSHALL ON...

...Emphasizing and working hard on defense:

"We work hard on it everyday. That's our forte. That's what we concentrate on. That's what we emphasize. We weren't great this summer, but we've gotten a lot better. We've also put in tremendous effort, so we'll continue to

....Reserves consistently outplaying the starters:

"That's the dilemma that I have, whoever I start gets outplayed by whoever comes in off the bench. It's interesting how that happens. Tonight [Rashard] Kelly was spectacular off the bench and Shaq [Morris] was better than Rauno [Nurger]. It happens sometimes, we're pretty deep and we can keep guys fresh."

.... His own playing days and did he care if he was a starter or a reserve:

"I'm not sure, probably a little bit. It mattered more how much I played. I've told this story before I started my junior and senior year. A pretty good Division II program went to the NCAA tournament three times finished fourth in the country my junior year. The guy that played more was the quy that subbed for me, he was a sixth man, all-conference and would sub for me. He would play more than me but I started. I generally got the defensive assignment.

YOUNG GUNS

Going back 12 years to 2005-06, Markis McDuffie is one of just six underclassmen to be named preseason first team All-MVC. The other five were also sophomores: Ron Baker, WSU (2013), Marcus Marshall, MSU (2013), Doug McDermott, CU (2011), Jake Odum, INS (2011), **P'Allen Stinnett**, CU (2008).

JUCO JUNCTION

- Five star high school recruits aren't always within reach for WSU, but Marshall has attracted talent through other avenues. The staff has excelled at identifying, integrating and developing talented junior college prospects.
- Assistants **Greg Heiar** and **Isaac Brown** are former JUCO coaches, as is special assistant **Chris Jans** and Director of Basketball Operations, **Dominic Okon**.
- ► WSU has signed **17** JUCO players to scholarships in Marshall's 10 seasons, including current juniors Darral-Willis and Daishon Smith.
- Five of the 15 previous junior college transfers went on to achieve All-Valley status and three others earned specialty honors of some kind, such as all-bench or alldefensive team.
- ▶ **Daishon Smith** made his first career start on Nov. 29 against SNU, continuing a line that began with first team all-conference point guards Clevin Hannah (2008-10) and Joe Ragland (2010-12).
- ▶ Darral Willis Jr. is the ninth former JUCO All-American to sign with WSU since 2007.

STRONG OUT OF THE GATE

Teams with nine returning lettermen aren't often labeled as "inexperienced," but the loss of All-Americans Ron Baker and Fred VanVleet led to a reshuffling of roles. A summer trip to Quebec provided a headstart, and the Shockers were immediately impressive in four home wins to start the season by an average of 34.3 points (the most dominant four-game stretch in program history). They were also well-balanced, with a rotation of 10 players who all averaged double-digit

Nov. 11 -- SOUTH CAROLINA ST. -- W, 85-39

A 46-point win over the preseason MEAC runner-up pick was WSU's sixth-largest margin of victory ever over a Division I opponent.

Nov. 13 -- LONG BEACH ST. -- W, 92-55

A 21-0 second half run put away the preseason Big West favorites.

Nov. 16 -- TULSA -- W, 80-53

Bursts of 11-0 and 14-0 led to a 44-30 halftime advantage, and a 16-0 spurt midway through the second half served as the knockout punch in WSU's most lopsided win over rival Tulsa since 1972.

Nov. 20 -- MD. EASTERN SHORE -- W, 116-79

A school record-tying 15 three-pointers and a 66% overall shooting performance produced WSU's highest scoring output since 1988 and its first 100-point game against a Division I opponent under Gregg Marshall.

BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS

The Shockers played three games in three days in the Bahamas and finished fourth against a loaded field at the Battle 4 Atlantis. A lopsided win over LSU on national television validated the Shockers start, but potential statement wins over bluebloods Louisville and Michigan State weren't meant to be. Markis McDuffie (10.5 points in three games) made the All-Tournament

Nov. 23 -- vs. LSU (Bahamas) -- W, 82-47

WSU led 11-0, 30-9 and 61-29 in handing LSU its worst non-conference loss since 1994. The Shockers were +19 on the glass and held the Tigers to 28% shooting.

Nov. 24 -- vs. #10 Louisville (Bahamas) -- L, 52-62 Louisville's size and some sluggish first-half shooting doomed the Shockers. After trailing just 51 seconds in the first five games, they led for only 17.

Nov. 25 -- vs. #24 Mich. St. (Bahamas) -- L, 72-77 A second-half rally (from down 18 to within a singlepoint) came up short. WSU had two shots to tie in the final minute but couldn't convert.

LIFE AFTER ATLANTIS

Gregg Marshall wasn't interested in any moral victories that might have been gained from strong secondhalf performances in close losses to nationally-ranked teams. He instead challenged his team to improve its focus and attention to detail and also promised to reevaluate his starting lineup after using the same group for the first seven games.

Nov. 29 -- SO. NAZARENE -- W, 87-57

Shocker reserves combined for 61 of the team's 87 points, and WSU outscored SNU 46-8 in the paint in an easy win.

Dec. 3 -- at Colorado St. -- W, 82-67

A 10-0 run between the 6 and 8-minute mark of the second half busted open a one-point game, as WSU (13-of-27 from three-point range) passed its first true road test with flying colors.

Dec. 6 -- Saint Louis -- W, 75-45

The visiting Billikens missed 12-straight shots and 17 of their first 18 overall during a nine-point first half that smashed several school defensive records. It was the lowest halftime point total for a Shocker foe since 1948 and the third-lowest in program history.

- ► For the third consecutive year, the 15,004 seat building is completely sold out.
- ► The 6 p.m. tip can be seen in all 50 states on ESPN3.
- ► WSU is a perfect 6-0 at INTRUST Bank Arena, which opened its doors for the first time in 2010.
- ▶ OSU is the Shockers' closest Division I neighbor roughly 120 miles down the road.
- This will be the first meeting between the two teams in 14 years. WSU plays at OSU's Gallagher-Iba Arena in 2017.
- ► In a collision of curiousities, WSU's high-scoring bench (national-best 49.2 points per game) meets an OSU team that averages 40.1 points from its non-starters (fifth-best nationally). What exactly that means is anyone's quess.
