No. 10 Oklahoma (54-9, 17-1 Big 12)

SOONERS

► The defending national champion Oklahoma softball team has earned the No. 10 overall seed in the 2017 NCAA Division I Softball Championship. OU has earned a national seed each of the last 11 seasons and is hosting a Regional for the seventh straight year and 14th time overall.

► Advancing out of the Norman Regional, OU visits No. 7 Auburn this weekend in the Super Regional. Game one is Friday afternoon at 3 p.m., while game two will be Saturday at noon. If needed, a third game will take place Sunday at noon.

► Game one of the series will be on ESPN2, while games two and three will be on ESPN if necessary. Mark Neely will handle play-by-play duties with analyst Jenny Dalton-Hill.

► Fans can listen to each of OU's games on KEBC 1560 in Norman or online via link on SoonerSports.com.

► Against the NCAA Tournament field this year, the Sooners were an impressive 20-6 (.769) during the regular season. In fact, that's what OU's record was against the field entering last year's tournament, as well.

SUPER REGIONAL EXPERIENCE

► Oklahoma is making its 11th overall appearance in the Super Regionals since the format was introduced in 2005. Only two schools have been to more Supers, while OU also ranks sixth in win percentage of teams that have been to at least five Super Regionals and seventh in all-time Super Regional wins.

No. 7 Auburn (49-10, 17-7 SEC)

TIGERS

► This will be the sixth time that OU as gone on the road in the Super Regionals, but just the second since 2012. On the road, Oklahoma is 5-8 all-time in Super Regional play.

AGAINST THE SUPER REGIONAL FIELD

► Each of the 16 Super Regional teams has played at least six games against the rest of the field. With wins over UCLA and Ole Miss and a pair of wins over Baylor and losses to Tennessee, Arizona, Washington, Auburn and Baylor, OU ranks 10th in win percentage among Super Regional teams.

FACING AUBURN

► The Sooners are 4-2 all-time against the Tigers, but the teams have never met in Auburn.

► Most notably, the teams met in the 2016 Women's College World Series Championship Series. The Sooners won game one, 3-2, before the Tigers secured an 11-7 victory in eight innings in game two to force a game three. In the final game, **Paige Parker's** complete game was aided by a two-run first inning in a 2-1 victory for Oklahoma, giving the Sooners their third national championship, a feat only accomplished by UCLA (11) and Arizona (8).

► OU and Auburn opened the 2017 season against one another, marking the first time since the WCWS began in 1982 that teams playing for the national title opened the following season against one another. It was also the 23rd time that the teams faced each other at some point the following year, including each of the last four years. Teams that won the WCWS are 49-25 when teams meet again the next season.

► In the 2017 season opener, Oklahoma's rally fell just short in a 3-2 loss. **Vanessa Taukeiaho** hit a two-run single in the bottom of the seventh to trim Auburn's lead to one, but OU would get no closer. In her OU debut, **Paige Lowary** struck out a career-high 11 batters but walked five in taking the loss.

► Outside of their matchup against one another, Oklahoma and Auburn have played seven common opponents in 2017: BYU, Evansville, Mississippi State, Nebraska, North Dakota State, Ole Miss and Washington. OU went 7-2 against those teams with losses to NDSU and UW, while Auburn was 9-2 with setbacks vs. Ole Miss and Washington.

GASSO, MYERS AMONG TOP COACHES IN THE SPORT

► Oklahoma's **Patty Gasso** and Auburn's Clint Myers are two of the top coaches in college softball history. Gasso has won three national titles (2000, '13, '16) at OU, while Myers took home titles in 2008 and 2001 at Arizona State.

► Among D-1 coaches with at least five years, Myers ranks second in winning percentage at .803, while Gasso (23rd year) ranks seventh at .776. All-time among coaches with at least 10 years, Myers is fifth and Gasso is eighth.

► The pair has faced each other nine times at the Division I level since Myers arrived at Arizona State in 2006; Gasso leads the series 5-4. The pair also battled at the junior college level when Gasso was at Long Beach City College from 1991-94 and Myers was at Central Arizona.

POSTSEASON HISTORY

► Oklahoma is making its 24th postseason appearance which is tied for 11th most in NCAA history. In addition, OU is tied with Washington for the fourth-most wins in postseason history and owns the fourth-best win percentage all-time (min. 5 postseason appearances).

► The 2017 staff has been anchored by two-time All-American **Paige Parker**, but junior transfer **Paige Lowary** and freshman **Mariah Lopez** have emerged to form a powerful trio. Entering the postseason, OU and Oregon were the only teams in the country to have three pitchers who have thrown at least 91.0 IP and also have ERAs of 1.78 or better.

► Parker has seen her inning total drop from 202.1 to 177.2 at this same point a year ago. The decrease in workload appears to be doing wonders for her as her ERA (1.34), strikeout rate (9.02) and walk rate (1.46) are all better than any previous season in her career.

► Lowary's numbers have improved significantly in Norman compared to her first two seasons at Missouri. Her ERA has improved from 3.32 to 1.67 while her walk rate has dropped from 3.51 per 7 IP to 1.78 and her opponent average has gone from .244 to .166.

► Lowary has excelled in her role as a relief pitcher. In 51.1 innings in relief, she's allowed just 6 earned runs for a 0.82 ERA with a strikeout rate of 5.73/7 IP, a walk rate of 1.50/7 IP, an opponents' average of .106 and eight saves. Conversely, her ERA in 74.2 IP as a starter is 2.25 with a K rate of 6.00, walk rate of 1.97 and average against of .203.

