Leading Off

- OU is in its second season under the direction of head coach Skip Johnson. Johnson lead the Sooners to a 38-25 record and an NCAA postseason appearance in his first year leading the program.
- Since 1962. Oklahoma is 38-19 on opening day and 25-3. when playing the first game of the season at home.
- Oklahoma returned 15 players from the 2018 squad, but must replace lost starters at second base and all three outfield positions. The Sooners welcomed 19 newcomers for the 2019 season, including nine transfers and 10 freshmen.
- The Sooners will replace 60 percent of its innings pitched and 56 percent of its run production from 2018.
- Sophomore right-hander Cade Cavalli will toe the rubber for the Sooners on opening day. He will be making his third career start. As a freshman in 2018, he went 3-2 with a 6.75 ERA in 11 appearances, and struck out 18 batters in 17.1 innings.
- Junior right-hander Nathan Wiles will get the ball on Saturday, making his 23rd career start. Last season, he went 7-3 with a 3.54 ERA in 86.1 innings across 16 appearances.
- Sophomore left-hander Levi Prater will make his fifth start on Sunday. In 2018 he set a school freshman record with 33 appearances on the mound. He went 3-4 with a 4.09 ERA and struck out 64 batters in 50.2 innings.
- Senior **Brylie Ware** is Oklahoma's leading returning hitter. In

HEAD COACH SKIP JOHNSON

In his two seasons in Norman, Skip Johnson has made an immediate impact on the Oklahoma baseball program. He was named the 10th head coach in program history in June 2017 after serving one year as the Sooners' pitching coach.

The OU pitching staffs in Johnson's two seasons have posted two of the top five strikeout totals in program history and lowered the team ERA each season.

In 2018, Johnson coached OU to the program's 38th NCAA Regional appearance and posted the program's highest win total (38) since 2013. The Sooners reached the finals of the Tallahassee Regional, and set a school record with 608 strikeouts. Nine players were drafted, including five in the first 10 rounds.

In 2017, Oklahoma pitchers surrendered the fewest home runs in the Big 12 Conference in 2017 and combined for 531 strikeouts to rank fourth in the league and fourth in OU single-season history. The Sooners' 9.26 strikeouts per nine innings ranked second in the conference. As a team, OU pitchers struck out 10 or more batters on 24 occasions.

Prior to coming to Oklahoma, Johnson spent a 25-year coaching career in the state of Texas, including the most recent 10 years as an assistant and associate head coach at the University of Texas.

Prior to his time in Austin, Johnson was the head coach for 13 years at Navarro College of the NJCAA's Texas Eastern Athletic Conference. From 1994-2006, he guided the Bulldogs to 13 NJCAA Regionals, nine TEAC championships and four regional titles while compiling 450 wins.

Johnson has also mentored a number of players outside of those he coached at Navarro and UT. Johnson regularly works with three-time Cy Young Award winner Clayton Kershaw of the Los Angeles Dodgers and Homer Bailey of the Kansas City Royals. He's also worked with Chris Davis of the Baltimore Orioles, among others.

A standout baseball player at Denton High School, Johnson began his collegiate playing career at Ranger (Texas) College. After a two-year career there, Johnson moved on to play baseball at the University of North Texas in 1988 before the school dropped its baseball program. He completed his collegiate playing career at UT-Pan American, lettering for the Broncs in 1989 and receiving his bachelor's degree in 1990. Johnson earned a master's degree in education from UT-Tyler in 1993.

A native of Denton, Texas, Johnson and his wife, Cathy, have two sons, Tyler and Garrett.

Replacing Production...

- Oklahoma must replace significant production both offensively and on the mound from last year as it enters the 2019 season.
- Included are all three outfield positions held by juniors drafted in 2018, a four-year senior at second base and a total of eight pitchers.
- Oklahoma will replace 60 percent of its innings pitched (339 of 570 innings), 67 percent of its starts (42 of 63 starts), 61 percent of its strikeouts (370 of 608) and 63 percent of wins on the mound (24 of 38).
- Offensively, the Sooners will replace 56 percent of RBI (197 of 354) and runs scored (215 of 386), 34 of its 47 home runs and 51 percent of hits (300 of 593).

About the Sooners...

- Oklahoma is seeking its third straight NCAA postseason appearance in 2019. The Sooners reached the finals of the Tallahassee Regional last season before falling to eventual College World Series participant Mississippi State.
- Oklahoma returns full-time starters at third base (**Brylie Ware**) and shortstop (**Brandon Zaragoza**), as well as both catchers (**Brady Lindsly** and **Justin Mitchell**) for the 2019 season. In addition, **Tyler Hardman** made 16 of his 37 starts at first base and **Blake Brewster** started 10 games in the outfield.
- On the mound, senior **Ryan Madden** and junior **Nathan Wiles** brings experience to the pitching staff, which features six returning sophomores and seven newcomers. Junior **Braidyn Fink** will miss the 2019 season with an arm injury, head coach **Skip Johnson** announced this week.
- Ware carries a seven-game hitting streak into the 2019 season. In the final seven contests of 2018, he went 10-for-27 (.370) with four walks three hit by pitches and seven runs scored.
- Zaragoza carries a five-game hitting streak into 2019. He was 8 for his last 24 to end 2018 (.333) with four RBI and three runs scored.