► Remove a relief performance vs. Ole Miss on Feb. 17 where she gave up 3 runs in 2.1 IP, Lowary's ERA would be at 0.43 with 3 ER allowed in 49.0 IP.

► Lopez has a 2.03 ERA with 104 strikeouts to 18 walks in 96.1 IP. As of 5/21, her 1.31 walks /7 IP was thid in the country among freshmen (min. 90.0 IP), while her 5.01 hits/7 IP ranked fifth and ERA and strikeout rate of 7.6/7 IP was 8th.

HEALTHY KNIGHTEN A FORCE AT THE PLATE

► Shay Knighten battled a knee injury throughout the fall and it impacted her as the season started. She was hitting just .232 with 1 home run through the first 20 games, but she's been on a tear since

MENDES ON A TEAR SINCE BECOMING A STARTER

► Freshman **Nicole Mendes** entered the starting lineup on March 10 in the second game of a DH vs. Omaha and hasn't left. Over the last 42 games (where she has started in RF, DP, LF and P), she leads the team in average (.453), runs (47), hits (67), triples (3), total bases (95) and stolen bases (21), and is second in OBP (.491).

► Mendes has hit safely in 38 of the 42 games, including eight games with three hits, highlighted by a four-hit effort at Loyola Marymount where she had two doubles and a triple.

► Mendes is also currently riding a career-best 20-game hit streak and 34-game on-base streak, both of which are the longest such streaks by a Sooner this year. Below are some of her stats during both the hit streak and on-base streak.

► Mendes' 20-game hit streak is three off the school record of 23 set by Kristin Vesely from Feb. 18 to March 13, 2005. Her on-base streak is the longest since Lauren Chamberlain reached in the final 25 games of the 2014 season and the first 13 of 2015 for a 38-game streak.

OU ECLIPSES 100 STOLEN BASES

► Oklahoma is 104-127 on stolen base attempts entering the Super Regional. The steal total is third most in team history.

► Eleven different players have at least one stolen base this year and eight have at least seven steals. **Nicole Mendes** leads the team with 21 this year, while **Caleigh Clifton** is second with 19 and **Sydney Romero** has 15 this year after having just 6 in 2016.

► As a team, OU has 16 games this year with at least three stolen bases and 10 games with at least four, including a season-high six at Texas Tech (4/30).

► One of Oklahoma's favorite spots to steal has been in first-and-third situations, with 43 of their 104 steals (41.3%) coming with runners on the corners. In fact, 13 of Romero's 15 steals have come when she takes second with a runner on 3rd. Straight steals account for 49 (47.1%), while double steals of second and third have resulted in 12 stolen bases (11.5%).

► Through 5/21, **Paige Parker** is 9th among active pitchers in career ERA (1.56) and shutouts (28), 10th in wins (88), 13th in total strikeouts (722), 15th in strikeouts/7 IP (7.81), 19th in complete games (69), 29th in innings pitched (647.0), 38th in starts (93) and 45th in appearances (127) ... **Paige Lowary** is 5th among active pitchers in saves (14), 34th in wins (56) and 42nd in strikeouts/7IP (6.06)

► **Caleigh Clifton** is 29th among active players with 39 career HBP ... **Nicole Mendes** is 5th among active players in career batting average at .442 (min. 100 AB)

► Parker leads the team in ERA during road games (1.48) and non-conference games (1.52) ... Mendes leads the team in batting average in non-conference games (.441), while **Shay Knighten** has a team-high .453 average in road games

► Every pitcher on the OU staff has an ERA of 2.03 or better, and the staff ERA was 1.56 on the road and 1.64 during non-conference games ... after hitting 15 home runs in their first 32 games (0.47/game), the Sooners have hit 38 in their last 28 contests (1.36/game) ... conversely, OU pitchers have given up five home runs in the last 26 games (0.19/game) after giving up 25 in the first 34 contests (0.74/game)

OU FIGHTS THE ODDS TO WIN REGIONALS

► According to ESPN research, the Sooners became just the eighth team out of 416 since 2005 to advance to the Super Regionals after losing their opening game of the postseason.

► Taking place over two days due to a rain delay after the top of the first Friday, the Sooners dropped the opener of the Regional with a 3-2, nine-inning loss to North Dakota State. The loss snapped its 16-game winning streak in Regional play.

► OU first avoided elimination with a 5-3 win over Arkansas. **Nicole Mendes** was 3-4 with a run scored. **Paige Parker** earned the win in relief by tossing 4.1 shutout innings, while **Paige Lowary** got the save.

► In a rematch with NDSU, OU used a four-run first inning to run-rule the Bison 10-2 in six innings. **Shay Knighten** and **Nicole Pendley** each went 3-4 with a home run, two runs scored and four runs batted in.

► Down 4-2 in the bottom of the 10th, **Caleigh Clifton** and **Sydney Romero** each hit a pair of two-run home runs in a 6-4 win over Tulsa. Lowary came out of the bullpen and threw a career-high 8.1 innings to earn the win.

► In the Regional final, Mendes homered on the first pitch of the game and Parker recorded a postseason-best 10 strikeouts as the Sooners shut out Tulsa, 3-0, to advance.

SOONERS FACE TOUGH SCHEDULE IN 2017

► Nine of Oklahoma's 2017 opponents are currently ranked in both polls, including five in the top 10: No. 5/5 (NFCA/USA) Arizona, No. 7/7 Washington, No. 8/8 Auburn, No. 9/8 UCLA, No. 10/10 Tennessee, No. 13/16 Ole Miss, No. 17/13 Baylor, No. 21/21 BYU and No. 23/23 Tulsa.

► Arkansas and Mississippi State are receiving votes in both polls, while Oklahoma St. (USA) is receiving votes in one poll.

OU CONTINUES REMARKABLE RUN IN NATIONAL POLLS

► After going 3-0 in the Big 12 Championship, OU stayed at No. 6 in the USA Today/NFCA Division I Coaches Poll and ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25.

► Oklahoma is the only program to be ranked every week of the NFCA poll, 336 straight polls.

► The Sooners were the unanimous No. 1 in each of the pre-season polls. It was the first time in program history OU entered the season as the top-ranked team in the country in either poll. Previously, its best preseason ranking was No. 2, which occurred in 2014 and 2013 (both polls) and 2002 (NFCA).

► 2017 was just the fourth time in the NFCA poll's history, which dates back to 1995, there was a unanimous No. 1 in the preseason poll. Oklahoma received all 32 first-place votes to join Arizona State in 2012, Washington in 2010 and Arizona in 1998 as the only teams to do it.

► OU is one of four teams (Michigan, UCLA and Washington) to be in every single NFCA Preseason Poll; the Sooners' average preseason rank is 8.0. Overall, the Sooners are third in NFCA history with 17 top-10 appearances in the preseason poll and are tied for third with nine top-five appearances. Only two teams have more Top 10 appearances than Oklahoma.

► This is the seventh straight season the Sooners have started ranked in the NFCA's Top 10, which is the second longest active streak in the country behind Alabama (12). In fact, OU has been ranked in the top five in five of the past six years, which is tied with Alabama and Florida for the most over that stretch.

OU WINS SIXTH STRAIGHT BIG 12 TITLE

► With a three-game sweep of Oklahoma State, the Sooners have won an unprecedented six straight Big 12 championships. Prior to this current run, no team in league history had even won three straight conference crowns.

► Oklahoma won the league by 4.0 games over Baylor, the second largest margin in conference history behind the 4.5 game margin of Nebraska over OU in 1998.

► Oklahoma has won 10 Big 12 regular season titles and five conference tournament championships. The 15 combined championships are the most in league history.

► With six straight league crowns, the Sooners have the longest active regular season conference-title streak in the nation. Both Michigan (9, Big Ten) and North Dakota State (5, Summit League) saw their title runs end this season.

► The Sooners are undefeated in their past 43 regular season Big 12 series, going 39-0-4. The last series loss for OU came to Missouri on April 16-17, 2011. Baylor and Iowa State are tied for the next longest streak at 2-0-0.

► Since the Big 12 began in 1996, OU has the best all-time win percentage in regular season conference play at .783 (307-85). Texas is a distant second at .635 (233-134), while among teams currently in the league Baylor is third at .514 (189-179-1), followed by Oklahoma State at .450 (176-215), Kansas at .380 (151-246), Texas Tech at .310 (121-269) and Iowa State at .219 (85-304).

SOONERS DOMINATE BIG 12 AWARD SEASON

► For the third straight year, Oklahoma was the recipient of Big 12 Player of the Year (**Shay Knighten**), Pitcher of the Year (**Paige Parker**), Freshman of the Year (**Nicole Mendes**) and Coach of the Year (**Patty Gasso**).

► Knighten was named Big 12 Player of the Year to become the fourth sophomore in league history to win the award. It marks the third year in a row, the fifth time in the last six years and the seventh time in the last nine years that a Sooner has won the award. Knighten is the 10th different Sooner to be Big 12 Player of the Year.

► Parker was named Big 12 Pitcher of the Year for the third year in a row, joining Texas' Cat Osterman as the only players to win the award as a freshman, sophomore and junior. In fact, Parker and Osterman are the only players in league annals to win the award at least three times overall.

► Mendes became the sixth Sooner to be recognized as Big 12 Freshman of the Year as she tied for the league lead in runs scored (21) and hits (28) and was second in average (.444).

► Gasso was chosen as the Big 12 Coach of the Year for the 10th time in her career. She has won the award in each of the last six seasons, while no other coach in the history of the league has even won the honor more than three times.

► Top-seeded Oklahoma did not allow a run en route to its fifth Big 12 Championship title, going 3-0 in Oklahoma City.

► **Paige Parker** threw a three-hit shutout with eight strikeouts and **Sydney Romero** hit a two-run homer in the first inning as top-seeded Oklahoma opened play with a 3-0 win over fourth-seeded Texas.

► Four home runs and a shutout carried Oklahoma past sixth-seeded Texas Tech, 8-0, to wrap pool play. **Caleigh Clifton** had the first two-homer game of her career, while **Nicole Mendes** and Romero also left the yard. **Mariah Lopez** and **Paige Lowary** combined on the shutout.

► **Nicole Pendley** hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning to break a scoreless tie, while Parker and Lowary combined on a four-hit shutout as OU beat third-seeded Oklahoma State, 2-0, to win the Big 12 Championship Saturday.

BEDLAM SWEEP GIVES OU BIG 12 TITLE

► Needing just one win to win a sixth straight Big 12 title, OU posted an emphatic sweep of Bedlam rival Oklahoma State.

► **Paige Parker** and **Paige Lowary** combined on a four-hit shutout while **Fale Aviu** had a two-run single to help OU to a 3-0 win in the title-clinching opener. OSU had a chance in the sixth with the bases loaded and 1 out, but **Caleigh Clifton** started a 4-3 double play to keep the Sooners on top.