About the Mustangs...

- Cal Poly is based in San Luis Obispo, Calif., and a member of the Big West Conference.
- The Mustangs are coached by Larry Lee, who is entering his 17th season at the school. He has posted a 513-391-2 record in 16 years at Cal Poly, and has an overall career record of 973-636-5 in 32 seasons as a head coach.
- Cal Poly posted a 30-27 overall record and a 15-9 mark in the Big West last season. The Mustangs return 18 letterwinners, including five position starters and eight pitchers, and feature 11 newcomers to the roster for 2019.
- Sunday starter Darren Nelson is the most experienced in the rotation. Last year he started 16 games, going 5-4 with a 4.79 ERA and 50 strikeouts in 77.0 innings. Friday starter Jared Zill went 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA in five appearances (all starts). Saturday starter Bobby Ay was 0-1 with a 13.50 ERA in limited action (one appearance, one start, 2.2 innings) in 2018.

Last Time They Met...

- Oklahoma and Cal Poly have played twice in their history, both in the 1986 season in Norman. The series is tied, 1-1
- The Mustangs won the first meeting 12-10 on March 22. The Sooners rebounded two days later with a 19-4 victory.

The Newcomers...

- Oklahoma has 19 newcomers to its roster in 2019. Nine of those players are four-year or junior college transfers, and 10 are freshmen
- The new class is versatile and athletic, and several players have the ability to play multiple positions on the field. The group is comprised of eight pitchers, seven players who can play infield, six who can play outfield and one who can catch.
- Two newcomers call Oklahoma home, eight come from Texas, two from California, and one each from Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Minnesota, Nevada and Ontario.
- Of the transfers, three began their careers at four-year schools: **Brady Harlan** (Texas), **Jason Ruffcorn** (Texas A&M) and **Jordan Vujovich** (Oregon). Harlan and Ruffcorn transferred directly to OU, while Vujovich came via Delta College in California. Six others came to OU from junior colleges.

Big 12 Preseason Honors...

- Senior Brylie Ware and sophomore Levi Prater were named to the All-big 12 Preseason Team in a vote by the league's head coaches.
- With two preseason selections, Oklahoma tied for the thirdmost preseason all-conference honorees. Texas Tech had five selections, Baylor had four and Texas also had two, while Oklahoma State, Kansas, Kansas State, TCU and West Virginia each had one player on the preseason Big 12 team.
- The Sooners were picked to finish seventh in the preseason coaches poll.

Opening Day Starters...

Right-hander **Cade Cavalli** is slated to start on the mound for the Sooners on opening day. He will become the fifth sophomore to get the ball in game one in the last eight seasons. He will also become the fifth consecutive righty to start on opening day following three years in a row of lefties getting the nod.

Season Openers...

Since 1962, Oklahoma is 38-19 on opening day and 25-3 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 24-2 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 50-6 going back to 1962, including 34-2 at L. Dale Mitchell.

Oklahoma is Home...

The OU roster features 11 players from within the state's borders and nine from Texas. This is the third straight year the Sooners have featured more homegrown players on the roster than from Texas. Prior to the 2017 season, 2006 was the last year OU had more homegrown talent than Texas born players with 13 Sooners claiming Oklahoma as home.

2018 MLB Draft...

- Oklahoma had nine players selected in the 2018 Major League Basebal First-Year Player Draft.
- Five players were selected in the first 10 rounds, including three top-five round draft picks.
- Outfielder Kyler Murray was selected ninth overall by the Oakland Athletics, outfielder Steele Walker was drafted int he seoond round (46th overall) by the Chicago White Sox and pitcher

Jake Irvin was taken in the fourth round (131st overall) by the Washington Nationals.

• Pitcher Austin Hansen was selected in the eighth round by the Houston Astros and outfielder Cade Harris was taken in the 10th round by the Colorado Rockies. Additionally, pitchers Kyle Tyler (20th round, Los Angeles Angels), Lane Ramsey (23rd round, White Sox), Devon Perez (26th round, White Sox) and Connor Berry (31st round, Boston Red Sox) were selected in the draft.

The University of Oklahoma was the first college to have three alumni start at pitcher on MLB's opening day in recorded history. OU pitchers have combined for five opening day starts in the last three years, the longest in that period and tied for the most with Vanderbilt (David Price-3, Sonny Gray-2) since 2014.