► Oklahoma scored five runs in the first two innings and **Shay Knighten** hit a pair of home runs in the team's final home game of the regular season, a 6-2 win over OSU.

► **Nicole Mendes** accounted for the only run with a solo homer in the sixth and combined with Lowary on a no-hitter, the third combined no-hitter in program history.

BATS POWER OU TO SWEET AT TEXAS TECH

► Oklahoma hit seven home runs, including four by Shay Knighten, and outscored Texas Tech 30-5 in a three-game sweep in Lubbock.

► **Nicole Mendes** reached in all four plate appearances by going 3-3 with a walk and stole three bases while **Shay Knighten** hit a solo homer in a 4-2 win in the opener.

► The team's 1-5 hitters combined to go 10-17 (.588) with 10 runs scored and eight RBI in a 12-0, five-inning win in game two. Knighten homered and drove in 4, while **Sydney Romero** and **Macey Hatfield** also homered.

► Knighten hit a pair of home runs and matched a career high with 5 RBI, while Mendes was 3-5 with three stolen bases and three runs scored in a 14-3, five-inning win in the finale.

BIG 12 WIN STREAK ENDS AT 25

► From April 3, 2016 to April 22, 2017, OU won 25 straight Big 12 games before losing to Baylor in the second game of their series. The 25 straight wins mark the longest Big 12 win streak in program history.

► During the streak, OU had four top-25 wins, seven shutouts and six run-rule wins. Twelve victories came at home and 13 were on the road.

OU TAKES SERIES FROM BAYLOR TO STAY IN FIRST

► Oklahoma won two of three games from No. 15/13 Baylor to remain atop the Big 12 standings.

► The series opener was scoreless through eight innings before Baylor took the lead in the ninth only to see **Nicole Mendes'** RBI double send it to the 10th. The Lady Bears took the lead back at 2-1, but **Falepolima Aviu** hit a two-run, walkoff double to give the Sooners a 3-2 win.

► OU got the tying run on base and the winning run at the plate but Baylor prevailed in game two, 4-3. It snapped OU's 17-game win streak, its string of 25 straight wins in Big 12 play and its streak of 33 wins in a row at home.

► The Sooners captured the series with a 6-0 win in game three. **Nicole Pendley** hit a first-inning grand slam, while **Paige Parker** threw a five-hit shutout to lead OU to the win.

SWEEP OF KANSAS SENDS OU INTO FIRST PLACE

► A three-game sweep at Kansas along with a loss by Oklahoma State pushed the Sooners into first place in the Big 12.

► **Paige Parker** struck out a career-high 15 batters as OU took the series opener from Kansas, 4-1. Parker's 15 K's were two better than her previous high of 13, which she had reached twice. The total was also the highest by an OU pitcher since Keilani Ricketts had 17 strikeouts at Kansas on April 5, 2013. Parker retired 17 batters in a row at one point.

► OU hit a season-high six home runs, including four in an 11-run fourth inning, en route to a 16-7 victory in game two. The six homers were the most OU had ever hit in a conference game. The 1-6 hitters in the starting lineup combined to go 11-19 (.579) with 12 runs scored, 11 RBI and five home runs.

► The Sooners completed the sweep with a 6-2 win in the finale. **Caleigh Clifton** led the way by going 3-4 with a pair of runs scored and an RBI, while **Paige Lowary** gave up two runs on three hits and one walk while striking out three. She retired 13 straight during one stretch.

WIN STREAK AT 10 OVER TEXAS

► Oklahoma went to Austin and swept a three-game series from Texas, pushing its win streak to 10 over the Longhorns.

► **Shay Knighten** hit the game-tying solo home run in the fourth inning and the game-winning single in the sixth in a 3-2 victory in game one. **Paige Parker** struck out seven in a complete-game victory with just two hits allowed.

► Knighten was at it again in game two, hitting a two-run single in the fifth for what turned out to be the game-winning hit in a 3-1 win in game two.

► **Paige Lowary** struck out six in 5.1 shutout innings, while the Sooners sent 11 to the plate in a five-run second inning en route to a 6-0 victory in the series finale.

BIG 12 PLAY STARTS WITH SWEEP OF IOWA STATE

► Oklahoma began league play 3-0 for the fourth time in the last five years with a three-game sweep of Iowa State. The Sooners' offense posted a slash line of .468/.564/.759 compared to just .206/.265/.238 for Iowa State, while outscoring the Cyclones 40-5 in the three-game set. OU pitchers had an ERA of just 0.39, while ISU's staff ERA was 13.07.

► The Sooners scored in each of the first four innings to post their sixth straight win in a Big 12 opener with a 7-1 win. **Nicole Mendes** led the offense with a 3-4 night, scoring two runs, driving in another and stealing a base. **Paige Parker** struck out six in 5.0 innings with one run allowed on two hits and one walk.

► OU posted the ninth highest run total in program history in a five-inning, 20-0 win in game two. The 20-run margin of victory tied for sixth largest in program history and the 20-0 shutout was second largest. The Sooners combined for 12 hits, led by a three-hit game for **Shay Knighten**. The team also drew a season-high 12 walks, including a career-high four for **Nicole Pendley**. **Macey Hatfield** had a career-high five RBI with a two-run single and three-run homer.

► OU used a nine-run second to complete a sweep of Iowa State with a 13-4, six-inning win in the finale. The offense posted 15 hits as six different Sooners collected two hits each. Four OU batters also had at least two RBI and five scored two runs each. Pendley drove in four, while Romero had three RBI.

BIG 12 WEEKLY HONORS

The Sooners have won 11 weekly honors from the Big 12 so far as Paige Parker (four times), Mariah Lopez and Paige Lowary have each been named the Big 12 Pitcher of the Week, while Sydney Romero, Nicole Mendes, Macey Hatfield and Shay Knighten (two times) have been named Big 12 Player of the Week.

Oklahoma has had seven different honorees in a season for the first time in program history and has taken home honors in eight consecutive weeks to extend a program record. OU is just the second team ever to have three different Big 12 Pitcher of the Week honorees in the same year, joining 2001 Nebraska.

March 14

Parker appeared in three games with two starts and went 2-0 by giving up just one earned run in 15.1 innings of work for a 0.46 ERA. She threw two complete games, including a 10-inning shutout, and allowed just four hits and one walk while striking out 14 and holding opponents to an .082 average.

March 21

Romero led Oklahoma and the Big 12 in home runs (3) and total bases (20) during the week, while tying for the team lead in runs (8) and finishing second in average (.423) and hits (11). She hit safely in all seven games.

Lopez threw her first career no-hitter and recorded her first save. For the week, she was 1-1 with a save and a 1.56 ERA. She recorded 15 strikeouts against three walks in 18.0 innings with nine hits allowed for a .148 opponents' batting average.

March 28

Mendes led the Sooners in triples (1), home runs (2), total bases (15) and slugging (1.071) and tied for the team lead in RBI (4). She hit .429 (6-14) with five runs and a .467 OBP.

April 4

Hatfield made only one out in a three-game sweep of Iowa State. Hatfield was 4-5 at the plate and drew five walks as she reached safely in 10 of 11 plate appearances against the Cyclones. She also scored three runs, homered and drove in five, posting a .900 OBP and 1.400 slugging percentage.

April 11

Knighten led the Big 12 over the week with six RBI and 10 total bases and tied for the league lead in hits (6), home runs (1) and slugging (1.000). She also led OU in average (.600), hits, RBI, walks (4), OBP (.714) and slugging for the week while tying for the top spot in doubles (1).

Lowary did not allow a single run in 9.2 innings, picking up two saves and a win in her three appearances. She struck out 10 and walked just one while giving up five hits and holding opponents to a .139 average.

April 18

Parker picked up two wins in a three-game sweep of Kansas, highlighted by a career-high 15 strikeouts in the series opener. She gave up one unearned run on 98 pitches, allowing three hits with no walks. She retired 17 straight batters at one point, including seven straight strikeouts from the end of the first inning through the third.

April 25

Parker did not give up an earned run and struck out 15 in 13.1 innings over two starts against No. 15/13 Baylor last weekend, earning her win via a five-hit shutout in the series-clincher.

May 2

Knighten hit four HR and was 6-11 (.545) with seven runs scored, 10 RBI and two stolen bases. She slugged 1.636 with a .583 on-base percentage.

Parker got the win in her lone appearance. She struck out eight in 4.0 innings with just one hit allowed and no runs allowed.

With 16 honors in her career, Parker has tied former Sooner Keilani Ricketts for the most in OU history and second most in league annals.

OU UNDEFEATED AT COLLEGE PREVIEW TOURNAMENT

► Oklahoma beat Mississippi State, Louisiana Tech and UAB (twice) to go 4-0 at the College Preview Tournament.

► A four-run third inning helped OU to a 5-3 win over Mississippi State. **Caleigh Clifton** had two hits, including a double, scored a run, drove in a run and walked. **Nicole Mendes** tripled, drove in a run and scored a run in the leadoff spot.

► OU returned to Oklahoma City Saturday for the first time since the 2016 national title with a 5-1 win over Louisiana Tech. Mendes was 3-4 with a double and her first home run.

► Completing the OKC sweep, OU scored all of its runs within the first three innings in a 5-2 win over UAB Saturday. **Sydney Romero** was 3-3 with two runs scored and a homer.

► Aided by a nine-run second inning, U wrapped up the weekend Sunday with a 15-0, five-inning win over UAB. **Kelsey Arnold** and Romero each went 2-3 with two RBI. Arnold also tied a career high with three runs scored and hit her first home run since freshman year.

LOPEZ FIRES FIRST CAREER NO-HITTER AT LBSU

► Freshman **Mariah Lopez** threw the first no-hitter of her career in OU's 14-0 win at Long Beach State on March 14.

► Lopez came one batter away from a perfect game as the lone baserunner she allowed was a two-out walk in the sixth after retiring the first 17 batters. She struck out one while getting nine flyouts and 11 groundouts. She did it all on just 78 pitches to record the 48th no-hitter in program history.

SOONERS GO 4-3 DURING WEEK IN CALIFORNIA

► Oklahoma spent Spring Break in California, March 13-18, posting a 4-3 record in Long Beach and Los Angeles.

► The lead changed hands three times over the final three innings, but the Sooners saw their season-best 11-game winning streak come to an end in a 4-3 loss to No. 5/4 Arizona. OU led 3-2 in bottom of seven before the Wildcats rallied.

► OU bounced back to beat Long Beach State, 14-0, behind **Mariah Lopez's** first no-hitter. OU's offense backed her with 14 runs on 14 hits. OU's 2-6 hitters combined to go 12-23 (.522) with 12 RBI and 10 runs scored. **Nicole Mendes** and **Falepolima Aviu** each went 3-5, while Mendes and **Nicole Pendley** both drove in three and scored three times.

► Shifting to Los Angeles and the LMU Tournament, Oklahoma took advantage of four errors by UC Santa Barbara to post an 8-1 win. **Sydney Romero** was 3-4 with two runs scored and two runs driven in to lead OU's offense.

► Batting leadoff for the first time in her career, Mendes reached in all five plate appearances, scored three runs, drove in a run and stole a base in a 6-4 win at Loyola Marymount. She was 4-4 with a walk, a single, two doubles and a triple and was a home run shy of becoming the first player in OU history to hit for the cycle.

► OU was unable to crack Cal Poly ace Sierra Hyland as the Sooners dropped back-to-back 3-1 games to the Mustangs.

► Oklahoma wrapped up the trip with a 6-0 win over DePaul as Paige Lowary threw her first shutout in an OU uniform. She allowed just two hits with no walks and struck out two. Lowary retired 16 straight batters at one point between the first and sixth innings, and a runner never got past second base over the entire game.

SOONERS WRAP UP HOMESTAND WITH 10-0 RECORD

► Oklahoma swept two games each from Omaha and Illinois-Chicago at the OU Tournament to wrap up a 10-game homestand (the longest for OU since 1998) with a 10-0 record.

► Oklahoma scored all of its runs in the final two innings to kick off the OU Tournament with a 9-1, five-inning win over Omaha. **Paige Parker** struck out six and walked none while giving up just one run on two hits.

► The Sooners used a six-run third to post a second straight run-rule over Omaha, this time 8-0 in five innings. Eight Sooners had a hit with **Caleigh Clifton** and **Shay Knighten** leading the way with two hits each, while **Nicole Pendley** had three RBI, including a homer. **Mariah Lopez** struck out seven and gave up just one hit with no walks or runs.

► The Sooners scored four runs in the first, two in the second, three in the third and seven more in the fourth in a 16-1, five-inning win over UIC. Ten different OU batters had a hit, while **Falepolima Aviu** and **Sydney Romero** each had three RBI.

► Oklahoma closed out the weekend with an 8-0, six-inning win over UIC. **Nicole Mendes** was 3-4, while **Falepolima Aviu** added a three-run home run.

PARKER THROWS 10-INNING SHUTOUT VS. TULSA

► **Paige Parker** threw a two-hit, 10-inning shutout and sparked the game-winning rally at the plate as Oklahoma topped Tulsa in 10 innings, 1-0, on March 8.

► Parker's 10 innings were a career high and her 141 pitches were one off her career best. She struck out seven for her sixth straight start and walked just one.

► In the bottom of the 10th, Parker ignited the game-winning rally with a leadoff double down the right field line. **Hannah Sparks** entered for Parker as a pinch runner, and **Raegan Rogers** followed with a single to center field. A groundout moved both runners into scoring position, and two batters later, **Caleigh Clifton** blooped a single to left field to drive home Sparks with the only run of the game.

► The win marked just the third time in program history that the Sooners posted a shutout in a game lasting 10 innings or longer. The last instance occurred in 1979 when OU beat Kansas State, 1-0, in 10 innings, while the other took place in 1979 in a 1-0, 13-inning victory over Oklahoma State.

WIN STREAK VS. WICHITA STATE REACHES 34

► **Paige Parker** struck out 11 as Oklahoma came back for a 7-3 win at Wichita State on March 1. The win was the 34th in a row for the Sooners over the Shockers, the team's longest active winning streak against another program. OU head coach **Patty Gasso** is a perfect 34-0 against WSU, her most wins against another team without a loss.

► Parker, who had a perfect game through 3.1 IP, struck out at least one batter in every inning, including three in the seventh.

► **Caleigh Clifton** had three hits, while **Sydney Romero** drove in a career-high 4 runs and **Nicole Pendley** homered.

OKLAHOMA LEAVES MARY NUTTER WITH 3-2 MARK

► With all five matchups featuring opponents ranked or receiving votes, Oklahoma came away from the prestigious Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic (Feb. 23-25) with a 3-2 record.

► The weekend started with a 2-1 win over NR/RV Louisville. **Paige Lowary** gave up just one run on four hits with seven strikeouts and two walks. She held the Cardinals' 4-9 hitters to an 0-15 day with all seven strikeouts. **Sydney Romero** was 2-3 at the plate, while **Caleigh Clifton** scored both runs.

► OU put the tying run on third and winning run on second with two outs in the seventh, but its five-game winning ended with a 2-1 loss to No. 15/13 Tennessee. **Paige Parker** struck out eight and gave up two runs on two walks and five hits.

► Aided by some new faces and other familiar faces in new places, Oklahoma beat North Carolina State, 7-5. **Mariah Lopez** got the win in the circle, while **Alissa Dalton** had three hits in her first career start at shortstop. **Kylie Lundberg** and **Raegan Rogers** made their first career starts at first base and left field, respectively, and each drove in a run.

► Oklahoma's bats came alive in a 10-1, five-inning win over No. 6/4 UCLA. It was the Sooners' first run-rule over a top-25 team since an 11-3, 5-inning win vs. Baylor on April 18, 2015. Clifton had a career high in hits by going 4-4 with a double, three RBI, a stolen base and a run scored. Parker struck out seven and gave up just one run on three hits.

► In a game that featured five lead changes and two ties, Oklahoma lost to RV/RV Notre Dame, 5-4. Oklahoma led 1-0 after one, but Notre Dame moved ahead 2-1 in the top of the second. OU regained the lead, 3-2, in the bottom of the inning, only to see the Fighting Irish tie the game 3-3 after three. The Sooners pulled ahead 4-3 in the fifth, but Notre Dame hit solo homers in the sixth and seventh to tie the game and pull ahead. The Sooners loaded the bases with two out in the seventh, but a groundout ended the contest.

OU GOES UNDEFEATED AT HOUSTON CLASSIC

► Oklahoma went a perfect 4-0 at the Houston Classic (Feb. 17-18), defeating Incarnate Word and Ole Miss before sweeping a doubleheader against the host-Cougars.

► An 11-run first inning helped OU to a 14-0, five-inning win over Incarnate Word. Oklahoma sent 14 to the plate and had eight hits in the first, the highest scoring inning for OU since an 11-run fifth at Texas Tech on March 29, 2015. The Sooners finished with 14 hits, including three each for **Nicole Pendley**, **Sydney Romero** and **Kylie Lundberg**. Pendley also matched a career high with 5 RBI, including a grand slam.

► In a rematch from the 2016 NCAA Regional, Oklahoma jumped out to a 6-0 lead after the top of the second inning and outlasted Ole Miss, 11-8. OU's 1-5 hitters combined to 14-21 against Ole Miss and scored all 11 runs. **Shay Knighten** had a career high in hits, going 4-4 with a double, four runs batted in and two runs scored to lead the offense.

► Oklahoma rallied from an early deficit to force extras and prevail in eight innings, 7-5, over Houston. The Sooners fell behind 3-0 after two innings but scored three runs between the fifth and sixth innings to force extras. OU then outscored the Cougars, 4-2, in the eighth. **Paige Parker** struck out 10 in 8.0 innings.

► After battling to extra innings in the first game of a doubleheader, Oklahoma and Houston did it again in the second half of the twinbill as OU won 2-1 in eight in game two. The Sooners played in a second straight extra-inning game for the first time since April, 20-21 of 2012 against Missouri and won consecutive games that went to extra innings for the first time since March 12, 2004 against New Mexico.

► OU opened the 2017 season by playing outside the U.S. for the first time in program history, going 2-2 at the Puerto Vallarta College Challenge in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico.

► In the season opener, Oklahoma's rally fell just short in a 3-2 loss to No. 2 Auburn. The game was the first ever season opener between two teams that played for the national title the year prior. **Vanessa Taukeiaho** hit a two-run single in the bottom of the seventh to trim Auburn's lead to one, but OU would get no closer. In her OU debut, **Paige Lowary** struck out a career-high 11 batters but walked five in taking the loss.

► A five-run third inning was the catalyst for Oklahoma in its 7-1 victory over BYU. **Nicole Pendley** and **Fale Aviu** each drove in a pair of runs for OU, while **Caleigh Clifton** reached base in all four trips to the plate. **Paige Parker** gave up just one run on six hits while striking out eight and walking none.

► A five-run second inning aided a group effort as three different OU pitchers combined on a 6-0 shutout of Nebraska. **Mariah Lopez** debuted with 3.0 scoreless innings before Lowary came on to earn the win with 2.1 innings in relief. Parker closed out the game with 1.2 hitless frames. **Shay Knighten** and **Sydney Romero** each had two RBI in the win.

► Oklahoma was then shut out for the first time since the opening game of the 2016 season in a 1-0 loss to No. 13/13 Washington. **Macey Hatfield** had two of OU's five hits.

NOTES ON 2016

► OU joined UCLA and Arizona as the only teams in NCAA DI history to win at least three national championships.

► The Sooners reached the Women's College World Series for the 10th time in history and fifth time in the last six years.

► Oklahoma made it to the Super Regionals for the seventh straight season and 10th time overall.

► OU has reached the postseason in each of the last 23 seasons, including all 22 under head coach **Patty Gasso**.

► OU had the longest winning streak in program history (31 games from April 2 to June 7); it tied for the 17th longest in NCAA history.

► Oklahoma's 631 hits were 16th most in NCAA history.

► OU broke a school and Big 12 record with a fielding percentage of .983 and committed the fewest errors ever at OU (28); the fielding percentage was sixth best in NCAA history.

► A program-record nine Sooners were named to the Academic All-Big 12 team. The Sooners set another school record by placing seven student-athletes on the first team.

► For the fourth time in the last five seasons Oklahoma had at least three All-Americans in first-teamer **Paige Parker** and second-teamers **Erin Miller** and **Shay Knighten**.

► OU tied a school record with eight All-Region honorees for the third straight season.

Oklahoma is one of just three programs in NCAA history to win three national titles, doing so in 2000, 2013 and most recently in 2016. She's reached the Women's College World Series 10 times during her tenure, and in the process, advanced to the postseason in each one of her 23 seasons.

With 26 seasons as a head coach to her name, Gasso has a career collegiate coaching record of 1300-381-3 (.773) and holds an overall record of 1139-322-2 (.779) at the University of Oklahoma. Needing only 1,300 games to get there, Gasso became the second fastest to reach 1,000 wins in NCAA Division I history during the 2015 season. She has won more Big 12 games (307-85) than any coach in the league's history and has twice as many wins as any other coach in OU history. Gasso's Sooner teams have finished second or higher 18 different times since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996. They have won over 78 percent of their Big 12 contests, and OU has claimed 10 Big 12 regular season and five championship titles under her direction.

Numerous Sooner players have prospered under Gasso's tutelage and garnered national, regional and conference recognition. Keilani Ricketts was the two-time USA Softball National Player of the Year in 2012 and 2013, becoming just the third player in history to win more than once. Gasso has also directed 53 All-Americans, 125 All-Region honorees and 152 all-conference selections. In the Big 12 era, 10 Sooners have been named Big 12 Player of the Year a total of 12 times, six have been selected as Big 12 Freshman of the Year, four as Big 12 Pitcher of the Year four times and one as Big 12 Newcomer. In 2010, Amber Flores became the first player in league history to earn Player of the Year honors twice, while Shelby Pendley joined her in winning the award twice in 2013 and 2015.

The OU softball success under Gasso has also spilled over into the classroom where the Sooners have been honored with 121 academic all-conference honors, including a program-record nine in 2016. Nine of those 121 honorees have gone on to become Academic All-Americans, including Lana Moran, the 2000 Academic All-American of the Year.

Gasso and her staff have consistently been recognized for their efforts on and off the field. The staff was awarded three consecutive Speedline/NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year awards from 1999-2001 and received the national honor in 2000 and 2013. Gasso and staff have claimed the regional honor nine times total, with the most recent award coming in 2015. In addition, Gasso has been named the Big 12 Coach of the Year a record nine times: 1996, 1999, 2000, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017.

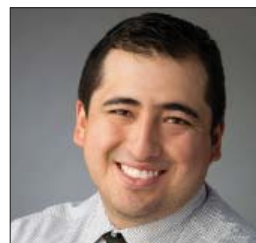

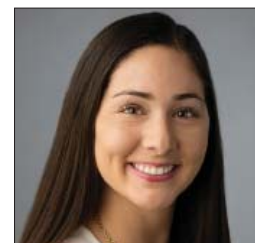

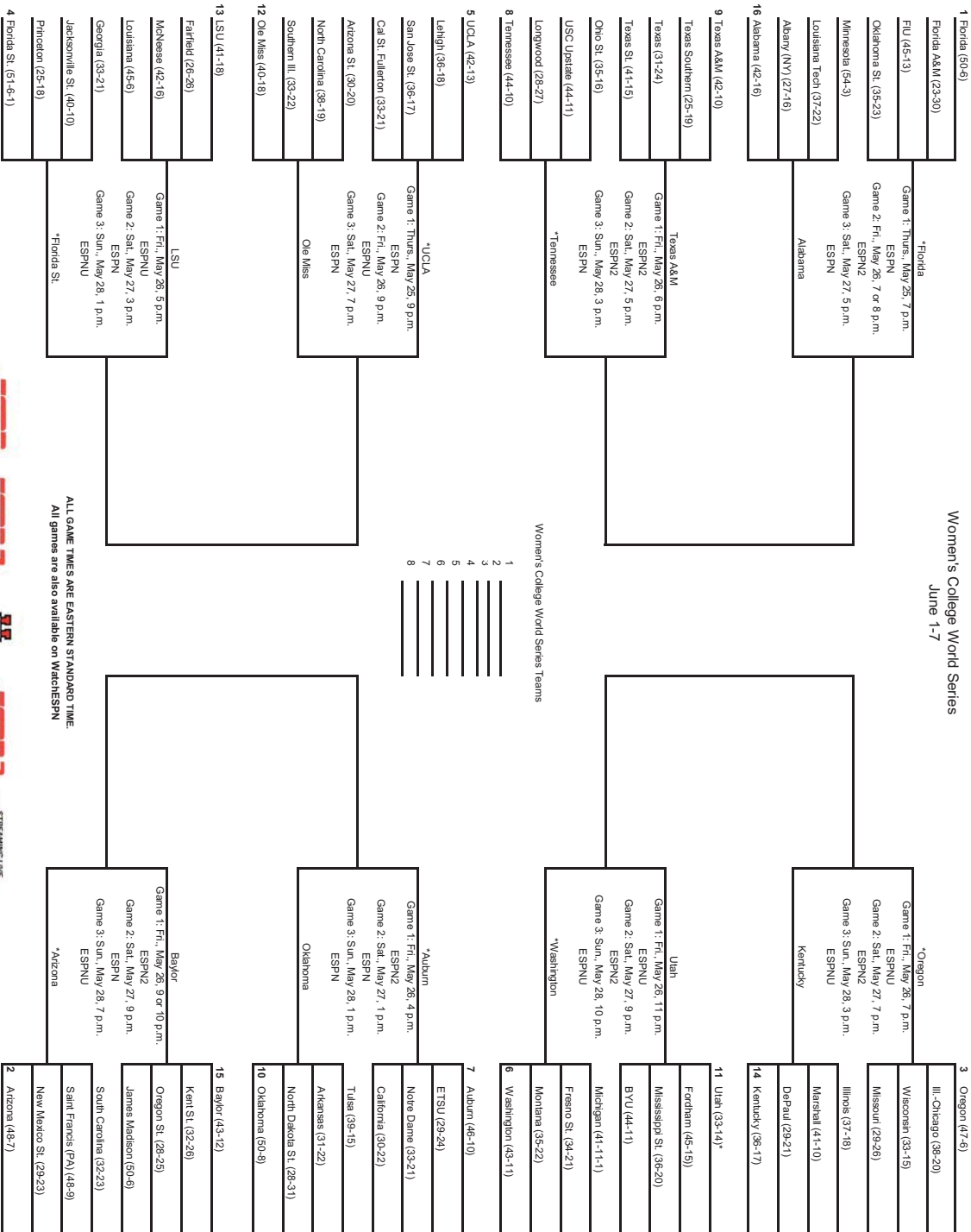
